

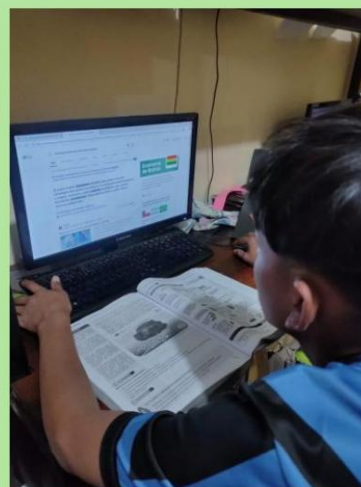


Management Impact Report 2025

1. Home for Students Willing to Excel in Sorata

With the support of Waljok. This program is at the heart of our mission, providing a safe and supportive environment for young people with the potential and determination to transform their lives through education. The **Student Residence** has been a true engine of opportunity, empowering teenagers and young adults to achieve their academic and personal goals. This year we have four graduates: one woman and three men. One of them is entering military service, and three are ready to begin their university studies.

2. Domestic Violence Program: Building Healthy Relationships

During this period, **Waljok and QBL - UK** have enabled us to fulfill our mission of preventing violence in family, educational, and intimate partner settings. We have also been able to support the development of *Peaceful Coexistence Agreements* in five secondary schools in Santa Cruz, fostering the creation of more conscious and respectful communities.

3. **We Are What We Eat Project: Solar Tents in the Bolivian Penitentiary System**

Thanks to the support of **QBL-UK, Quaker Hilfe eV (QH)** and **Irish Quaker Faith in Action**. This project not only promotes food security, but also provides essential life skills necessary for social rehabilitation and productive development in prison settings.

Two solar tents were installed at the **Chonchocoro** maximum security prison in La Paz, giving inmates the opportunity to learn and work as a team in a productive environment, as well as the opportunity to put into daily practice everything that the PAV workshops promote.

The support in monitoring and tracking the solar tents in the **Potosí, Uncía and Oruro** regions was constant, ensuring their long-term sustainability and productivity.

4. PAV Workshop Program in Prisons

The (PAV) has continued to be a pillar for social reintegration, offering participants tools for their personal and social development.

Workshops held: 83 workshops were held throughout the year .

Number of Participants: A total of **2,161 people** attended, primarily focusing on the basic levels. However, there were also advanced level participants who explored topics such as communication, empathy, anger, forgiveness, and self-esteem.

35 Internal Facilitators: The success of the program is largely due to the invaluable support of the **internal facilitators**, who with their commitment support the development of workshops within the prisons and multiply the impact of each workshop.
