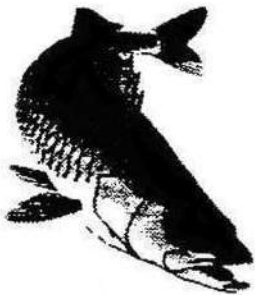

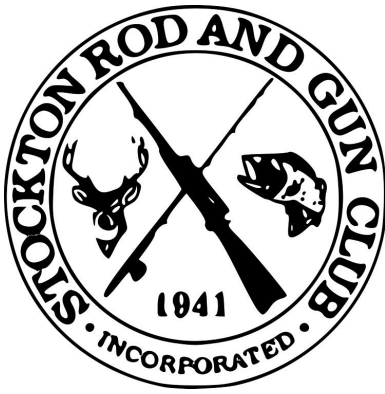

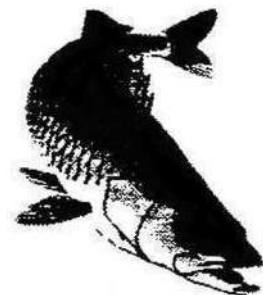

ARTICLE VIII (8)

PRESIDENT

The President shall preside over all meeting of the corporation and the Board of Directors. The President shall sign all certificates of membership. All contracts and other legal documentation which shall have been first approved by the Board of Directors. The President counter-signs all checks upon the Treasury when directed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IX (9)

VICE PRESIDENT

In case of absence of the President or their inability to act, the First Vice President shall act as President. In case of inability of the above officers, the second Vice President shall act as President.

ARTICLE X (10)
Secretary - Treasurer

1. The Secretary shall keep a full and complete record of the proceedings of the Board of Directors and Club meetings. A copy of the minutes of all board meetings shall be furnished to each Director. The Secretary shall read Board meeting minutes at the General meeting.

2. **The Treasurer** shall keep the seal of the corporation and affix same to legal documentation as may be required in the regular course of business, shall make service of such notices as may be necessary or proper, shall supervise and control the keeping of the books and accounts of the corporation, shall take charge of such other business as pertains to the office or as prescribed by the Board of Directors.

3. In the case of absence of the Secretary at the Board meeting or a General meeting, a substitute may be appointed by the President.

ARTICLE XI(11)

TREASURER

The Treasurer shall receive and safely keep all funds of the corporation and deposit same forthwith on receipt in the bank or banks that may be designated by the Board of Directors. Such funds shall be paid out only on a check of the corporation, signed by such persons not less than two, as the Board of Directors may direct.

ARTICLE XIV (14)
MEMBERSHIP

1. Membership of the member defined as an individual who has and retains a valid membership card. A member shall have one vote on each voting matter. Immediate family is defined as being the spouse/partner and unmarried children 18 years old or younger, residing in the household. They shall have the same privileges in the club as the member with the exception that they are not allowed to vote.
2. Application for membership to the Stockton Rod & Gun Club, Inc. shall be set by the Board of Directors not to exceed \$200.00 initiation and \$300.00 yearly dues, (not exceed \$500.00 total) A new member or spouse/partner cannot rent the hall at member rate for one (1) year from joining the club. A member or spouse/partner may rent the hall at the reduced rate once per year, for immediate family use only. Any additional rentals at the reduced rate will be at the discretion of the board.
3. For new applicants, dues shall be pro-rated 25% each quarter.
4. Applicant must appear before the Board of Directors for approval and also before the General Membership to be sworn in and receive membership card. FAILURE TO ATTEND MAY CONSTITUTE CANCELLATION OF MEMBERSHIP. If it is not possible for applicant to appear before the Board his sponsor may appear in his/her behalf or last, an affidavit of loyalty to club conservation oath will be read and signed.
5. The club facilities shall not be used for personal gain.
6. Any member or spouse/partner may serve on a committee of choice. Each member will serve at least 8 hours a year. If a member is unable to put in their 8 hours, they may make a donation of cash or material equal to their service.
7. Each member, when approved by the Board will receive at no cost:
 - One decal
 - One copy of the by-laws
 - Information on buying club shirts, jackets & caps.
 - Information on the Rodettes
 - One copy of club rules.
 - ~~New Application - Referral card~~
7. Each year dues are due and payable Jan. 1 through January 31st. If dues have not been received by January 31st you are no longer a member of the club. Membership may be reinstated by paying the regular initiation and dues as described. In paragraphs 2, 3 and 4.
8. Conviction of any law pertaining to conduct unbecoming to a sportsman by a member may constitute reason for cancellation of membership for a period as set by the Board of Directors.

Paid member will receive (1) Membership Access card. Additional access cards for spouse / partner will cost \$10.00. Replacement cards will cost \$20.00

ARTICLE XVI (16)

AUDITS

The books of the secretary and or Treasurer shall be audited annually. A full report of the audit will be given to the Board of Directors and to the General Membership at the first meeting in February. The financial audit shall be done by an independant accountant or bookkeeping business.

ARTICLE XVII (17)

INVENTORY

At the end of each month an inventory of the concessions shall be conducted by a committee of three appointed by the President, of which the concession chairman or bar manager shall be one, at the end of each month to inventory, and to keep a perpetual inventory running at all times and cost of such inventory. The inventory report shall be given to the board of directors the first Thursday of the month.

ARTICLE XVIII (18)

EMPLOYEES

1. Manager and or caretaker and salaried employees (bartenders), shall be under written contract. Said contract to include wages, time off, vacations, duties, and bonus provisions, if any. The employees are restricted from running for the Board or holding an office while being paid by the Stockton Rod and Gun Club.
2. It is a conflict of interest for an employee to run for the Board as the Board establishes policy. Motion to restrict employees, contracted, or regular paid from running for the board or holding office while paid by Stockton Rod & Gun Club.
