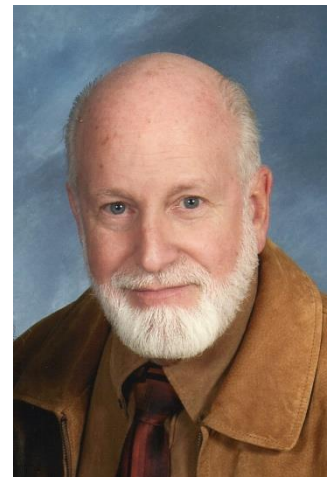
Cheryl Holt –

The first event we attended was the opening ceremony on Sunday afternoon in the Air Canada Center (the arena where the Toronto Maple Leafs Ice Hockey Team is playing). There are over 30,000 Rotarians attending, so they had to have two seatings for the opening ceremony and the arena was full both times. Of course, there were speeches, including one from Princess Ann, presentation of the flags of all the represented countries, yes, there were some countries I had no idea where they are located and there was some amazing entertainment.

It was very impressive to see some of the Rotarians dresses in their typical dresses, especially from some of the African and Asian Nations, what a colorful picture.

The following three days there was always a General Session at the ACC in the morning, always with the arena basically filled to capacity. Some of the speakers included former First Lady Laura Bush, former (first female) Prime Minister of New Zealand and Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau. In the afternoons there were Break-out-sessions, so many of them it was difficult to choose which ones to attend. If we didn't want to attend sessions there was the House of Friendship where you could find all kinds of products and ideas for projects and of course, meet people from around the world.

We took some time to visit with relatives in Toronto and explore the city. I had not been in Toronto for more than 20 years, what a surprise to see all the new modern high risers, it has truly grown into a world city.
