Questions About How to Break Cycles of Karma and Reincarnation and How to Have Moksha from Samsara By Pastor Ed Anderson

How do I break the endless cycle of karma and reincarnation for good? We Hindus believe in samsara—the cycle of birth, death, and rebirth driven by karma (actions). How many lives must I live before I am free?" Can I ever be sure I'm truly liberated (moksha), or will I be born again with new karma to pay?

Answer:

That is one of the most sincere and profound questions any human heart can ask — "When will I be free?"

The gospel of Jesus Christ answers this question with hope that is **final**, **personal**, **and filled** with love.

The Hindu Dilemma: Endless Effort, Uncertain Freedom

In Hindu teaching, **karma** is a law of cause and effect — everything you do, think, or say returns to you in some form, in this life or the next.

So to reach *moksha* (liberation from *samsara* — the endless cycle of birth, death, and rebirth), you must keep perfecting yourself through lifetimes of moral progress and spiritual discipline.

But the heart wrestles with this:

"How can I ever know when it's enough?"

"What if I fail again and must return?"

There's never complete peace — only striving.

The Gospel's Answer: Jesus Ended the Cycle Once and For All

The gospel proclaims that **Jesus Christ broke the cycle** of sin, death, and human striving.

He didn't offer another method for spiritual progress — **He became our substitute**, taking upon Himself the full consequence of our karma — our sin — so we could be free forever.

"For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God."

— 1 Peter 3:18

"It is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment."

— *Hebrews 9:27*

That means:

You do not need to be reborn endlessly.

You can be born again once — spiritually — through faith in Christ.

1. Jesus Carried Your Karma So You Could Receive Grace

In Hindu thought, karma is inescapable — every action has its consequence. But in the gospel, **grace interrupts karma**.

"He Himself bore our sins in His body on the tree."

— 1 Peter 2:24

Jesus took what you deserved and gave you what He deserved — forgiveness, peace, and eternal life.

That's not karma. That's **love unearned**.

2. Reincarnation Is Replaced by Resurrection

Jesus didn't teach endless rebirths — He taught **a single life**, followed by **resurrection and judgment**.

But for those who trust in Him, resurrection is not punishment — it's *victory*.

"I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live."

— John 11:25

Reincarnation says you must keep coming back to pay your debts. Resurrection says: **your debt is paid**, and you rise to live forever with God.

True liberation — freedom from sin, guilt, fear, and death — is not the result of lifetimes of effort.

It is the result of **one act of divine mercy**.

"You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

— John 8:32

"If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."

— John 8:36

In Jesus, *moksha* becomes more than escape — it becomes **relationship**. You are not dissolved into the Divine; you are **embraced** by your Creator.

4. Assurance Replaces Uncertainty

In Hindu thought, you can never be sure if your karma is fully repaid. But in Christ, you can rest in assurance:

"There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus."

— *Romans 8:1*

Salvation is not a lifelong test. It is a **completed gift**:

"By grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God."

— Ephesians 2:8

You don't have to wonder, "Will I come back again?" You can know: "I will rise again with Him."

5. The Final Liberation: Life Without End, Love Without Fear

Jesus offers not temporary release from suffering, but **eternal life in His presence**—a life free from sin, death, and sorrow.

"And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes; there shall be no more death, nor sorrow, nor crying."

— Revelation 21:4

That is the true *moksha* — not escaping existence, but existing forever in perfect love.
