- B. “It is written” settled matters for Jesus (Matt. 4:4)
- C. Jesus treated scripture as God speaking (Matt. 19:4-5)
- D. Jesus said scripture cannot be broken (John 10:35)
- E. Jesus said God’s word is truth (John 17:17)
- F. Jesus expected scripture to be fulfilled exactly (Luke 24:44)

- E. Jesus condemned tradition overriding scripture (Matt. 15:1-9)
- F. Rejecting scripture means rejecting Christ Himself (John 12:48)
