Robert Klitgaard is University Professor at Claremont Graduate University, where he served as President from 2005 to 2009. He was previously Dean of the RAND Graduate School and has taught at Harvard, Yale, the University of KwaZulu-Natal, and the National University of Singapore. His work on corruption, institutional reform, and economic development has taken him to more than forty countries, advising governments and international institutions including the World Bank, the IMF, and the United Nations. His books, translated into eighteen languages, include *Controlling Corruption*, *Tropical Gangsters* (a *New York Times* Book of the Century), *The Culture and Development Manifesto*, and, most recently, *Graduate School, Augmented*. In 2024 he received the Anti-Corruption Excellence Award in Research and Education from the Government of Qatar and the United Nations.
