Questions About Greek Word Theotes in Colossians 2:9

In Colossians 2:9 there is a Greek word "Theotes"...it's only used here in the New Testament...I need help understanding this Word

Answer:

Colossians 2:9 contains a deeply rich and important theological term:

"For in Him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily." (Colossians 2:9, KJV)

At the heart of this verse is the rare Greek word:

θεότης (Theótēs)

Pronounced: *theh-AH-tays*

Meaning: Deity, Divine nature, or The state of being God

Let's break it down carefully.

1. What Does "Theotes" Mean?

θεότης comes from the root θεός (Theos) = God, but it doesn't just refer to a divine being — it refers to the essence or nature of God Himself.

- Theotes = the totality of who God is not just His attributes, but His essential being.
 - It's not saying Jesus *had divine traits* it's saying **He is fully God**.

Lexical Definition:

According to **Thayer's Greek Lexicon** and **BDAG**:

Theótēs: "Deity, the state of being God. The essential and personal Godhood."

It differs from θειότης (theiótēs) found in *Romans 1:20*, which means "divine nature" or "divine qualities." The word in Romans refers to **divine attributes**, but the word in Colossians 2:9 refers to **divine essence**.

2. Why Is It So Important?

Paul is responding to **early Gnostic teachings** in Colossae that claimed:

- Jesus was not fully God.
- God's fullness was distributed among various spirit beings or emanations (aeons).
 - The physical body was evil, so God could never dwell in human flesh.

Paul **confronts these errors directly** by saying:

"In Him [Christ] dwells all the fullness (πλήρωμα / plērōma) of the Godhead (θεότης / Theótēs) bodily."

He's saying:

- · Jesus didn't just reflect God He IS God.
- The **entire divine nature** Father, Son, and Spirit **resides bodily in** Christ.
- He affirms the **incarnation**: Jesus was **100% God** and **100% man** in one Person.

3. Biblical Support & Parallels

Here are other verses that align with **Theótēs** in Colossians 2:9:

4. Ellen White on Colossians 2:9

Summary
