Recycling Action Resource (RAR)

The purpose of Clean Up - Give Back's new Recycling Action Resource is to educate groups concerning solid waste, recycling, and litter. The secondary goal is to nurture respect and responsibility for the environment in all people through choice and action.

Clean Up - Give Back will provide or facilitate Digital Experiences, Live Presentations, and Hands-On Learning through the RAR. We encourage its use in school systems, church communities, and any other volunteer networks.

How Does it Work?

Teachers and others are free to use the resource as part of their Science, Biology, Social Studies, and Graphics, Civics curriculum to inform and demonstrate to viewers that every part of their daily life has an effect on the environment

- Onsite Programs: RAR can provide onsite programs for schools, civic groups, senior centers, church groups, employee groups, condo associations, almost any group imaginable. Programs range from 30-60 minutes and can be adapted to any age and experience level.
- Consultations: RAR can consult with any school or business that would like to improve its in house recycling program as well as organize supervised team building cleanups of school grounds, the neighborhood, etc.
- Guest Speakers: Local public office holders, concerned environmentalists, industry representatives, scientists, Park District personnel, and Clean Up Give Back staff.
- Discussion Suggestions: Find out what kids find important regarding the environment. Discuss how science, politics, business, and consumers come together to help. List ways everyone can help through their choices.
- Videos: Detail the recycling and waste stream issues. Open discussion with their teachers in related classroom curriculum. See Classroom Videos below.
- Hands On Learning: Teachers lead an "Invention Project" as part of curriculum where students use recycled objects to make art, usable items, and sculpture to be displayed at The Children's Museum, their school, or the City Hall lobby. Desk organizers, pet food scoop, Rain water gauge.
- Earth Month: Combine this effort with other schools to have a larger show on Earth Day at The Museum of Science and Industry or other notable public location to garner press.

Field Trips

- Tour a recycling facility, land fill, and a water treatment plant.

Class Service Day

- Have students pick an area in need, and schedule a cleanup. Examples include a river walk, forest preserve, and park. Avoid areas of high traffic and along railways.
- Display and Weigh: Take before/after photos and weigh the garbage cleaned.
