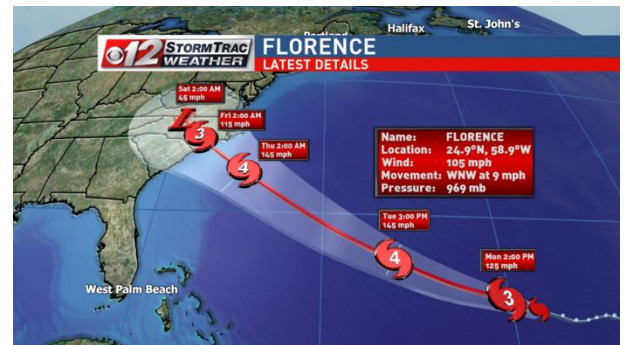

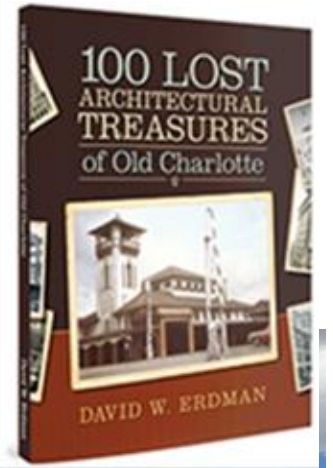
David Erdman – Treasurers of Old Charlotte

David grew up near New Bern, NC. He moved to Charlotte in 1976 and quickly became a well-known trial lawyer.

He leads the law firm of Erdman & Hockfield, which he founded in 1981. In 1999, David was unanimously appointed to the Charlotte City Council to fill an at-large seat.

David is an author and frequent lecturer, having delivered over 225 presentations on the History, Geography, and Future of Charlotte. He has been quoted in media outlets including the New York Times and the Washington Post. His book **100 Lost Architectural Treasures of Old Charlotte** is in its third printing.

In his picture-packed presentations, he shares his extensive knowledge of Charlotte's history and geography.
