# Questions About the Shaking, "Probation" and the "Close of Probation"

In this lesson, the pastor said...."before probation closes"...what is "probation"? Earlier, in this seminar, pastor Ed Anderson mentioned "shaking"...what does "shaking" mean?

#### Answer:

Great questions! Let's explore both terms—"probation" and "shaking"—as they are used in the context of Bible prophecy and Seventh-day Adventist teaching, especially as shared in Pastor Ed Anderson's Revelation Seminar.

#### What Is "Probation" in Bible Prophecy?

**Probation** refers to a *limited period of grace* in which individuals have the opportunity to choose Jesus, repent, and be sealed for salvation before final judgment is executed.

## **Biblical Support:**

- **Genesis 6:3** "My Spirit shall not strive with man forever..." shows a time limit on God's striving with humanity.
- Revelation 22:11 "He that is unjust, let him be unjust still... he that is holy, let him be holy still." This verse describes the moment when human decisions are fixed; probation closes.
- **Daniel 12:1** "At that time shall Michael stand up..." This signals the end of intercession by Christ as High Priest in the heavenly sanctuary. Probation has closed and judgment follows.

#### **Key Concept:**

Probation is **not** about "earning" salvation, but about having time to *accept or reject God's grace*. Once probation closes:

- No further decisions for or against Christ will be made.
- The seven last plagues fall (Revelation 16).
- Jesus soon returns in glory.

This is a solemn, urgent call to surrender now while the door of mercy is still open.

## What Is the "Shaking"?

The **shaking** is a powerful spiritual test and separation that occurs **within the church**, not the world. It reveals who is truly grounded in Christ and His Word—and who is not.

### **Biblical Support:**

- **Hebrews 12:26–27** "Yet once more I shake not only the earth, but also heaven... that the things which cannot be shaken may remain."
- Amos 9:9 "For lo, I will command, and I will sift the house of Israel among all nations..."
- Luke 22:31–32 Jesus tells Peter that Satan desired to "sift" him like wheat—a shaking of faith.

#### What Causes the Shaking?

- Rejection of truth (especially new light)
- Worldliness creeping into the church
- Persecution or pressure to compromise
- False teachings, spiritual laziness, or resistance to reform

## **Result of the Shaking:**

- Those truly anchored in Christ and His Word will **remain and shine** brighter.
- Those who are superficial, lukewarm, or unwilling to obey God fully may **leave the faith**, fall into deception, or oppose God's message.

**Ellen G. White** says the shaking is caused by the "straight testimony" (bold truth) going forth to the church (see *Early Writings*, p. 270–273).

#### **Final Thoughts**

These two concepts—probation and shaking—are God's way of both warning and preparing His people. He lovingly urges us:

- To surrender fully to Jesus now
- To study the Word deeply
- To stand firm in truth when the tests come

And remember, **the goal of both is redemption**, not fear. God wants you sealed, secure, and victorious in Christ.
