

Greetings from Mandalay Bay in Las Vegas. As I am at a securities conference with George, President Elect Kevin will lead Monday's meeting.

Sunday, October 24th is World Polio Day. This Monday, Ineke will update our club on Rotary's commitment to eradicate polio. Rotary's involvement in this initiative began in 1979 through a Health, Hunger and Humanity Grant to administer oral polio vaccine drops to children in the Philippines. Since then, Rotary members have contributed over \$2.1 billion to protect nearly 3 billion of the world's children. Today, polio has been reduced by 99.9% but remains endemic in Afghanistan and Pakistan. This month's issue of the Rotary Magazine addresses vaccination challenges in these countries with World Health Organization's polio chief, Aidan O'Leary.
