a. Discussion/Action: Delta Tunnels Project Status

Jim Wallace provided an update, that a one-tunnel project is being developed. Alternatives will be proposed. The Delta Legacy Communities organization represents the 11 heritage towns and will be hosting a meeting with the Chair of the Delta Conveyance Construction Authority, Kathryn Mallon, who is very sophisticated in her approach. Signs and tees are offered and there will be a No Tunnel booth at the Pear Fair.

b. Discussion/Action: Status/Timeline of Construction Projects on Washington They are trying to finish off the second house and tear down the one on the alley.

c. Discusstion/Action: Cleanup of Courtland: Boardwalk & Morgan's Landing They market seems to be receptive to what the community wants. Code enforcement may apply to Morgan's Landing. A large ball is rolling to address Jim Arnold's property. Sheriff's Deputy Grant Haney was on hand to give additional information.

d. Discussion/Action: Status of Memorial Bricks & Monument Project The new bricks arrived and were installed by John Stump, they were a slightly different size.
