

# **Hunting Rules and Regulations**

- Every hunter, 12 or older, has to take a Hunter Education course
- Hunters have to purchase licenses annually for what and how they are going to hunt
- You can't hunt whenever you want, however you want, and at anything you want to

## **Turkey Season**

- Bag Limit
  - 1 per day, 3 per license year, no more than 2 in the fall
- Legal Time
  - Half hour before sunrise until noon
    - Turkey breeding season
  - Half hour before sunrise to sunset
    - Changes in late spring because most hens are incubating and run a lower risk of being accidentally shot

# Where to Hunt and Blaze Orange

- Where can I hunt?
  - Your own property
  - Public land where hunting is allowed
  - Land with permission from land owner
  - 200 yards away from a place of worship and/or dwelling
- Blaze Orange
  - Has to be a solid color, worn on the upper body, and visible 360 degrees
  - In Virginia, you only have to wear a hat

# Turkey Biology – Males

### Jake

- Young male turkey
- Fan not uniform
- Small beard and spurs
- Usually in small flocks together during the breeding season

### Tom

- Older male turkey
- Uniform fan
- Typically the longer the beard and spurs, the older the bird
- More solitary

### Overall

- Scat looks like a "j", but can be a pile
- Head color is an indicator of mood
- More caruncles and longer snood than a hen
- Strut



# Turkey Biology – Females

- Jenny
  - Young female
- Hen
  - Older female
  - Can have beards and strut
  - Have a smaller snood, a line of feathers going up their head, and less caruncles
- Scat looks like a pile/circle







# Turkey Biology – Poults

- Hatch covered with feathers and can start to walk around shortly after hatching
- Can start to fly within weeks
- At about 2.5 months of age, they start losing the feathers around their head



# Turkey Biology – Basic Vocalizations

### Male

- Gobble
  - More likely to hear in the early morning

### Either sex

- Cluck and/or purr
  - Content bird


### Female

- Yelp
  - Can mean different things
  - What you call a male turkey in with









- Dust bowl
- Scat under a tree where they roost
- Scat in open areas where males have strutted
- Lines in sandy areas where males were strutting
- Feathers
- Feeding in the leaves
- Hear them








# How to Hunt Turkeys

- Spring-Call in and 2/3 rule
  - Listen for a gobble
  - Cut the distance to the bird by about 2/3
  - Call him in the other 1/3 by mimicking a hen
- Spring-Fan-in
  - Use a turkey fan to make a Tom come running to you
  - Only use if you trust hunters around you
- Spring and Fall-Stand Hunting
  - Wait for one to come by
- Clothing
  - HAVE to wear camo head to toe, usually wear leafy suits
  - Turkey's eye sight and hearing is exceptional












# Fieldwork and Turkey Hunting

- In my opinion, spring turkey hunting is more dangerous than deer hunting
  - Head to toe camo
  - Typically not staying in one spot, you are going after birds gobbling
    - Someone else nearby could be doing the same
  - Shooting from the ground and out instead of a more downward angle from a tree stand
  - More vegetation to obstruct your vision in the Spring





# Fieldwork and Turkey Hunting cont.

- If you are concerned about hunters in the woods:
  - Act as if there is always the potential they are there
    - Talk
      - Rustling lets a hunter know something is there, but not what
      - It can be fairly dark close to full day legal times
    - Wear something bright



# Turkeys and Mosquitoes?

- Turkeys and chickens can get a virus called fowl pox
  - Characterized by dark scab like areas on their exposed skin
- Mosquitoes are vectors of fowl pox and can spread it within a flock
- There is no treatment, you just have to let it run its course
  - Mortality is low
