Strength for the journey

Terror of demons

Become what we celebrate (Fr. Dan Crosby OFM Cap)

Deliberate Devotionals:

Make them a habit in the family – builds spiritual muscle

Most pleasing when you don't feel like it – demonstrates faithfulness

Scripture – LOH – Rosary – Divine Mercy – Intercession – CCC – Spiritual Reading

Guardian Angels

Liturgy of the Hours or Magnificat

Humility:

Accept whatever may come as God's will

Called to be Holy

Be Holy because I Am Holy:

Lev 11:44-45

1 Ptr 1:16

HOLY: God's main attribute. His otherness. Wholly distinct from creatures. Separated from the secular or profane. Dedicated to God. Consecrated to God, blessed by God, i.e. sacramental, religious profession, ordinations, Baptized, confirmed.

How do we become holy?

Mat 5:3-12 Beatitudes

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, ² for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

⁴ ¹ Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

⁵ ¹ Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

⁶ Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, ¹ for they will be satisfied.

⁷ Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

⁸ ¹ Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

⁹ Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

¹⁰ Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, ¹ for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

¹¹ Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you (falsely) because of me.

¹² ¹ Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven. Thus they persecuted the prophets who were before you. (Mat 5:3-12 NAB)

Mat 5:43 Love of Enemies

⁴³ ¹ "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.'

⁴⁴ But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you, (Mat 5:43-44 NAB)

Mat 6:1 Almsgiving

Matthew 6:1 ¹ "(But) take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them; otherwise, you will have no recompense from your heavenly Father.

² When you give alms, do not blow a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites ¹ do in the synagogues and in the streets to win the praise of others. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward.

³ But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing,

⁴ so that your almsgiving may be secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

⁵ "When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward.

⁶ But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you.

⁷ ¹² In praying, do not babble like the pagans, who think that they will be heard because of their many words.

⁸ Do not be like them. Your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

⁹ ¹² "This is how you are to pray: Our Father in heaven (Mat 6:1-9 NAB)

Mat 6:5 Prayer

Mat 6:16 Fasting

⁶ "When you fast, ¹ do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. They neglect their appearance, so that they may appear to others to be fasting. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward.

¹⁷ But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face,

¹⁸ so that you may not appear to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you. (Mat 6:16-18 NAB)

Mat 6:25 Dependence on God

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat (or drink), or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing?

²⁶ Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you more important than they?

²⁷ Can any of you by worrying add a single moment to your life-span? ¹

Mat 7:21 Do the Will of the Father

²¹ "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, ¹ but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven. (Mat 7:21 NAB)
