Why are the trumpets connected to the three woes? Is it because of the impact on Satan or the impact on God's people?

#### THE SEVEN TRUMPETS & THE THREE WOES

Revelation 8–11 introduces seven trumpets, which are symbolic blasts announcing divine interventions in history, especially in judgment. Within these seven trumpets, three are labeled as "woes" due to their extraordinary severity and spiritual consequences.

"And I looked, and I heard an angel flying through the midst of heaven, saying with a loud voice, 'Woe, woe, woe to the inhabitants of the earth, because of the remaining blasts of the trumpet of the three angels who are about to sound!"

— Revelation 8:13

These three "woes" are the 5th, 6th, and 7th trumpets.

#### WHY ARE THESE THREE TRUMPETS CALLED WOES?

## 1. The "Woe" Designation Points to Spiritual Impact

While all trumpets bring judgment, the last three are called "woes" because:

- They affect **human hearts and salvation**, not just physical kingdoms.
- They involve demonic deception, spiritual darkness, and eternal consequences.

They are **direct assaults on the truth of God** and **His people**.

### WHY IS THIS A WOE TO SATAN?

- Each woe unravels Satan's strongholds.
- 1st Woe: Exposes and judges **spiritual darkness** (Islamic conquest in historicist view).
- 2nd Woe: Unleashes conflict that **destabilizes false religious systems** (fall of Ottoman Empire).
- 3rd Woe: Begins **heavenly judgment** and ends in **Satan's final destruction**.

So yes — the woes are woes to Satan because they weaken his influence, expose his lies, and ultimately lead to his downfall. They are also woes to those who refuse to repent, clinging to his deceptions.

## Why Are These Also Woes to the Inhabitants of Earth?

Because these judgments:

- Shake human systems we trust in.
- Strip away false security.
- Force us to choose allegiance: **God or the beast**.

But they are also **calls to mercy** — God allows these to awaken hearts before it's too late.

## Good News for God's People:

While the Trumpets sound judgments, **God's sealed people are protected** \$(see Revelation 9:4; 7:1–3). The woes are not to terrify the faithful but to:

- Reveal God's justice.
- Show His protection.
- Announce that **the kingdom of Christ is near** (Revelation 11:15).

## Summary: Why the Trumpets Are Connected to the Woes

- Because of their intensity they mark a deepening of judgment and a final showdown between good and evil.
- Because of their spiritual consequences they strike at Satan's systems, not just human empires.
  - Because of their eternal weight they push each soul to make a final decision: Truth or deception, Jesus or the beast.
