Our annual meeting is just around the corner and as always, I know it will provide a great opportunity to learn and be re-acquainted with friends and colleagues.

The VMCA ballot will be mailed out next month so please be on the look out for it. There are two outstanding candidates running for 1st Vice President and I encourage all voting members to take an active role.

We all know by now that the pending EPA-mandated NPDES permit is scheduled to become a reality in April 2011. A draft permit, for comments, is to be issued in March 2010. The VDEQ will administer and enforce the new permit requirements. The VMCA provides the perfect avenue for providing comments and input but to be effective, it is imperative that we ALL make our voices heard. There is a wide range of mosquito control operations within our state and we need to make sure the permit writers understand what we do. It is ultimately up to us to do what we can to ensure this process is as painless as possible. We need to express our questions and concerns. The goal is to operate under a statewide General Permit. This likely means each locality would still be responsible for providing their own individual Notice of Intent. There are still more questions than answers.

Randy Buchanan, Legislative Committee co-chair, will be coordinating with VDACS and the VDEQ in the upcoming months as they begin to hammer out proposed permit details. Again, VDACS will not have a role in enforcing the permit. They have only been asked by VDEQ to provide insight because they are the current entity regulating pesticide use. Please channel any input and/or questions you may have for the state, through Randy.

## In Memory of LTC (Ret.) Benjamin F. McLaurin, Jr.



LTC (Ret.) Benjamin F. McLaurin, Jr., known to all as Ben, was born on January 29, 2942 in Yazoo City, Mississippi to the late Benjamin F. McLaurin, Sr., and Sezzie M. McLaurin. He departed this life on Monday morning, December 7, 2009, at Potomac Hospital, Woodbridge, Virginia.

Ben was educated in the Coahoma County schools and graduated from Coahoma County Agricultural High School, Clarksdale, Mississippi, in 1959. In 1963 he graduated from Kansas State University with a Bachelor's degree in entomology. In 1965 he received a Master's degree in entomology. He was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army Medical Services Corps in 1965. His career spanned over 25 years, with assignments in Korea, Vietnam, Germany and several CONUS assignments; he received numerous achievement awards, citations, decorations and medals throughout his career. In

1990, Lieutenant Colonel McLaurin retired from Army Medical Command as a Medical Entomologist. He began his civilian career in 1992 as an entomologist with the Prince William County Environmental Services Division and remained in this position until July 2009.

Ben's loving memory will be cherished by his devoted wife Mary, Lake Ridge, Virginia, one son, Kevin M. McLaurin, one daughter-in-law, Kimmie McLaurin, two grandsons, Matthew and Sean,



## VMCA Legislative Committee NPDES Permitting Updates


October 7, 2009 the EPA held a webinar to talk about the upcoming National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permitting requirement for the application of pesticides to, over or near Water of the US (WOUS). You can review this at the following link. <u>http://www.h2osci.com/News/EPA%20Aquatic%20Pesticide%20Webcast%2010.7.09.pdf</u>. On December 9, 2009 we held an informal meeting with a group from Virginia Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services (VDACS) to talk about our industry and offer assistance in providing information. VDACS regulates pesticide applications in Virginia. The upcoming NPDES permit for pesticide applications to WOUS will be regulated by The Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). VDEQ regulates issues concerning WOUS in Virginia.

Municipalities that currently have a NPDES Storm Water Permit, regulated by Virginia Department of Conservation & Recreation (DCR) will likely still be required to obtain a NPDES permit for pesticide applications to, over or around WOUS. Note that DCR regulates Virginia's Storm Water Program. We are currently working with DEQ to build a Draft permit that will be available for public comment April 11, 2010.

The focus of this permit will include Mosquito Control, Gypsy Moth Control, Aquatic Pest Control and anyone that applies pesticides to, over or around water. The definition of "around" water has not yet been determined. We have great hopes of having enough input to make this as painless as possible. If your organization applies pesticides to, in or around waters of the US, you need to contact us and provide input.

# A B C of Bites Education and Outreach is a Year Round Effort

For the past few years the Fairfax County program has aggressively reached out to the community with its mosquito messages. Fliers, PSAs, brochures, calendars, fly swatters and candy bugs and we were always well-received by the community - yet we were lacking in the area of young child and parent education.

Between the 2008 and 2009 mosquito seasons, the DCIP staff worked on several children's books in the hope of coming up with an educational tool that would work with young families. It was during these months of trial and error that we discovered that writing a children's book is not easy.

Finally, we decided on an ABC book -- it sure sounded simple. How hard could it be to come up with words, phrases and pictures for 26 letters? Well it was hard and it was challenging and at the end it was fun.

We were coming to the end of the 2009 mosquito season and the books were not yet ready. In mid-September, the Fairfax County Disease Carrying Insects Program received its shipment of around 10,000 children's books. We were happy to have them in hand and then came to the realization that the season is almost over and mosquitoes were not a concern of the community. As many of you know the Fairfax County program does not lack ingenuity in the area of marketing its program. With only two community events on the calendar, one at the end of September and the other in October we were worried about getting these books into circulation. Then an idea came up– Let's have a meet the artist and get an autographed book! Joe Sutliff, the artist for all our calendars and this book, agreed to come to the events. For two days on different weekends, Joe signed books for the kids and several thousand books were put into circulation.

We were so happy to see the community reaction to these books. The parents and kids loved them and our elected officials did too.

But the story does not end here.

All year long, H1N1 has been grabbing the headlines and has been the focus of the public health community. H1N1 vaccines have now become available and mass clinics were being held at the Fairfax County Government Center. The goal for each clinic was to vaccinate up to 12,000 people. As public health officials, the Disease Carrying Insects Program staff were called in to work the very long lines and be a combination of greeter and information official. It is often said that good luck is where opportunity and preparedness meets– well on Saturday, November 7, 2009, DCIP got lucky. Thousands of young children and their parents would be standing in line for hours with nothing to do while waiting for a vaccine– that was our opportunity. And we came prepared: a supply of ABC books, a captive audience, and an abundance of staff. The ABC books were almost as popular as the flu vaccine. The kids for a book and the parents had a happy and quiet child.

We share this with you to simply remind you that education and outreach is a year-round activity that can support the other parts of your program by showing the community that you care about them as you do the work of mosquito control.

she served one year on the Virginia Mosquito Control Association Board. She is also an active member of the Tidewater Regional Arboviral Surveillance Team.
