# Questions About Who Are the 144,000?

Who are the 144,000 mentioned in Revelation?

#### Answer:

Great question. The identity of the **144,000** in the book of Revelation has been the subject of much study, especially in historicist interpretations like those often held by Seventh-day Adventists and other prophetic students. Let's walk through a clear, Bible-based explanation.

### Where are the 144,000 Mentioned?

The **144,000** are mentioned in **two key chapters**:

- Revelation 7:1–8 They are "sealed" before the winds of destruction are released.
- Revelation 14:1–5 They stand with the Lamb on Mount Zion, having His name and His Father's name written on their foreheads.

### Literal or Symbolic Number?

Many scholars and Christians, especially historicists, see the 144,000 as **symbolic**, not literal. Here's why:

- The number is **12,000 from each of the 12 tribes of Israel**, but the list in Revelation 7 doesn't match any literal Old Testament listing of the 12 tribes.
- The tribe of **Dan is missing**, and **Ephraim is omitted**, while **Joseph** is included.
- This suggests that the list is **spiritual**, pointing to a symbolic "Israel of God" (Galatians 6:16), not a genetic one.

### Who Are the 144,000 According to the Historicist View?

## 1. A Special Group at the End of Time

- The 144,000 are **God's last-day faithful people**, who are **sealed** before the plagues of Revelation 16 are poured out (see Revelation 7).
- They go through the **final crisis** without falling away. They are described in Revelation 14 as **pure**, **obedient**, **loyal**, and spiritually mature.

### 2. Spiritual Israel

- They represent the **spiritual tribes** of Israel—symbolizing all of God's faithful from every nation who have been spiritually "grafted in" (Romans 11:17–24).
- They are "redeemed from the earth" (Rev. 14:3) and follow the Lamb "wherever He goes."

#### 3. Sealed Before the Close of Probation

- The 144,000 receive the **seal of the living God** (Rev. 7:2), which marks them as safe to stand during the **time of trouble** (Daniel 12:1; Revelation 15:8).
- The seal is not a visible mark but a spiritual sign of **character loyalty**—often connected with obedience (especially to God's law, including the Sabbath see Ezekiel 20:12, 20).

### Are the 144,000 Different from the "Great Multitude"?

Yes. Revelation 7 describes two groups:

- 1. **144,000** sealed, specific number, described first (Rev. 7:1–8)
- 2. **Great Multitude** too many to count, from every nation, comes out of "great tribulation" (Rev. 7:9–17)

#### Historicist View:

- The 144,000 represent **God's faithful remnant at the very end of time**, especially those alive when Jesus returns.
- The **Great Multitude** includes the saved of **all ages**, from all over the world.
