





Docu+ and Filmmaker Danny Kim's "ZERO WASTE" to World Premiere at the 39th Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film Festival

SEOUL, Korea – Docu+'s "ZERO WASTE," the highly anticipated first feature documentary film from director Danny Kim (*Producer* of "Love Child" 2014), is set to make its out-of-competition world premiere at the 39th Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film Festival, running from 4 May to 13 May, 2023. The announcement was made today by Francis Cullado, Executive Director of the 39th Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film Festival.

In tandem with the announcement, Kim - who will attend the festival - stated, "I am honored and thrilled that 'ZERO WASTE' will have its world premiere at the Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film Festival. When I used to live in downtown LA four years ago, I dreamed of making a film that will premiere at the LAAPFF one day. I still can't believe it! From our cast and crew who have worked together and supported me relentlessly, we made it! The film was created for viewing in the collective setting of the theatrical experience. For the first screening to take place at the L.A. LIVE in a vibrant downtown Los Angeles and in the presence of some of Asian American and International cinema's most accomplished artists is beyond exhilarating. I look forward to sharing the call-to-action journey of 'ZERO WASTE' with the world and raising awareness of the plastic pollution crisis, beginning with the Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film Festival, and I wish to thank Francis and the LAAPFF Senior Programmers Essel and Kirby for the selection. This is truly a dream come true."

Since 1983, the Los Angeles Asian Pacific Film Festival has presented over 5,000 films, videos, and digital mediaworks by Asian & Pacific Islander artists, and features seminars, panels, in-person guest appearances, and filmmaker awards. The Film Festival continues to be the largest festival of its kind in Southern California and is the premier showcase for the best and brightest of Asian Pacific cinema.

To better understand how so many recyclables still end up in our ocean and landfill, director Danny Kim picks up his camera to document if our efforts are wasted or if we have an actual impact by our recycling efforts.

"ZERO WASTE" explores the current recycling and upcycling efforts in South Korea through the personal stories of six changemakers. These individuals are advocates for a circular economy who fight against the plastic waste pollution crisis in South Korea.
