## NSGC-Approved CEU Activity

### Guidelines for Genetic Counselors to Claim CEU Credits

*The National Society of Genetic Counselors (NSGC) has authorized The George Washington University to offer up to **3.558 CEUs** or **35.58 Category 1 contact hours** for the activity The 18th Philadelphia Prenatal Conference. The American Board of Genetic Counseling (ABGC) will accept CEUs earned at this program for the purposes of genetic counselor recertification.*

# Instructions to Claim NSGC CEU Credits

## Step1: Participate in all the genetic sessions you intend to claim CEUs for.

### In-Person Attendees:

If you are attending the Live Conference in person, you must **check in and check out each day** to receive the appropriate contact hour credit.

### Virtual Attendees:

If you are attending virtually, your participation will be recorded automatically. However, we strongly recommend keeping a personal list of the sessions you attended for your records.

## Step2: Complete the Required NSGC Evaluations and Quizzes

### Live Conference attendees:

Complete the **NSGC CEU Evaluations** for the sessions you attended.

### Enduring Conference attendees:

Complete **both the NSGC CEU Evaluations and the CEU Quizzes** for the sessions you Viewed.

*Note: In order to receive the proper CEU credits, you **must complete the session courses before** accessing the NSGC CEU Evaluation (and the NSGC CEU Quiz, if applicable).*

## Step3: Submit the NSGC CEU Reporting Form

## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

I am a genetic counselor but not an NSGC member. Can I still earn CEUs?

Yes. NSGC membership is not required to earn NSGC-accredited CEUs.

Can I attend non-NSGC accredited sessions offered by the conference?

Yes. You are welcome to attend any conference session. However, CEUs for genetic counselors are available only for sessions that have been approved for NSGC accreditation.

What is the difference between the Live Conference and the Enduring Conference?

CEU Requirements	Complete courses + evaluations	Complete courses + evaluations + quizzes

Can I attend both live and enduring sessions to maximize my CEUs?

Yes. Your CEU record will reflect participation in both the live and enduring components of the conference.

Do I need to record or list which sessions I attended?

No. Attendance is automatically tracked by our platform or through onsite check-in/check-out. However, we recommend keeping a personal record of the sessions you attend for your reference.

What qualifies as a “completed” session?

To be considered complete, you must view at least 90% of the session's total duration.

Can I earn CEUs for sessions that were free?

No. CEUs are not available for sessions attended through a free registration. To be eligible for CEU credit, the applicable registration fee must be paid.
