(Ephesians 5:19) May I repeat, "melody in your heart to the Lord," not to others, not to entertain, but to commune with God.

Well, the Lord did speak to Pastor Graeff through the hymn, and his heart was filled with "joy unspeakable and full of glory." From that experience, the Pastor exclaimed, "I know He cares! I know my Savior cares!" The Lord gave him a new song.

In the Bible, it says, "Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God."
