- This "judgment scene" publicly confirms their reward often referred to as a judicial review before the universe

## ➤ Goats = Those who rejected Christ, even if they claimed to know Him

• These face eternal separation from God

• This includes the resurrected wicked at the end of the Millennium (Revelation 20:5, 13–15)

So while it may seem like "all nations" are gathered **on earth** at the Second Coming, in context, this is a **final judgment scene** — **after** the Second Coming, **after** the Millennium, as described in Revelation 20.
