PROPOSED VMCA NAME CHANGE & Changes to Bylaws

VMCA Membership,

The Virginia Mosquito Control Association's 2022 Annual Conference is coming up soon, and with that, our Annual Business Meeting. The board is looking to implement two sets of changes to the bylaws. Please reference the bylaws <u>on the website</u> for specific changes.

The changes in RED are standard changes focused on grammatical errors, clarification of bylaws that are confusing, or situations that have arisen and need to be addressed. This is done every few years to make sure the board and our organization follow a set of standards.

The changes in **BLUE** propose **a change to the VMCA name itself**. Over recent years, there has been an expansion in many of the counties and cities practicing mosquito control to include other vectors and pests of public health importance (e.g. ticks, cockroaches, rodents) and there is a proposal to change the name of the Association to the **Virginia Mosquito and Vector Control Association (VMVCA)**.

When you receive your voting ballot through email, along with the executive board election, there will be a section to vote on the proposed changes to the bylaws. Each type of change (those focused on streamlining and grammar, and the change to the name) will be a separate vote. If you are unable to vote online prior to the meeting, there will be a way to vote in person at the Annual Conference before the Annual Business meeting starts.

JOSEPH EDWIN ANDREWS November 15, 1959 - June 19, 2021

Joseph Edwin Andrews, 61, of Cameron, NC, passed away June 19, 2021, at his home surrounded by family following a courageous 17-month battle with pancreatic cancer.

In high school Joe was a competitive swimmer. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Marine Biology from the University of Wilmington.

Joe worked for NC Fisheries helping with research on Turtle Exclusion Devices, amongst many other duties. He became interested in Vector Disease Control and went to work for North Carolina Public Health Pest Management. Eventually he moved to the private sector in mosquito control.

Joe was active in half a dozen professional associations and was Board President of the North Carolina Vector and Disease Association and the Mid-Atlantic Mosquito Control Association. During his tenure he became known for his teaching and training.

Joe received several awards, including the Hamilton Stevens Award for Outstanding Performance, The Silver Dipper Award, and the Outstanding Service Award from the Mid-Atlantic Mosquito Control Association.

Joe was also a dedicated volunteer for the Friends of Madison County Animals and the Southeast Llama Rescue. He was manager of the Sanford Farmers' Market and was an avid hunter and fisherman.

Joe is survived by his wife Laurie Alvin Andrews, his children, Aurea Andrews, and Molly Andrews Williams (Sean) and by his sisters, Marian Andrews Brenton (Douglas), Carolyn Andrews, and Laurie Andrews Manley (Junior), and his rescued dog, Muddy Malone.

Joe was a very kind and generous person. I could reach out to him with a question or problem and I would hear back from him as a friend and a company representative. He was very knowledgeable in his trade and never made you feel inadequate when responding to you.

He attended many of Virginia Mosquito Control Association meeting. Many of us would seek him out to talk and hang out after the meeting. There we talk shop and usually the conversion would turn to talk of the Ilama rescues that he and Alvin had been on. The Ilamas they had at home at the time and their personalities. Thank you, Joe! You will be missed greatly.

2022 VMCA CONFERENCE COVID-19 GUIDELINES

The following COVID-19 guidelines and recommendations have been prepared by an Ad Hoc committee of the VMCA with the purpose of protecting the health and safety of the attendees of the 2022 VMCA Annual Conference. As a Public Health Organization, VMCA members have an elevated responsibility to be respectful and considerate to one-another and the local community when we gather in early 2022. In some cases, these recommendations may be more stringent than local COVID-19 recommendations within the community and/or hotel. We respectfully request that you follow these guidelines as closely as possible.

Regardless of vaccination status, we request that VMCA members attending the in-person annual conference and its related events:

- Wear a mask at all times when indoors, with the exception of when you are eating and drinking.
- Keep a social distance of at least 6 feet whenever possible.
- Stay home if you are exhibiting <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u>
- Utilize hand sanitizer and wash hands frequently.

The hotel will provide the following:

- Face coverings (if a guest does not have their own)
- Hand sanitizer stations
- Gloves (as needed for certain activities)
- Regular cleaning/sanitizing

During presentations in the conference hall:

- 6-foot tables will be arranged in classroom seating formation.
- Attendees will be encouraged to keep the same seat for the entire day, and for all days they are in attendance, if possible.
- Spacing and number of tables/chairs will be determined by the number of in-person attendees with the goal of creating as much social distance as possible.
- Speakers, as well as audience members will keep masks on during presentations. The lavalier microphone will be attached to clothing.
- Presider will routinely wipe down the podium and lavalier.

During breaks, breakfasts, banquet luncheon, icebreaker, silent auction, and hospitality room:

- Masks are required at all food stations.
- Gloves will be available and are recommended for buffet service to minimize the touching of high-contact surfaces.
- All tables will be spaced at least 6 feet apart, and the number of chairs will be minimized to maximize social distance.
- If attendees do not feel comfortable with seating in food areas, food can be consumed in the conference room.
- There will be a sign-in sheet for the hospitality room for the purposes of contact tracing (if needed)

Honorary Membership: An award that may be given to someone that has contributed to VMCA and may be near retirement


<u>Dr. Jorge Arias Student Competition Award</u>: Award given to the winner of that year's VMCA student competition.







WHAT'S THAT? ANSWER

That is an adult spotted lanternfly (*Lycorma delicatula*), an invasive planthopper originating from various areas of east Asia. It was first detected in the US back in 2014 in Berks County, Pennsylvania, and has since rapidly spread to Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, West Virginia and Virginia. *L. delicatula* relies primarily on Tree of Heaven (*Ailanthus altissma*, below) not only as a source for food but also as site to lay its eggs. However, the insect does pose a broader threat to the country's grape, orchard, and logging industries.

First detected in Frederick County, Virginia in 2018, spotted lanternfly's life cycle can be broken down into: egg, four stages of larvae, and adult. Adults will begin to lay eggs in late summer and early fall; the eggs will overwinter and hatch out by June of the following year. The hatchlings will then forage for food, feeding off the sap of their host plant, *A. altissma*, but are also known to feed on a variety of tree species including sumac, walnut, maple, oak, tulip poplar, hickory, poplar, sycamore, birch, elm, fruit trees, basswood, sassafras, serviceberry, ash, and black gum. Cultivated and native grapes are also considered at risk of infestation.






