Brief History

- May 15, 1935: Father Higgins, with the Blessing of Bishop Molley of the Diocese of Brooklyn, gathered a few WWI veterans and organized the first post of the CVW.
- May 19, 1935: CWV was incorporated under the laws of the State of New York.
- May 1935: Father Higgins journeyed to Rome. Pope Pius XI bestowed his blessing upon the CWV and blessed the American Papal flags of the CWV.
- July 1940: The CWV was officially recognized as a veteran's organization by the VA in Washington D.C.
- August 17, 1984: Pres. Reagan signs legislation granting CWV a Congressional Charter, being the 59th group to receive a Federal Charter, expressing deep admiration for the commitment to serve both God and country.
- April 2, 2021: The organization recognizes the significant support of the auxiliary and begins doing business as "The Catholic War Veterans and Auxiliary of the United States"
