# Questions About Whether There Is A Second Chance to Repent at the Resurrection

For those that have already died during Jesus' return at the Second Coming Resurrection, is there a way for them to repent or is their fate sealed?

#### Answer:

This is a heartfelt and important question. Here's the clear and compassionate biblical answer:

### At Death, Our Destiny Is Sealed

The Bible consistently teaches that when a person dies, their opportunity to repent and choose Christ ends. Their character is fixed, and their case is closed. This is confirmed in multiple passages:

"It is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment." (Hebrews 9:27)

At death, a person's record is complete. There is **no second chance after death** — whether before or after the Second Coming.

The First Resurrection: Only for the Saved

The **first resurrection** (at the Second Coming of Jesus) is **only for those who died in Christ**:

"The dead in Christ shall rise first."

(1 Thessalonians 4:16)

# No Repentance After the Resurrection of the Lost

After the 1,000 years, the wicked are resurrected for judgment (Revelation 20:11–15). Sadly, this is not an opportunity to repent but to face the consequences of their choices.

Even in this final moment, Revelation shows that the lost do not truly repent:

"They went up on the breadth of the earth and surrounded the camp of the saints..." (Revelation 20:9)

This shows that their hearts are unchanged. Even after seeing the New Jerusalem and the glory of Christ, they still resist God.

## Why This Matters Now

Jesus' urgent call is to **choose today**:

"Now is the day of salvation." (2 Corinthians 6:2)

"Today, if you will hear His voice, harden not your heart." (Hebrews 3:15)

Because once a person dies, **their opportunity to accept Christ is gone**. That's why the Holy Spirit pleads with us now — not to delay.

#### Final Word: God Is Just and Merciful

Even though this may sound hard, God has given every person a chance in their lifetime — through creation, conscience, Scripture, and the work of the Holy Spirit. He is:

"Not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance." (2 Peter 3:9)

No one will be lost because they didn't have a chance. They will be lost because, sadly, they **rejected** the chances they were lovingly given.
