

Candidates for First Vice President

Ms. LaToya N. White started her career of being a Mosquito Control Technician, June, 2010 with the City of Suffolk. She has been a Vector Control Technician since November, 2013 for the City of Newport News. Some of LaToya's tasks are responding to complaints from the general public concerning mosquito infestations and rodents; locating mosquitoes breeding places; working with chemicals and spraying for mosquitoes; conducts site visits and storm water operations. Ms. White is also qualified in the following certifications: 5A – Aquatic Pest; 7A and 7B – General and Household Pest Control and Termite and Other Wood Destroying Insects. LaToya has spoken at several Virginia Mosquito Control meetings and regional conferences on the above subjects. Also, she has served on the board for Tidewater Mosquito and Vector Control Council.



Following graduation from Bethel High, Hampton Public
Schools, LaToya completed undergraduate degree in Biology, Old Dominion University in 2007. Toya
worked for Virginia Living Museum while attending college and there is where she fail in love with fish.

In 2001, Lauren began her career in mosquito control as a summer employee treating catch basins for Clarke Mosquito Control in Roselle, IL. During her 14 years at Clarke, Lauren worked as a field employee, Operations Supervisor, Control Consultant, and as their Biologist for the Eastern Region. In 2015 she began her current position with Fairfax County's Disease Carrying Insects Program. When not working with mosquitoes and ticks, Lauren can be found playing video games, working on her insect collection, foraging for



wild edible mushrooms, or reading a good book. She currently lives in Manassas, VA with her husband Eric, and their two cats, Kahoo and Dodge.

YORK COUNTY MOSQUITO CONTROL SEASON WRAP UP

Weekly mosquito trapping operations were conducted from May through October. Staff trapped and speciated over 6500 mosquitoes this season representing 28 species. We were excited to collect two new species not found previously; *Uranotaenia sapphirina* and *Toxorhynchites rutilus*. The species captured most frequently was *Aedes albopictus*, the Asian Tiger, representing 66% of the total capture.

Ground spray operations were conducted throughout the County from May through October. For the second consecutive year, no aerial spray operations were conducted. Larvicide was applied to ditches, depressions, and water holding areas throughout the season. The entire vacuum sewer system within the County was treated with larvicide for the first time.

Staff participated in two research projects this season. The first was a trial of an organic, garlic based pesticide and was completed in the Tabb area. The second was the testing of an organic larvicide. This study was conducted over a six month period within the vacuum sewer system in the Dare area and the results will be presented at the annual AMCA meeting. Focus was put on increasing education and outreach activities this season. Some examples were participating in Market Days; presenting an educational program to every York County 3rd grade class; producing two new brochures; updating the departmental website; filming two features on WTKR news; performing door to door canvassing events; and putting educational displays in the libraries. The 2nd annual Mosquito Control tire amnesty event was conducted in June.

In the coming season, focus will continue on increased education. We will also increase our larvicide operations in our continuing effort to have a green and sustainable mosquito control program. The use of bicycles to deploy larvicide, rather than trucks or ATVS, began in 2015 and will be increased in the 2016 season.

New Mosquito Key for the Mid-Atlantic Region is Coming

The long awaited "The Mosquitoes of the Mid-Atlantic Region: An Identification Guide" has been completed and will be submitted to the printer in the next 2-3 weeks. The book will contain specifically designed mosquito keys for 8 states that make up the Mid-Atlantic Mosquito Control Association, (GA, SC, NC, VA, MD, DE, PA, and WV). Tennessee will not be included in the key due to the fact it became part of MAMCA after the keys were completed and the 599 illustrations were finished, numbered and inserted into the key couplets.

The book will be "wired- bound, and include 206 pages with: keys to female and larval mosquitoes for 89 species, 599 illustrations, notes, a glossary, lists of species in the above MAMCA states, plus a number of other informative parts designed for mosquito control personnel".

Fortunately for us, Dr. Harrison will be attending the VMCA meeting in January but will not be selling copies or have them on hand. However, he will have one for show and will provide information on the price and how to order them.

So, be thinking about all the very useful information that will be at your fingertips at a very reasonable price and how many copies you or your office will need.

What's That? Answer

That is a portion of a figure describing microsatellite allele frequencies in *Aedes aegypti* individuals collected in Washington, D.C. 
