Henrietta, the eighth of Mother's many secretaries, confronts the notorious Sutton sisters whose teenage antics have driven out every other housekeeper and secretary.

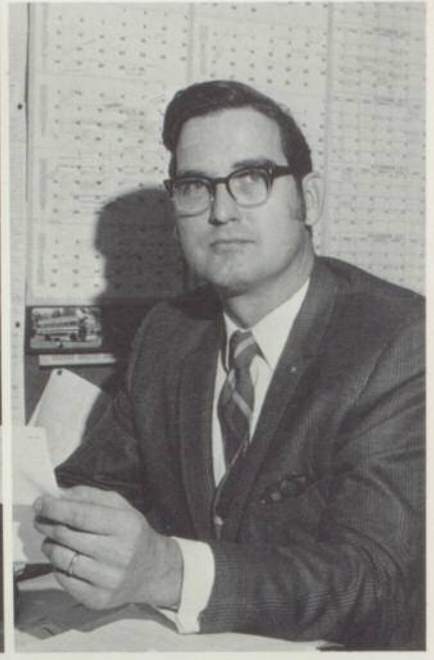
All ends well when Henrietta befriends the girls and helps Mrs. Sutton realize her place is in the home with her family.

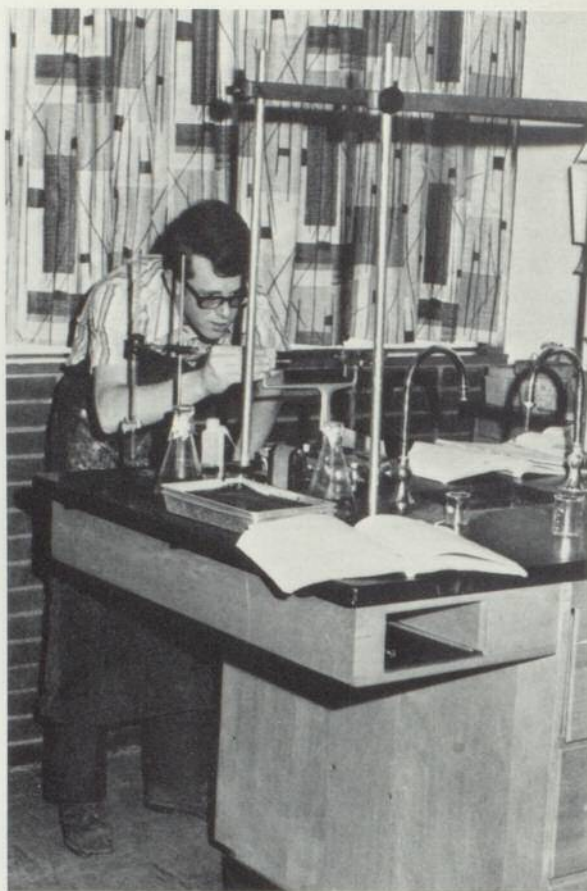

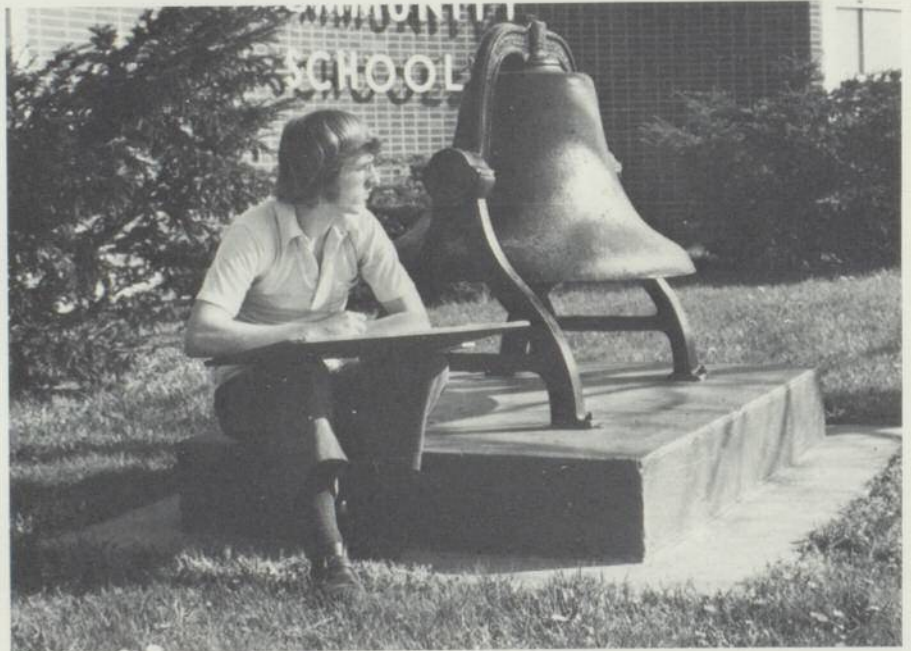

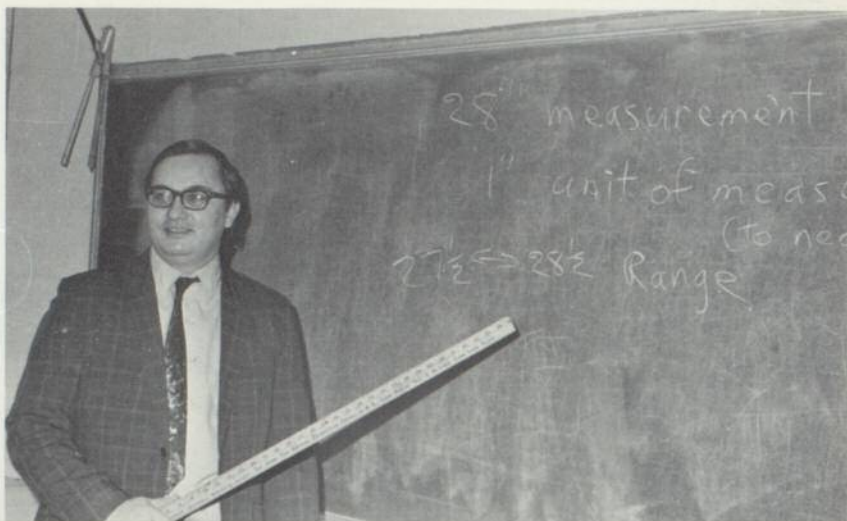

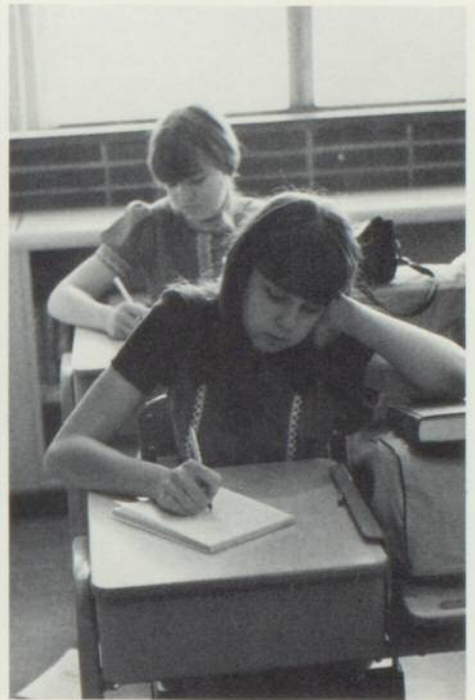
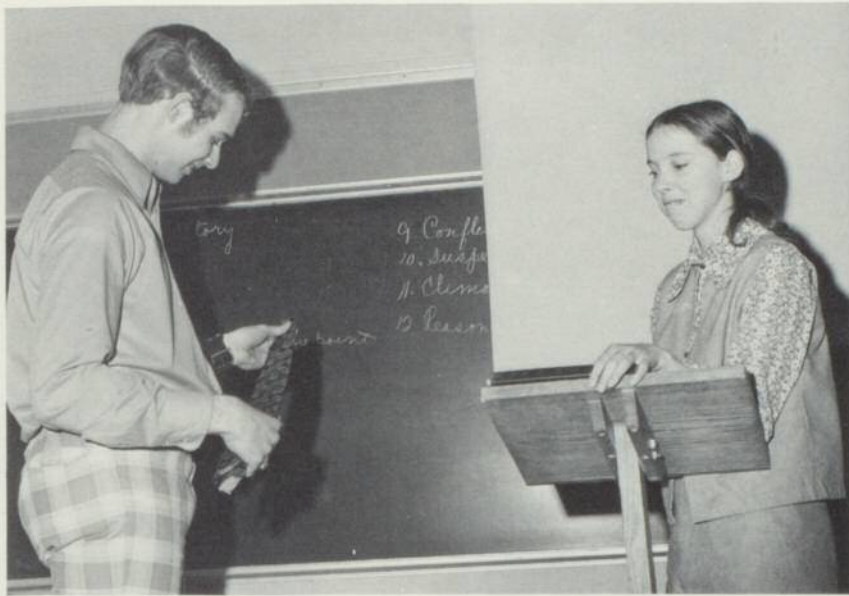

Dragon's Tale Interview: James Wysong

ROWE: Concerning your background, where were you born and raised, and where did you attend school?

WYSONG: I was born in Plymouth, and I attended, at that time, Lincoln High School. I received my A.B. from De Pauw University with a major in political science, and I qualified for a comprehensive social science area teaching certificate. I received my M.S. two years later from Indiana University: I qualified for both administrative and guidance and counseling licenses.

ROW: When did you decide to enter the teaching profession?

WYSONG: Originally, I planned to attend law school, but lack of funds induced me to explore teaching as a career temporarily. I enjoyed education, and decided to earn a master's degree in the field.

ROW: You've lived in Plymouth most of your life: do you prefer the small town environment?

WYSONG: Not to the exclusion of larger communities necessarily. I thoroughly enjoy the small town with reasonable access to the cultural activities of cities of size.

ROW: What recent changes in education, good or bad, would you care to comment on?

WYSONG: The courts have forced a number of modifications of the

educational process as regards the student and his guarantees in the 14th Amendment. This has been somewhat good in as much as students, too, are now citizens according to recent court interpretations. It has been bad to the extent that schools have seen authority eroded that some feel was well-placed and a cornerstone of the educational process.

ROW: Does your guidance department have about the same job as one in a larger school?

WYSONG: I think so. Larger schools will have basically the same job to perform in a bigger way. Perhaps they will have more and more diverse problems with which to deal, but this might be offset somewhat by more personnel and a more specialized division of labor.

ROW: Did you have any difficulty in planning students' schedules last year?

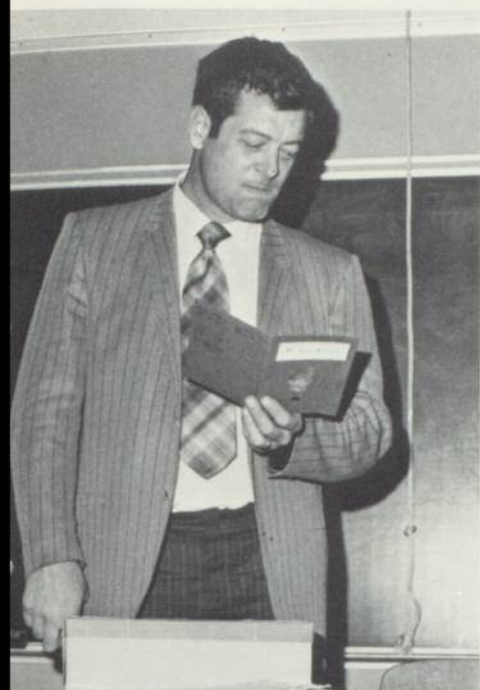
WYSONG: My particular responsibilities in this area deal with utilizing the current schedule of classes to see how the desires of next year's juniors and seniors will fit the current pattern. I then relate this information to the administration who determine apparent class sizes, schedule adjustments, and staff needs. As concerns the mapping of the master schedule, this has been a cooperative endeavor with the

principal primarily responsible for ultimate refinement. The final step involves the resolution of conflicts and the posting of individual schedules. There were probably no more problems encountered than were expected.

ROW: Are there any things you would like to see changed at our school?

WYSONG: Many individuals would like to see their "pets" modified, upgraded added, or deleted: I am no exception. I might mention one of my favorite "pets". As regards the junior-senior prom, I would like to see the banquet go by the wayside and see the sophomore class conduct the prom. The banquet rushes an already crowded evening and adds little in the way of fulfillment. The juniors are thinking about dates, hairdos, and tuxedos when there is much to do in finalizing decorations. The clean-up falls on three juniors who are just as lacking in sleep as the sixty who didn't show. Let the juniors conduct concessions, and then turn a budget over to the sophomores for underwriting the prom. After all, what class activities do the sophomores have? Worth at least one try? I think so.

ROW: The prom is well steeped in tradition. Do you think it will be continued?

WYSONG: Yes, I do; however, I can see some merit in taking it out of the school to sidestep the distraction and to thwart any trend toward "over-decoration".

ROWE: Do you plan to remain in teaching or do you see law or another field as a possibility?

WYSONG: I thoroughly enjoy teaching and Argos students, but I would not want to rule out several other possibilities.

ROWE: Do you believe Argos to have advantages or disadvantages regarding other schools with which you are familiar?

WYSONG: I think the Argos system has both, but I believe the former outweigh the latter. We may be somewhat sheltered and not initially exposed to change, but why be in the vanguard if the change is liberal or, as is oft time the case, radical? By the time we must come to grips with such "changes", many times they've been refined and/or we're prepared for them.

We have a rather homogeneous group of students with, basically, rural orientation and with kindred hopes and aspirations. Our students are not just so many social security numbers, but real individuals in whom we are most interested.

ROWE: What do you consider the most rewarding part of teaching?

WYSONG: Satisfaction derived has

to be most rewarding, and the source may vary. To the coach, a "winning combination"; to the play director, a successful performance; to the classroom teacher, observing students learning and enjoying the experience.

ROWE: With renewed emphasis upon career guidance and education, do you think a vocational high school is imminent in Marshall County?

WYSONG: It might be, I believe I prefer in terms of distance, scheduling, and the important cost factor a modified approach. Let all or a few high schools develop or enrich existing vocational programs - be they horticulture, aero-space, welding or whatever. On a pro-rated basis, open these programs to other students from participating high schools. This approach might prove more practical, and offer a greater variety of career-orientated programs, than some form of area technical high school.

ROWE: What are mini-courses?

WYSONG: Mini-courses are a new fad whereby students, for a week or several weeks, explore interest areas such as knitting, culinary arts, scuba diving, chess, bridge, crewel work, ETC. These courses, usually geared to student desire, provide learning situations considered foreign to the traditional

school curriculum, but nonetheless important to living the "good life". I suspect their origins might follow the lead of the new trimester college program. Experience seems to be on the plus side to date, and it may well be permanently in the relatively near future.

ROWE: Finally, Mr. Wysong, do you support change as such?

WYSONG: Simply for the sake of change, no I don't. As somewhat of a traditionalist, I'm not opposed to re-evaluating original aims and objectives in light of today's needs. If the change has obvious potential merit, I'm willing to give it a go.

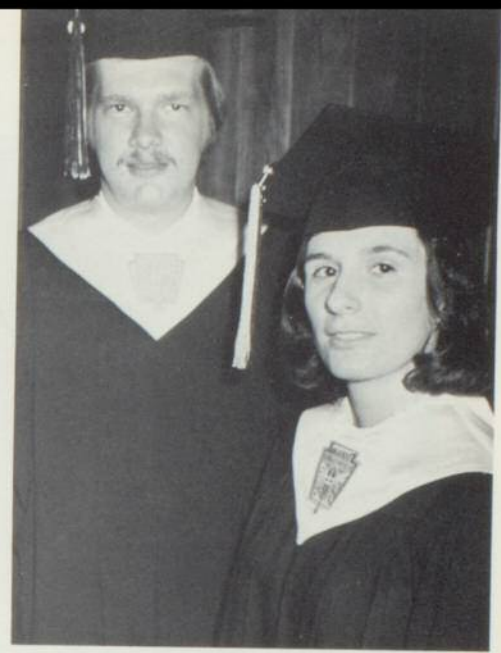
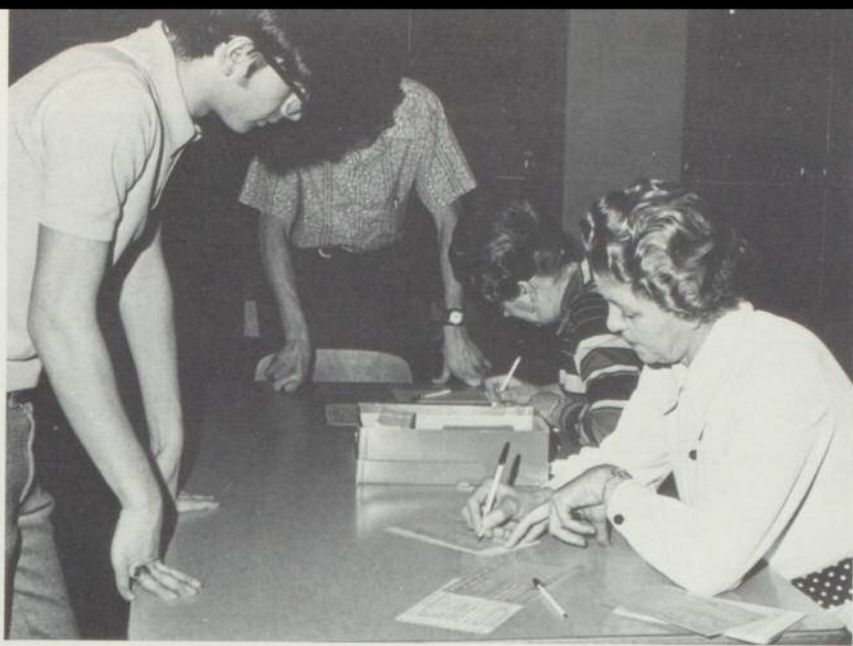

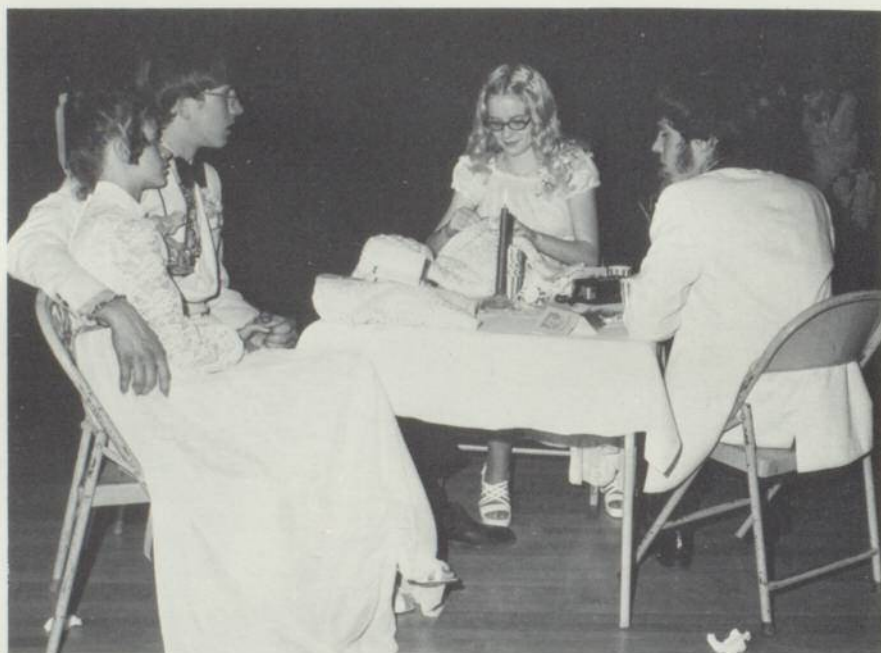

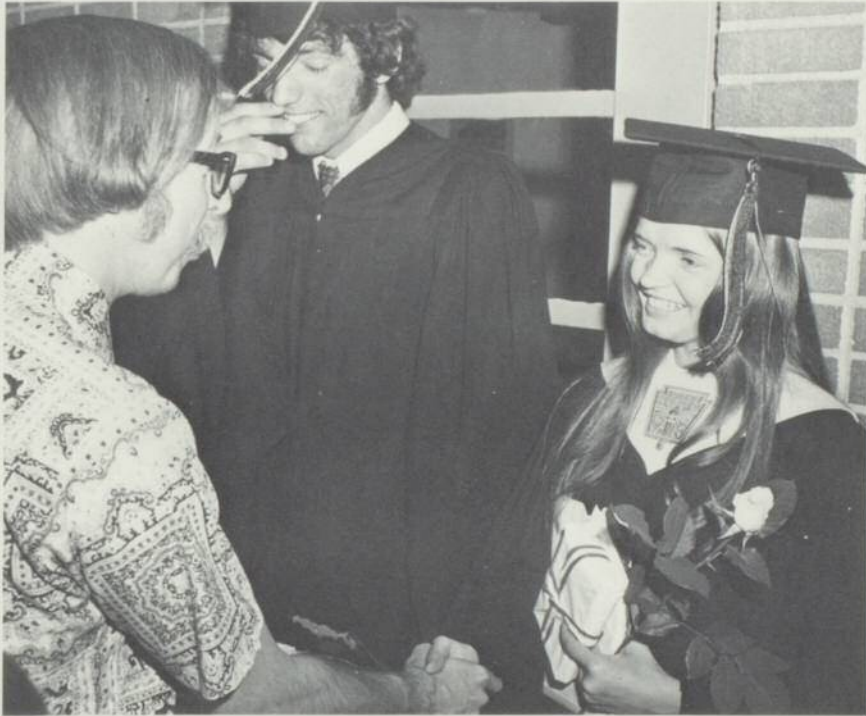

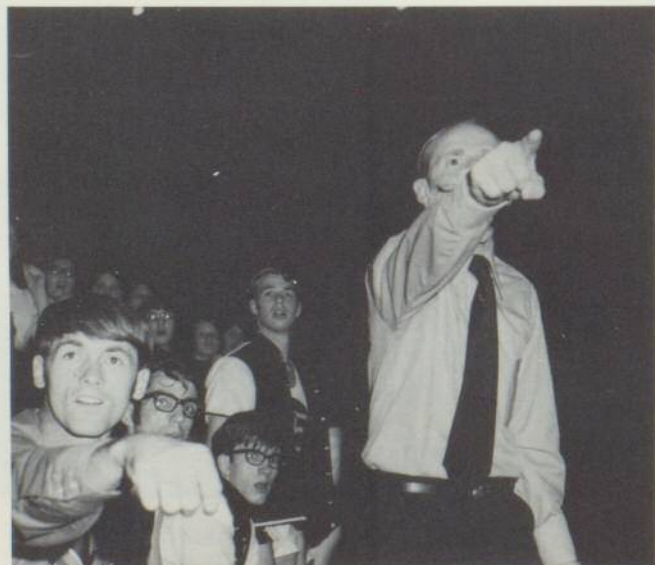

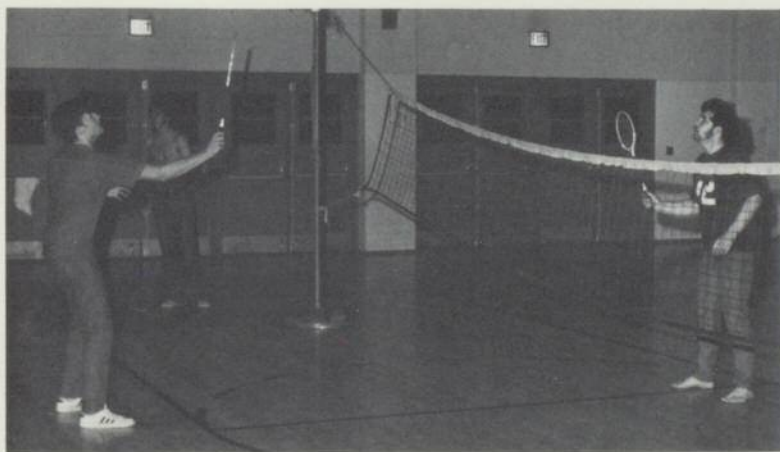

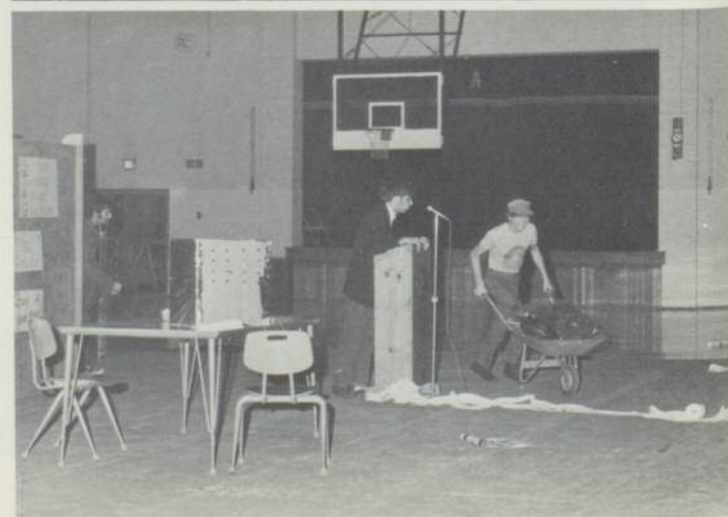
