

The passion of each type is grounded in the passion of that type's heart point.

Our **envy** of others (4) is rooted in our assumption that what we have and who we are is imperfect (1). 4's soul child (1) is a goody two-shoes, bossy, self-righteous pushy child, intent on all the other little kids behaving properly.

Our **resentful anger** and stand against what reality represents to us (1) is rooted in our assumption that perfect people feel pleasure, play and are spontaneous all the time (7).

1's soul child (7) is a glutton child who cares nothing about being good or doing the right thing; he only wants to play and take in all the wonderful things that life has to offer.

Our **gluttony** and seeking pleasures in endless options (7) are rooted in our assumption that we are empty and have to horde what little we have (5).

7's soul child (5) is a miserly, withholding, withdrawing, know-it-all child, holding on tightly to what he has.

Our **avarice** in withholding ourself, our heart and our connection from others and from life (5) is rooted in our assumption that others will find out we lack the power to take care of ourselves (8).

5's soul child (8) is a child who likes getting down and dirty and dreams of getting even and devouring endless pints of ice cream.

Our **lust** and insatiable, primal appetites (8) are rooted in our assumption that we are unlovable and have no needs or desires (2).

8's soul child (2) is a needy, clingy, lonely, insecure child who is desperate to be loved and held and is filled with sadness and loneliness.

Our **prideful**, arrogant, painful denial of how we see ourselves as not needy or suffering (2) is rooted in our assumption that our emotions threaten our relationships (4).

2's soul child (4) is a competitive, jealous, envious and spiteful child, who just wants to scream "I hate you!"

Our **sloth** and resignation, resistance, settling instead of going for what we want (9) are rooted in our assumption that we are unimportant (3).

9's soul child (3) deceives and lies in order to present to another whatever will get approval in order to be seen, to shine and be the center of attention.

Our **vainglory** and the desperate need of our ego to be what we believe is important (3) is rooted in our assumption that our ego and psyche will not survive going forward (6).

3's soul child of 6 is a frightened, shy, timid, and insecure child in a hostile world in which no amount of accomplishments will satisfy.

Our **angst** and nameless dread and anxiety leading to overthinking (6) is rooted in our assumption that we must be resigned to a lack of comfort and security (9).

6's soul child (9) doesn't want to come out from under the covers and face the world; she only wants to be comfortable and entertained.
