# **Questions About Exegesis of Colossians 2:9**

I understood what the pastor said concerning Ellen G. White, the Trinity & Oneness, and Sola Scriptura. I very much would like to accept Pastor Ed Anderson's gracious invitation to continue to dialogue with him. Nobody has ever asked me how did I come to the conclusion I have concerning Oneness. So, if the Pastor is ok with this, I would like to have the opportunity, using only the Protestant Canon of Scripture to explain how and why I believe as I do....one Scripture at a time.

Would the pastor please exegete this Scripture: "For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily."

Colossians 2:9 KJV

#### Answer:

Thank you for your gracious and thoughtful spirit—and yes, I (Pastor Ed Anderson) would be honored to continue this respectful dialogue with you. I deeply appreciate that you're seeking to ground your beliefs in the **Protestant Canon of Scripture** and that you're open to careful study, one verse at a time. That's the true heart of a *Berean* (Acts 17:11).

Let's begin with the verse you selected:

# Colossians 2:9 KJV

"For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily."

## Verse-by-Verse Exegesis

"For in Him..."

Paul is speaking of **Christ**, as established clearly in the previous verse (Colossians 2:8), warning against philosophy that draws us away from "*Christ*". So "*Him*" here = **Jesus**.

#### "Dwelleth"

This is the Greek word κατοικεῖ (katoikei) — which means *to dwell permanently*, not temporarily. It doesn't mean God merely *rested* or *manifested* in Jesus like a tent—but rather, **fully abides** in Him.

This is a **strong argument against mere adoptionism** or the idea that God temporarily empowered or entered into a human body. Instead, Jesus **permanently possesses** divine nature.

#### "All the fulness"

In Greek: πãν τὸ πλήρωμα (pan to plēr $\bar{o}$ ma) — the complete fullness.

This refers to the **entirety of divine essence**, not just *some* attributes of God. Paul is echoing Colossians 1:19:

"For it pleased the Father that in him should all fulness dwell."

#### "Of the Godhead"

This word **Godhead** is  $\theta \epsilon \delta \tau \eta \tau o \zeta$  (theotetos) — used only once in the entire New Testament. It refers to **divine essence or nature**. It is *not* just divinity in action (like divine power or miracles), but **deity in being**.

Theotētos = "The state of being God." Not just *Godlike*, but **fully God in nature and substance**.

### "Bodily"

Greek: σωματικῶς (sōmatikōs) — meaning in bodily form or physical reality.

This is crucial because Paul is affirming:

- **Jesus wasn't just an avatar or illusion of God** (refuting early Gnostic teachings).
- He was **fully divine in human flesh**—not 50% God, 50% man, but **100% God**, **100% man**.

#### THEOLOGICAL SUMMARY

Colossians 2:9 is one of the most powerful declarations of the **full deity of Christ** in bodily form. Here's what it teaches:

Phrase	Meaning
"In Him"	Refers to Jesus Christ
"Dwelleth"	Permanently resides, not temporary
"All the fulness"	The complete, total divine essence
"Of the Godhead"	Theotēs — full divine nature, not a
	reflection
"Bodily"	Literally in human form —
	incarnated

#### CONTRAST TO ONENESS DOCTRINE

The **Oneness** position often uses this verse to claim that *Jesus is the Father, Son, and Spirit—all rolled into one person*. But Colossians 2:9 doesn't **define** the relationships within the Godhead. It declares that **Jesus is fully God**, not that He is the **entirety of God in all roles**.

To interpret it as Jesus being the Father Himself would conflict with:

### ➤ John 1:1–2

"In the beginning was the Word... and the Word was with God... He was in the beginning with God."

"With God" implies distinction, not singularity of person.

### ➤ John 14:16

"I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter..."

Jesus is not praying to Himself. He's referring to the Father sending the Holy Spirit.

# ➤ 1 John 2:1

"We have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous."

Jesus is not our **advocate with Himself**, but with **the Father**—again showing relationship between persons within the Godhead.

#### **ELLEN WHITE CONFIRMATION**

Ellen White affirms the full deity of Christ *in harmony* with Colossians 2:9:

"In Christ is life, original, unborrowed, underived. 'He that hath the Son hath life.' The divinity of Christ is the believer's assurance of eternal life."

— The Desire of Ages, p. 530

#### She continues:

"The Father is all the fullness of the Godhead invisible. The Son is all the fullness of the Godhead manifested."

— Evangelism, p. 614

This matches Colossians 2:9 beautifully: Jesus is the **embodied expression** of the fullness of God—**not the only person of God**, but the **visible form** of the invisible God (Colossians 1:15).
