INTRODUCTION

Thanks to the concerted efforts and commitment of various organisations, South Africa is home to the world's largest population of free-roaming black and white rhino. Tragically, due to increasingly sophisticated poachers backed by powerful syndicates, it is dwindling fast, despite everything being done to protect them.

Poaching started gaining momentum in the early 1970s, mostly to meet the demands of the illicit trade in rhino horn. Today it has reached a point where their very existence hangs in the balance. Besides being magnificent creatures, rhinos play a crucial role in the ecosystem by grazing large amounts of vegetation and shaping the landscape to the benefit of other animals, making their survival of paramount importance.

However, due to Covid-19 and the subsequent loss of tourism income, the economic pressure placed on anti-rhino poaching initiatives is immense, as their protection requires manpower and equipment that costs millions.



Here, we have created a fully sustainable eco-system where rare antelopes, as well as disease-free buffalo, black and white rhino and the Big Five, amongst many other wildlife species are nurtured and protected. Genetic diversity is safeguarded and enhanced by accommodating sustainable numbers of each species, ensuring an optimal environment and habitat in which to thrive.





Our vision is to give back to nature so that future generations can admire the beauty and majesty of African wildlife as it roams free in its natural habitat.

Amongst our many accomplishments, we have already successfully reintroduced 20 black rhino to Rwanda after the last one disappeared from that country in 2004.




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YOUR CHANCE TO GET UP CLOSE TO RHINOS AND CONTRIBUTE TO THEIR SURVIVAL
