JADE provided 33 and 35 food boxes respectively in the months of August and

Our three Women's Small Groups met weekly in the outdoors. It had been a blessing to meet and sing, pray, and study God's word. With the restrictions implemented in mid-September, we have planned online meetings.

JADE continues to offer free bi-monthly sewing classes for ladies and young girls. It has been an adventure for many of these ladies as they learned to sew for the first time turning a piece of cloth into a shirt, blouse or dress.

How time flies! We are having a rewarding journey as we continue to give and serve. May God continue to protect, provide, and prepare us to make a difference in a life, one person at a time.

Every month, Eva and I deliver food and spend time getting to know the recipients of the food ministry. Recipients share how grateful they are and what an impact this ministry has on their lives. Ms. E, a woman in her eighties, is caring for her 54-year old son, who recently became visually impaired. For over fifty years, Ms. E has been cooking and selling tamales. She mentioned that even though she is old, she is still trying to help herself.

COVID has made it rough on her livelihood. "Some weeks I sell a few; other weeks, I do not even sell one. I am very thankful to receive a food box from JADE. When other villagers drop by and they do not have any food, I share with them."

Ms. E continued, "I am very thankful for everything I receive, and JADE has been a blessing to me and others in the villages."
