Is the Lord Jesus Christ the Law? Likewise, is Grace the Lord Jesus Christ?

Answer:

Yes — both **Law** and **Grace** are ultimately embodied in the **Person of the Lord Jesus Christ**. Let's break this down biblically:

JESUS IS THE LAW — FULFILLED, EMBODIED, AND MAGNIFIED

1. The Law Originated from God

The law was not Moses' idea. It was God's will, character, and standard revealed:

"For the LORD is our judge, the LORD is our lawgiver, the LORD is our king; He will save us."— *Isaiah 33:22*

This means **God Himself is the Lawgiver** — and when Christ came, He came as God in the flesh.

"For Christ is the end [Greek: *telos*, purpose/goal] of the law for righteousness to everyone that believeth."— *Romans 10:4*

Jesus **embodies the goal of the law** — to bring people into righteousness and relationship with God.

JESUS IS GRACE — REVEALED, POURED OUT, AND POWERFUL

1. Grace and Truth Came Through Jesus

"For the law was given by Moses, but **grace and truth came by Jesus Christ**."— *John* 1:17

Jesus is not just the *bringer* of grace. He **is** Grace. Grace is not a thing — **it's a Person**.

2. Grace Is the Power of Christ

"My grace is sufficient for thee: for **my strength** is made perfect in weakness."— *2 Corinthians 12:9*

Grace is the **power of Christ** working **within you** — not just forgiveness, but **divine power to overcome sin**.

3. Grace Brings Salvation & Transformation

"For the **grace of God that bringeth salvation** hath appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly..."— *Titus 2:11–12*

Jesus doesn't just forgive — He **teaches**, **empowers**, and **transforms**.

SO — IS JESUS BOTH LAW AND GRACE?
