PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Pre-Conference evening of networking and education will kick off our 2 full day conference hosted at the Grand Sierra Resort (GSR) in Reno, Nevada. The program will provide health care professionals with evidence-based information about wound, ostomy, continence and foot care topics.

Hosted in northwest Nevada, along the Nevada-California border, the 2022 conference "Back to the Future in WOC nursing Practice" will include: 11.5 CEU's approved by the California Board of Registered Nursing, 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches and 2 evening gala events with hors d'oeuvres to network with colleagues whilst learning about innovative products from our vendors. Expert speakers will empower you by expanding your knowledge base on the most recent advances in wound, ostomy, continence (WOC) nursing science and practice, thereby preparing you for greater success in your professional role as a healthcare provider.

The hotel is 2 miles from Reno-Tahoe International Airport, via complimentary airport shuttle service. Grand Sierra Resort is conveniently located near the interchange of two major highways – I-80 and I-580 (US 395) and, 5 miles from Tahoe National Forest. Grand Sierra Resort conference rooms are conveniently located in a separate wing of the resort (away from the lobby and casino area) and is accessible directly from the guest room elevators. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES: PARTICIPANTS WILL BE ABLE TO:

- To explore the formative and early years of “Notable Nurses” to better understand what personal and professional inspiration and drive influenced their actions to trailblaze health care, especially for the most vulnerable populations.
- To substantiate by empirically identifying and describing their activity prior to the “calling” to be a professional nurse and relevance to belonging, attachment, and membership.
- To describe travel/s as a form of pilgrimage.
- To identify “notable International, USA, and Alaska nurses”.
- To identify “notable military, male, native and LGBTQ, nurses of color and native heritage”.
- Recall the history and definition of Negative Pressure Wound Therapy (NPWT)
- Explain the science behind NPWT mechanisms of action
- Discuss new NPWT research
- Describe the Fundamentals of NPWT
- Describe, based on the assessment of the lower extremity, essential treatment components.
- Discuss off-loading options for the neuropathic foot.
- List essentials of care to treat and prevent recurrence of neuropathic foot ulcerations.
- Identify areas for process improvement in your work area
- Identify technology to measure outcomes and drive change
- Associate time and money saved with process improvements in order to engage the C-Suite
- Identify types of incontinence and available treatment options including: Behavioral, lifestyle modification, innovative procedures and surgical options for the incontinent patient
- Describe how to establish an effective incontinence program in a Urology, Urogynecology or senior setting
- Describe the efficacy of Biofeedback
- Describe when and how cultures should be obtained vs monitoring.
- Explain how to interpret cultures and determine if treatment is warranted.
- Review reading cultures; basic 101
- Describe the essential components of a comprehensive lower extremity assessment.
- Identify how and why a certified foot care nurse is instrumental in prevention of pressure ulcers, neuropathic foot injuries, and falls in an acute and or assisted living setting.
- List members of an interdisciplinary team necessary for the care of people with diabetes, cardiovascular disease, and or immobility issues.
- Understand some of the mechanical and structural contributions of wounds
- Understand some of the surgical solutions to wounds related to deformity
- Understand the structure of a multidisciplinary Limb Preservation Service
- Understand the benefits of hospital support for Limb Preservation Service
- Understand the purpose and value of a Clinical Care Coordinator in the management of lower extremity wounds
- Identify two strategies for management of typical diarrhea.
- List two signs of symptoms of malabsorption
- Detail appropriate enzyme dosing and adjustments through therapy.
- Discuss clinical assessment of the patient with a peristomal hernia.
- Identify available equipment and practical strategies for peristomal hernia management

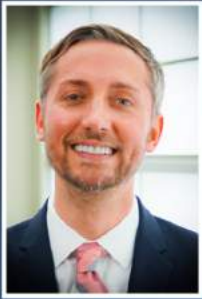
