Obtaining Purity (Psalm 119:9-6)

"How can a young man keep his way pure?"

An Image of Defense (v.9)

- O To remain pure, we must guard against temptation (Eph. 6:10-18).
 - O Temptations <u>will</u> come (**Luke 17:1**).
 - To fight temptation, we must remain on guard (1 Pet. 5:8) and look for the escape route (1 Cor. 10:13).
- O God provides a tool for guarding against sin prayer (Luke 21:36; Matt. 26:41).
 - We must guard ourselves by praying for strength in times of trial (Matt. 6:13).
 - OWhen we do succumb to the temptations of the devil, we must make it a top priority to convene with God in prayer upon repenting of our sins (1 John 1:9).

A Heart Set on God (v.10-16)

- O To remain pure, our hearts must seek after God (v.10-11; Prov. 3:5; Col. 3:1, NIV).
 - Our entire being must be set on serving God (Matt. 22:37; Luke 9:23).
- O To have a heart set on God means we are willing to obey every commandment He requires of us (v.12; John 14:15; 1 John 5:3).
 - We have to train our hearts to be set upon Him (Psalm 119:112; Prov. 2:2, 4:23; Rom. 12:2; Heb. 4:12; James 4:8b).
 - O More than mere obedience is required if we want to be seen as pure by God. We must also take joy in obeying Him (v.14, 16; Rom. 7:22).
 - We should mirror the attitude of the psalmist, inclining our hearts to God in joyful obedience. If we do, God will likewise incline His heart to us (James 4:8a).

Conclusion

- The writer of Psalm 119 clearly desired purity.
 - We too must desire purity (Matt. 5:8; 1 Tim. 4:12, 5:22).
- O We should replicate the Psalmist's example by being ready for the battle against sin and setting our hearts on God (Phil. 4:8), joyfully obeying Him (Heb. 13:18, NLT).
- If we pattern our lives by mirroring the example the psalmist provides, then we will be well on our way to keeping ourselves pure before the eyes of our Lord.
