NOTE: Ancient cities were measured by outside wall circumference. A furlong is an eighth of a mile, which means the city will have a circumference of 1500 miles; and since it is square, each wall will be 375 miles in length. It will contain 140,625 square miles, which is more area than Virginia, District of Columbia, Pennsylvania, Maryland, New Jersey, Rhode Island and Vermont combined. It is unbelievably gigantic. At least 39 billion people could live in the city. This is ten times the world's present population.
