The Facts After much discussion and after obtaining employee input, the Town Board in October 2024, unanimously (both political parties voting in favor) approved the 2025 Town budget which included a change in the required hours of the Supervisor position to full time. It was noted that the complexity of the position has increased and full-time involvement is required. The Supervisor's salary was increased in 2025 to \$68,000 to reflect that full-time status. We believe most would agree this is a reasonable salary for the position as chief executive officer of a town our size, implementing policies and managing town resources effectively and 24/7 on call response to emergency situations such as our spring 2025 flooding. The Supervisor's 2026 salary is budgeted for the same general across the board increase (3.2%) as all Rush employees.
