Cindy Nifong and Larry Houin (3) are posing to have their pictures taken. Bob Keb and his date Cindy are enjoying the refreshments. (4).





Freshmen find that being in physical education classes is a way of life. The requirements for both boys and girls can be strenuous such as in gymnastics.



SPANISH, SPEECH, AND ENGLISH










