

Questions About Knowing Whether We Love Truth to Salvation

How do we know that we have received the love of the truth that we might be saved?
Can we be deceived and think we have received the love of the truth and are saved only to find out later that we were in error?

For example:

21 Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.

22 Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name have cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?

23 And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you: depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

Matthew 7:21-23 KJV

Is doing the will of the Father the love of the truth?

Answer:

This is a deeply important question, one that every sincere believer must wrestle with at some point. It's not just about *doing* the right things — it's about the condition of the *heart* before God. Let's walk through your question with Scripture and clarity.

What Is “the Love of the Truth”?

Paul writes: “**They received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved.**” — 2 *Thessalonians 2:10*

This means more than simply knowing the truth intellectually — it's **loving it, embracing it, and submitting to it**, even when it costs us everything.

- The “truth” is not just doctrine — it is a **person**: “I am the way, the **truth**, and the life.” — *John 14:6*
- To **love the truth** means to **love Jesus** so much that:

- You hunger for His Word
- You obey His teachings
- You surrender when convicted
- You welcome correction
- You hate sin and love righteousness

Can We Think We're Saved... and Be Wrong?

Sadly, yes.

That's the point of **Matthew 7:21–23**. These people:

- Called Jesus "Lord"
- Preached in His name
- Cast out demons
- Did miracles

And yet... He says: **"I never knew you: depart from me, you who practice lawlessness."**

They were **religiously active**, but **spiritually disobedient**. They **knew His name**, but not His **heart**. They **used His power**, but **rejected His will**.

Is Doing the Will of the Father the Same as Loving the Truth?

Yes. Absolutely.

Jesus makes it clear in **John 7:17**: **"If anyone wills to do His will, he shall know concerning the doctrine..."**

Doing the Father's will flows from a heart that **loves the truth**. So what is His will?

- That we **believe in His Son** (John 6:40)
- That we **walk in obedience** (1 John 2:3–5)
- That we **love one another** (John 13:34–35)
- That we **bear fruit** of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22–23)
- That we are **transformed** into Christ's image (Romans 12:2)

So yes — doing the will of the Father *is* the outcome of **loving the truth**.

How Can I Know I've Received the Love of the Truth?

Here are **5 biblical indicators**:

1. **Hunger for God's Word**

"Man shall not live by bread alone..." – *Matthew 4:4*

You desire Scripture, not just sermons.

2. **Obedience from the heart**

"If you love Me, keep My commandments." – *John 14:15*

You obey not out of fear, but love.

3. **Conviction & Confession of Sin**

"If we confess our sins..." – *1 John 1:9* You're sensitive to sin, not excusing it.

4. **Love for Others**

"He who does not love does not know God..." – *1 John 4:8*

You love others with Christlike compassion.

5. **Spiritual Discernment**

"The Spirit of truth... will guide you into all truth." – *John 16:13*

You are not easily led by falsehoods.

Final Encouragement: Check Your Fruit, Not Just Your Feelings

Salvation is not proven by how many **ministries you serve**, how many **miracles you see**, or how many **verses you quote**.

It's shown by whether the **truth is changing you** from the inside out.

"Examine yourselves, whether you be in the faith..." – *2 Corinthians 13:5*

Don't be afraid to ask God to search your heart. His truth never condemns without inviting you to **deeper grace and greater freedom**.

"Lord Jesus, I don't want to just do good works in Your name. I want to know You — deeply, personally, truly. Help me to love Your truth. Convict me where I am blind. Lead me in the way everlasting. I want to do the Father's will because I love You. Amen."
