The **breastplate of judgment**, described in **Exodus 28:15-21**, is one of the most fascinating and significant artifacts of the Old Testament priesthood. Ligure (Jacinth or Amber)	Amber or Jacinth	Glory, wisdom, divine presence	Dan ("He judges")
Agate	Banded Agate	Stability, protection, connection to earth	Naphtali ("Wrestling")
Amethyst	Purple Amethyst	Royalty, spiritual insight, self- control	Gad ("Troop")

Fourth Row

Stone (Traditional Name)	Modern Identification	Symbolism	Tribe
Beryl	Aquamarine or Green Beryl	Clarity, divine favor, purity	Asher ("Happy")
Onyx	Black Onyx or Sardonyx	Strength, endurance, overcoming trials	Joseph ("He adds")
Jasper	Multi-colored Jasper	Diversity, endurance, unity	Benjamin ("Son of the right hand")

These stones remind us that **God sees each of His people individually**, but He unites them **as one body**, just as the **Church is united in Christ**.

3. The Urim and Thummim: God's Divine Guidance

Within the breastplate was placed the **Urim and Thummim**, mysterious objects used by the high priest to **determine God's will**.

Exodus 28:30 (KJV)

"And thou shalt put in the breastplate of judgment the Urim and the Thummim; and they shall be upon Aaron's heart, when he goeth in before the Lord: and Aaron shall bear the judgment of the children of Israel upon his heart before the Lord continually."

These items were used for **divine guidance**, often answering "yes" or "no" questions about Israel's future (**Numbers 27:21**).

Connection to Jesus and the Holy Spirit

- Jesus is the ultimate revelation of God's will (Hebrews 1:1-2).
