

Community Service - Sunday March 21 – Blood Drive

Our Rotary Club and the American Red Cross hosted a blood drive at Spare Time Bowling, 16317 Statesville Road, Huntersville. Blood donations are in great demand and as Rotarians, we showed our support by rolling up our sleeves and getting the job done. We filled every one of the 32 slots! We had two volunteers per shift to volunteer by taking temperatures and checking in blood donors.

We collected 23 units of blood, what has the potential to save up to 69 lives! There were 13 first time donors!

The need for blood is constant and only volunteer donors can fulfill that need for patients in our community. Nationwide, someone needs a unit of blood every 2 to 3 seconds and most of us will need blood in our lifetime.
