Sources say he had sent money and written letters to a young boy named Timothy with help from a Christian charitable organization.

Compassion International is a non-profit organization that seeks to provide aid for impoverished children in countries across the globe through child sponsorship. They offer an online program through which donors can choose to sponsor a child abroad. Sponsors are encouraged to send letters along with their donation; this is something the former president put into practice.

The former president was able to correspond with Timothy under the pseudonym "George Walker". He was unable to reveal his true identity as this would put the child at risk. This information has just recently been made public due to the president's passing last November.

After his death, representatives from Compassion traveled to the Philippines to personally tell Timothy that the man who had sponsored him was, in fact, a former U.S. president. Timothy was reportedly "dumbfounded" and fondly remembered his former

Perseverant Grace

Nineteen years ago in rural Rwanda, a precious baby girl named Grace was born. She had one arm and no legs, but that didn't stop her parents from adoring her. Her mother called her a gift from God, and they considered her to be a beautiful blessing from God. The people of her village, however, were more suspicious of baby Grace. They pressured the couple to abandon their newborn daughter, but Grace's parents refused. As a result, Grace's father was murdered by a band of thieves sent by his own brothers. Grace's mother had no choice but to take Grace and her four siblings and flee across the border into Uganda.

We know from history that the suffering of children and innocents is not restricted to one time or place, however. During the height of the Korean War, almost 65 years ago, a pastor was sent from the United States to the battlefield to minister to troops stationed there. His name was Reverend Everett Swanson, and the misery he would witness in Korea would change his life forever. The streets of the war-torn country were full of starving, freezing, and dying orphaned children. The overwhelming amount of anguish and injustice moved Rev. Swanson to later return to Korea, this time armed

with donations from American churches, and set up orphanages to provide for the basic needs of Korea's poorest and most vulnerable population. This quickly grew into a thriving nonprofit organization that grew exponentially over the next few decades, expanding into countries all across the globe, bringing goodwill and much needed help wherever they went.

Today, Compassion International is a world-renowned child sponsorship organization operating in 25 countries and overseeing the sponsorship of over a million of the world's most at-risk children. Headquartered in Colorado Springs, Compassion employs almost 5,000 people. What began as a small orphanage in South Korea has now grown into one of the world's most admired nonprofits. A trusted and honored charity organization, Compassion has helped improve -and save- the lives of so many children without hope, spreading the good news about Jesus in the process.

Grace is one of the millions of young people whose life has been impacted by the work of Compassion International. After her father's death, Grace and her family were destitute, homeless, and in danger. That's when they met a local Ugandan village leader named Aunt Betty. She already had nine children of her own, but after hearing Grace's story, she gladly took her and her family into her own home. The family was now free to live in peace and safety away from their father's relatives. What's more, Aunt Betty signed Grace up to be sponsored through Compassion International. Grace was taken to a Compassion child development center where she was able to receive medical treatment and attend school. Compassion was able to care for a family that was in dire need of physical care, but what was even more lasting was the spiritual care they

provided to Grace in the ways that she needed it most. For all of her life, Grace had felt like an outsider, a burden, and "less-than". Through the ministry program of Compassion, Grace began to see herself as God saw her - not as a curse, but as a daughter with eternal purpose. She learned not to dwell in self-pity, but rather to pursue her passions because, in her words, "disability is not inability". Aunt Betty, remembering when she first encountered Grace, remarked that she doubted if Grace would still be alive if it not for the intervention of Compassion. Grace's future has become bright, thanks to God's mercy and the work of Compassion International. Through stories like hers, we can know that there are few causes greater than releasing children from poverty in Jesus' name.

The Value of One

So often in our world we hear stories of suffering. War, disease, pain, political unrest, famine, injustice... it never seems to stop, and we feel powerless to stop it. What pains us even more is when the anguish affects the lives of children and young ones; when suffering afflicts the innocent. According to UNICEF, about 1 billion children worldwide live in poverty, living on less than \$2.50 per day. It's estimated that close to 22,000 children die daily as a result of living in poverty. This tragedy has even been an improvement since recent decades. As humans, we cannot ignore the suffering of innocent children. As followers of Christ, we cannot ignore the suffering of our neighbors. To meet needs like this in the world is why there is Compassion International.

Compassion is a child sponsorship organization that has given aid to 1.9 million children and has been a steady force for positive global change for the past 65 years.

Compassion is currently working in 25 different countries to end childhood poverty and

bring hope to the darkest places of the world in Jesus' name. We are a nonprofit that partners with local churches to match children in need to willing sponsors in the developed world. We ask for \$38 a month per child to ensure that their immediate physical needs are met. Sponsored children also take part in Compassion-run programs that provide Christ-centered education and healthcare.
