

Rotary project enhances Hinds' Feet Farm

HUNTERSVILLE – A local civil club's community service project will enhance the opportunity for expanded activities an daily programs at a facility dedicated to helping adults cope with traumatic brain intuities.

After consulting with Hinds' Feet Farm Director Marty Foil about options for additional assets at the center off Black Farms Road, members of the Happy Hour Rotary Club of Huntersville set about the planning and fundraising to turn a vision

Through club events and a matching grant opportunity – and some hands-on teamwork by the local Rotarians – the club recently completed the installation of a brick paver patio space and several large

planter boxes.

The patio space provides a level area for outdoor therapy sessions and the planter boxes will be used by Hinds' Feet Farm residents and members for container garden projects.

Our Rotary Club and the American Red Cross hosted a blood drive from 11:30 am to 5:30 pm at Spare Time Bowling, 16317 Statesville Road, Huntersville.

Blood donations are in great demand and as Rotarians, we showed our support by rolling up our sleeves and getting the job done. We filled every one of the 32 slots! We had two volunteers per shift to volunteer by taking temperatures and checking in blood donors.

We collected 23 units of blood, what has the potential to save up to 69 lives! There were 13 first time donors!

The need for blood is constant and only volunteer donors can fulfill that need for patients in our community. Nationwide, someone needs a unit of blood every 2 to 3 seconds and most of us will need blood in our lifetime.
