
Messiah's Mission Prayer

In the August edition of the Grace Note, I began a series offering a few reflections on our Mission Prayer that is a weekly part of our

worship together. This month we continue that theme with the second portion of the prayer:

Gracious God, through belief in Christ and through the presence of the Holy Spirit within us, empower us to... care and support each other and God's community.

Asking God to empower us to care and support others is no small request. It reminds me of



Philippians chapter 2, where the Apostle Paul introduces his readers to one of the earliest Christian hymns, saying, "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same



mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus." Easier said than done! But we don't do it alone. We trust that the Holy Spirit has indeed been stirred up in us, and that

God guides us in the way of care and support that changes lives for the better. This is part of God's work of liberation from sin, death, and all that oppresses humanity! And it is not for just one group, just one congregation, just one tradition of faith. It is for the whole world.

The Council met virtually Tuesday August 17. The Property Committee will get estimates to repair the catch basin in the parking lot at the base of the

northeast overhead light. The Home Days parade will be on Sunday September 12. Everyone is invited to participate by either walking in the parade or sitting in front of the church as a spectator. Kristy Bohinc reported that the streaming transmission from the church for the Sunday service is sometimes weak and does not

always maintain a signal. Therefore, two more mesh network units will be ordered to carry the WIFI signal from the front office into the narthex and sanctuary. We are proceeding with changing the copier machine contract from DSI to ComDoc with the addition of color printing capabilities. Investigation has also begun to look at the feasibility of changing the front sign to an LED sign. I

hope that everyone is remaining safe and healthy

and that we will be able to continue expanding the church functions even with the presence of the Delta variant. May God's blessing be with all of us.


What's Happening


