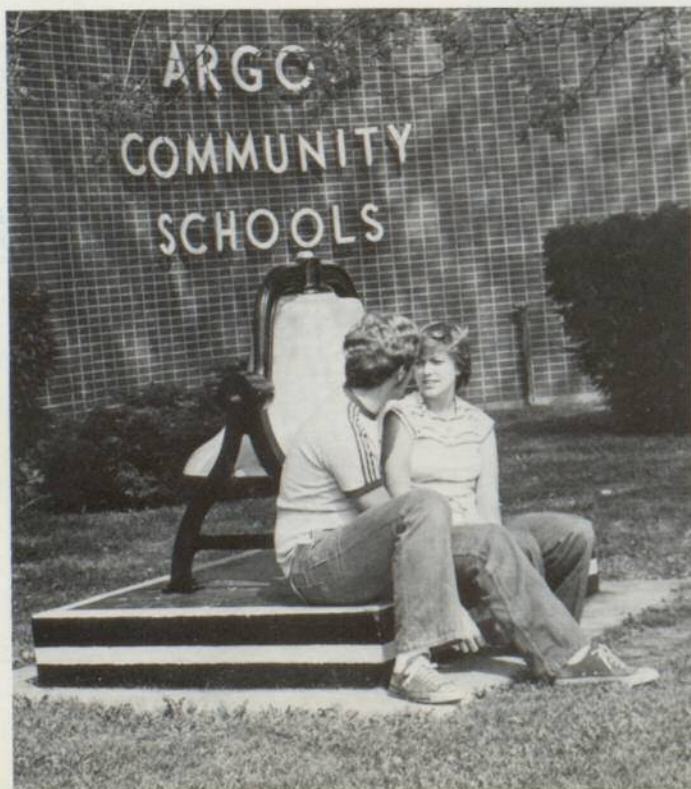

## *We Have Our Advantages*



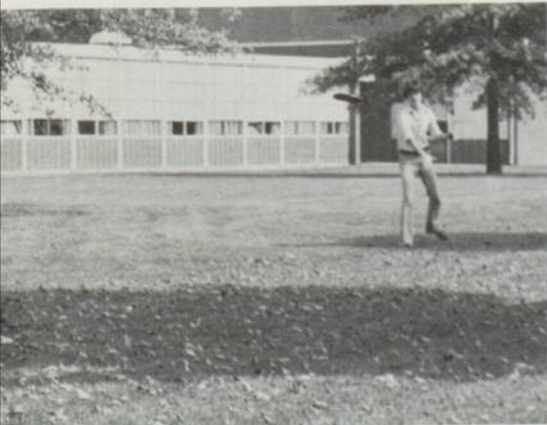
Many people believe that going to a small school is a disadvantage. Let's take a look at the **ADVANTAGES** of going to the Argos Community Schools.

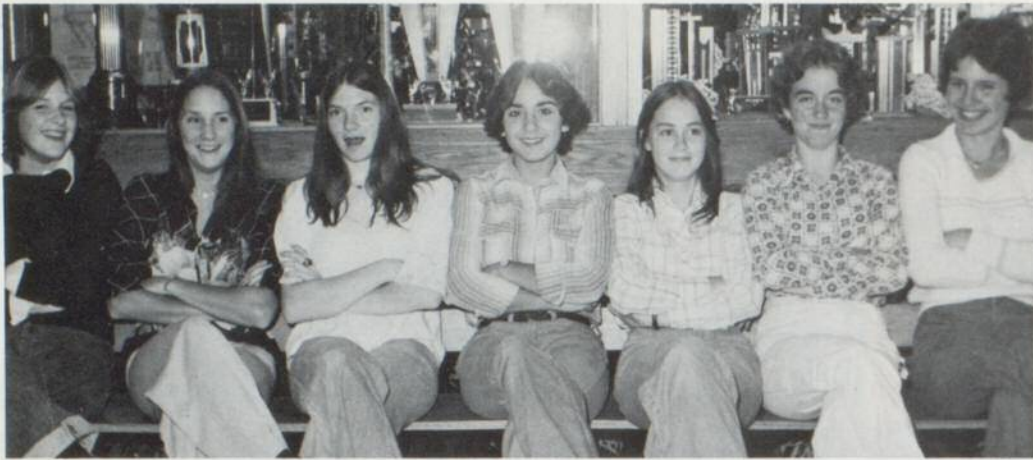
With 60 to 80 students in each grade, students usually know everyone in their grade. They also know students from other grades. This smallness brings about lasting relationships, school unity, and spirit.

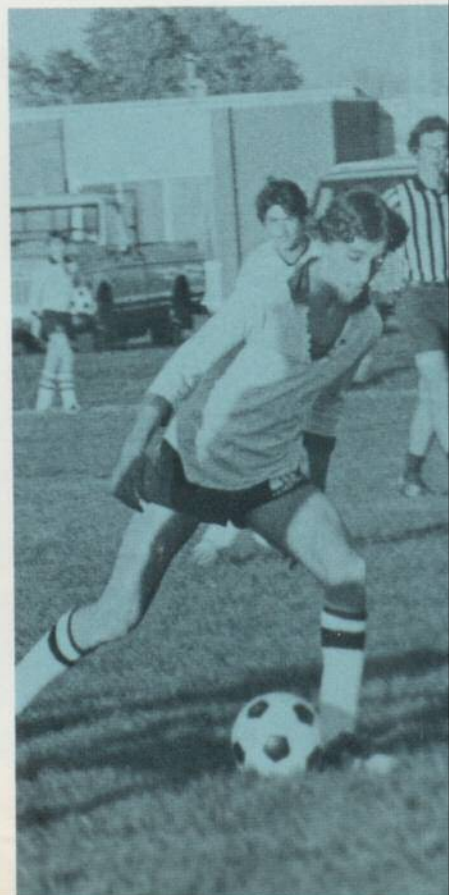

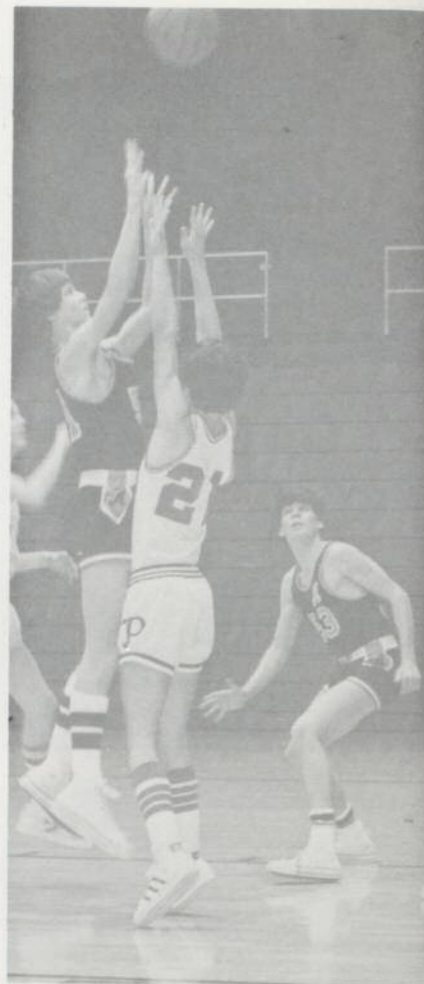

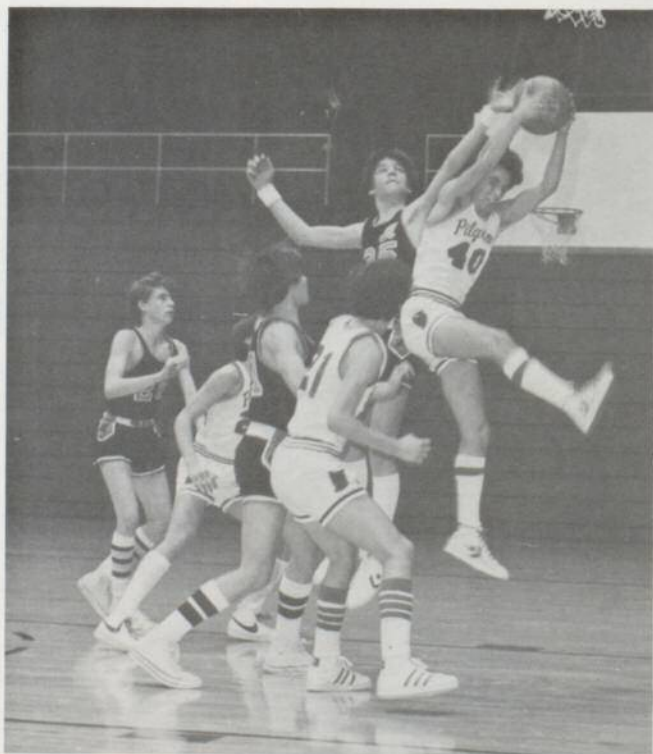

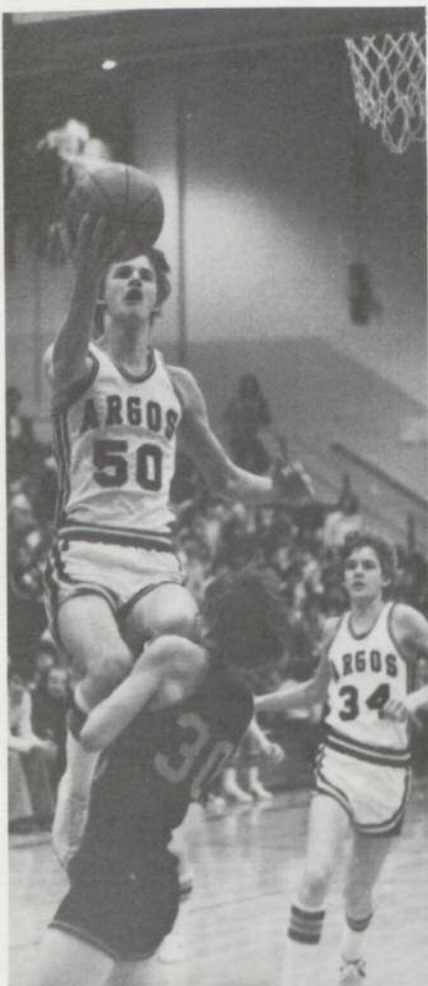

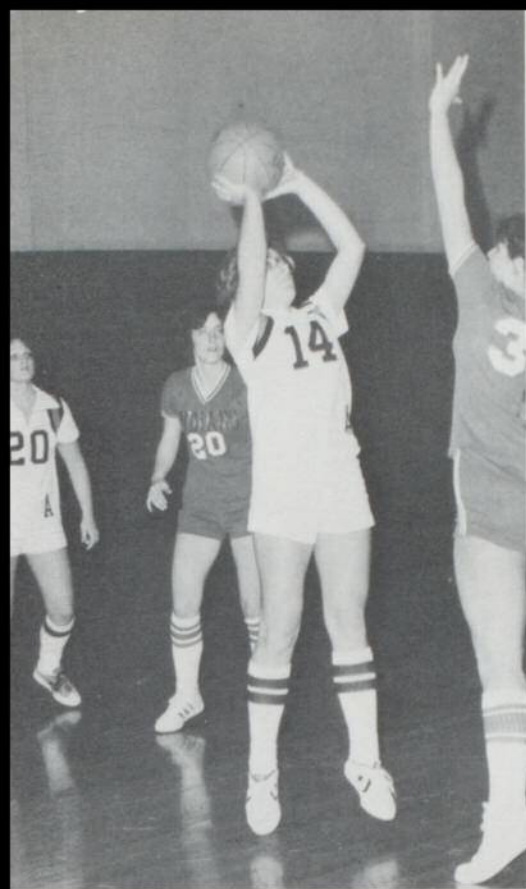

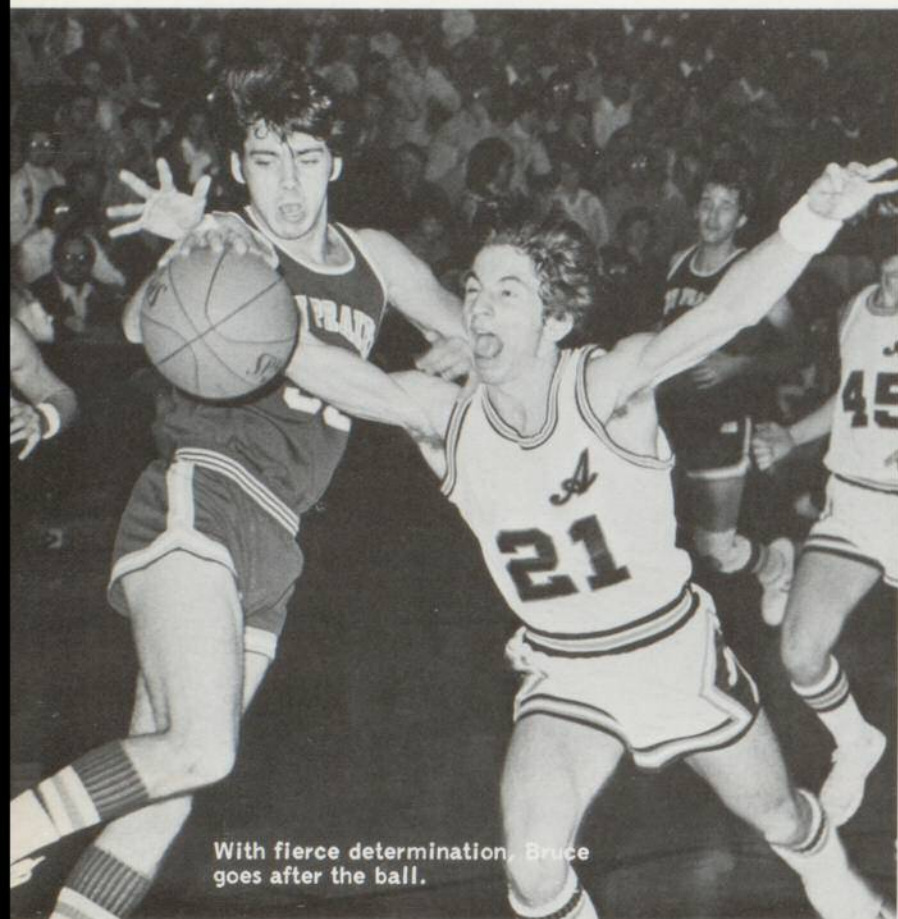

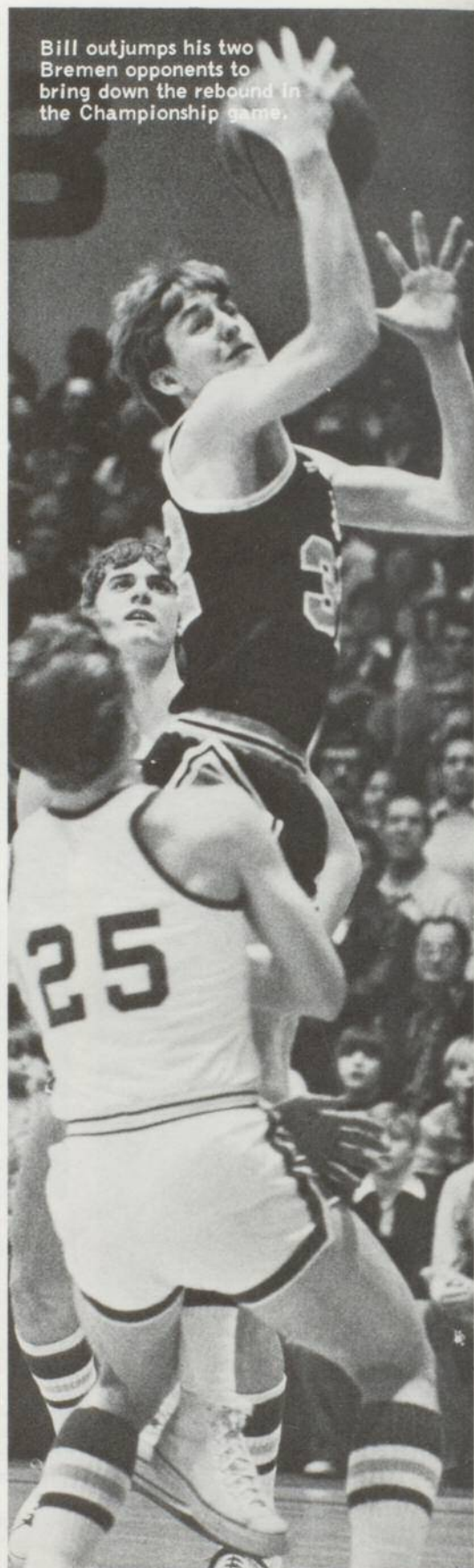

At the beginning of the season, little did we know that our win over Kewanna was to begin one of the most exciting seasons in the history of Argos.

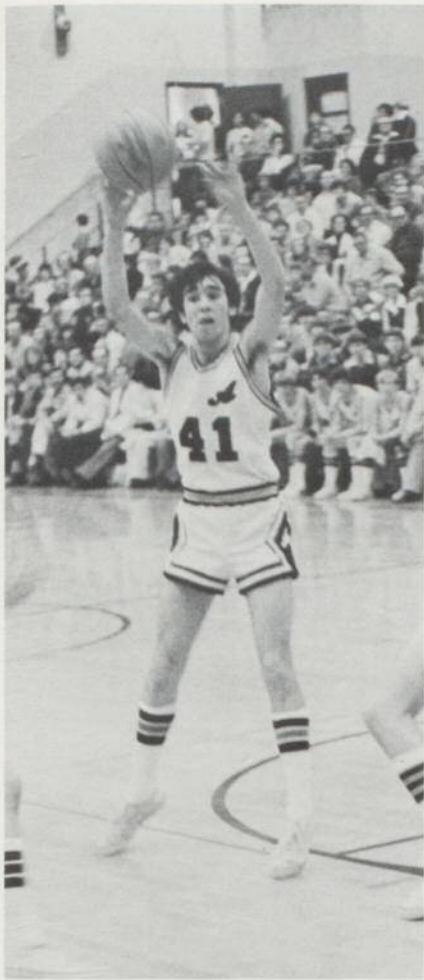

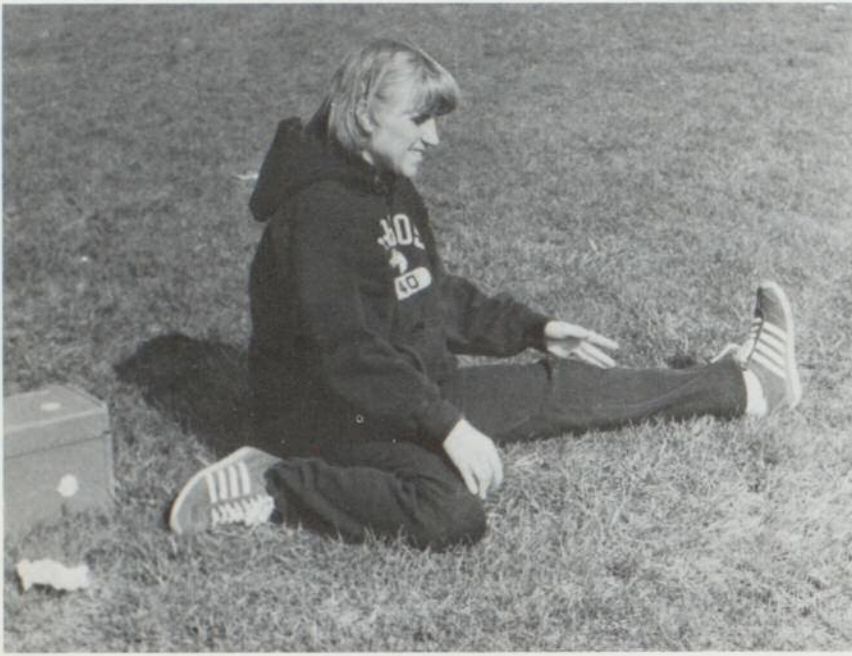

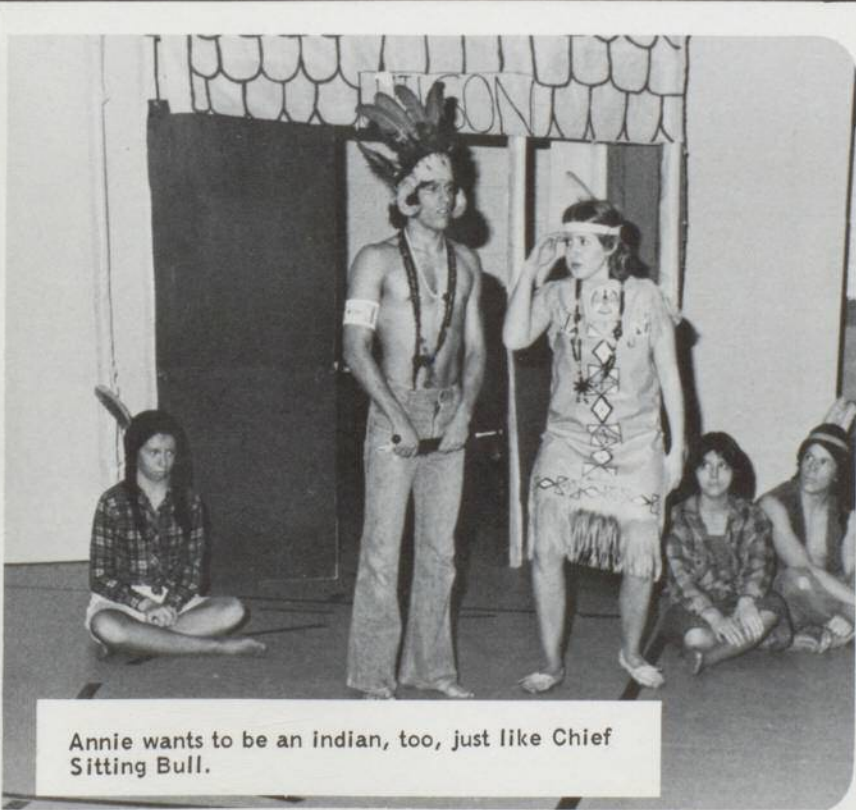

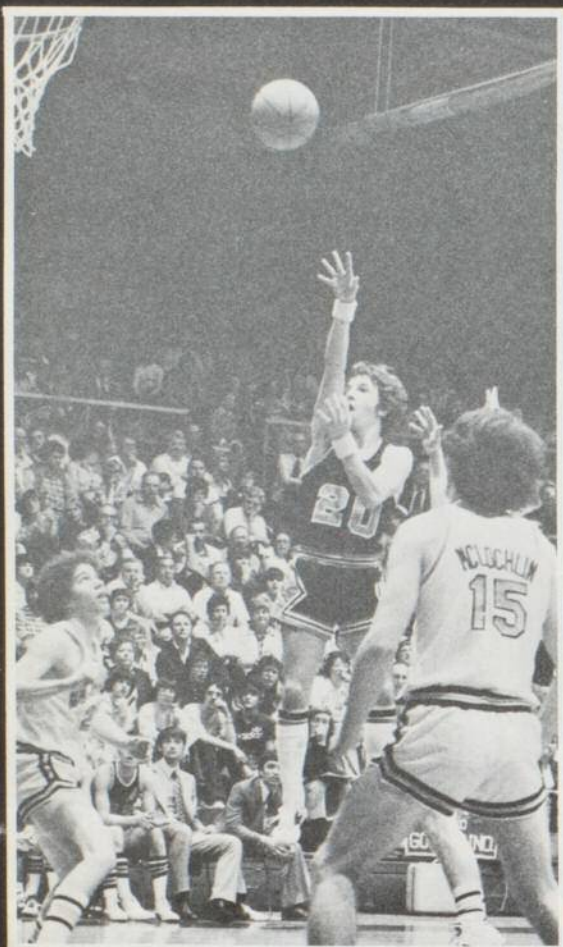

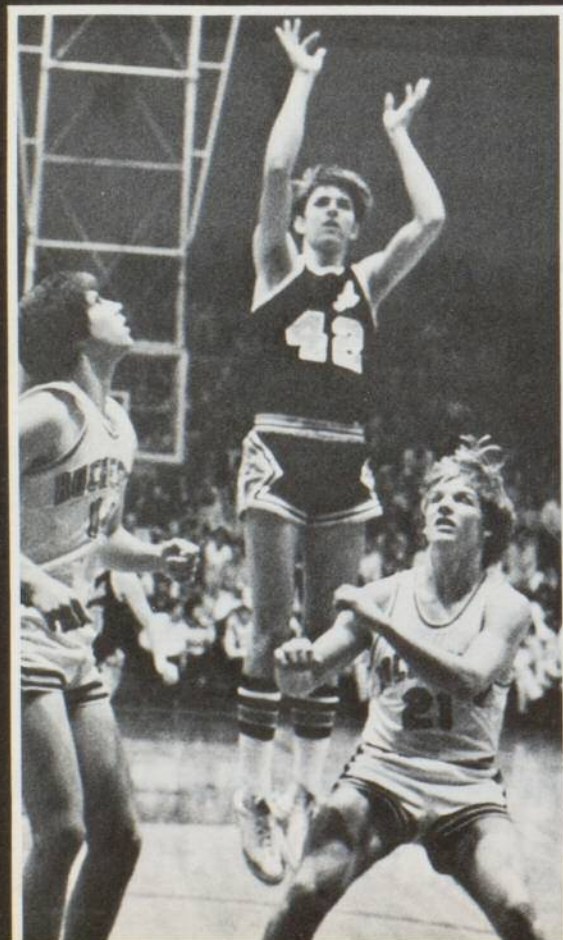

Due to the energy shortage, the Regional was delayed four weeks with only one scheduled game being played which was Argos against LaSalle at the A.C.C.

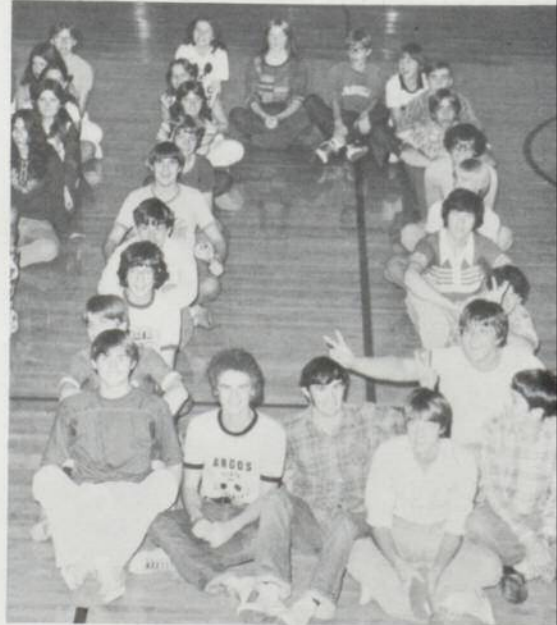

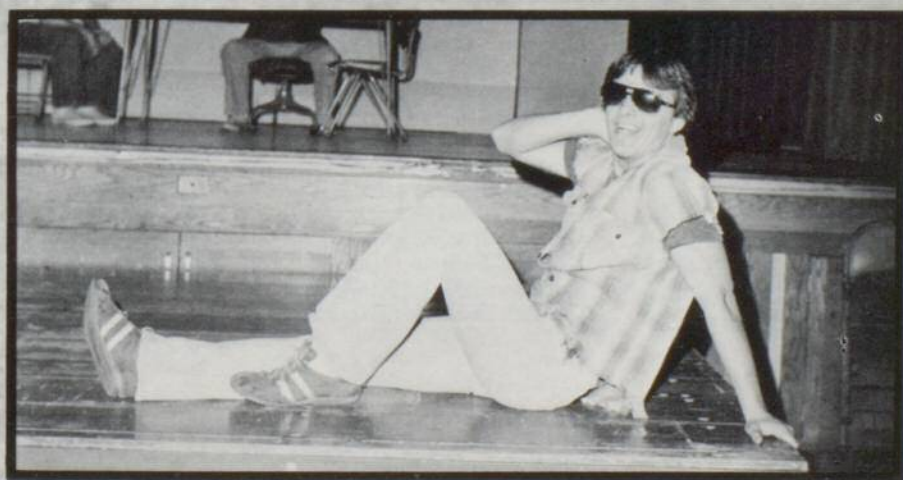


# ARGOS COMMUNITY
