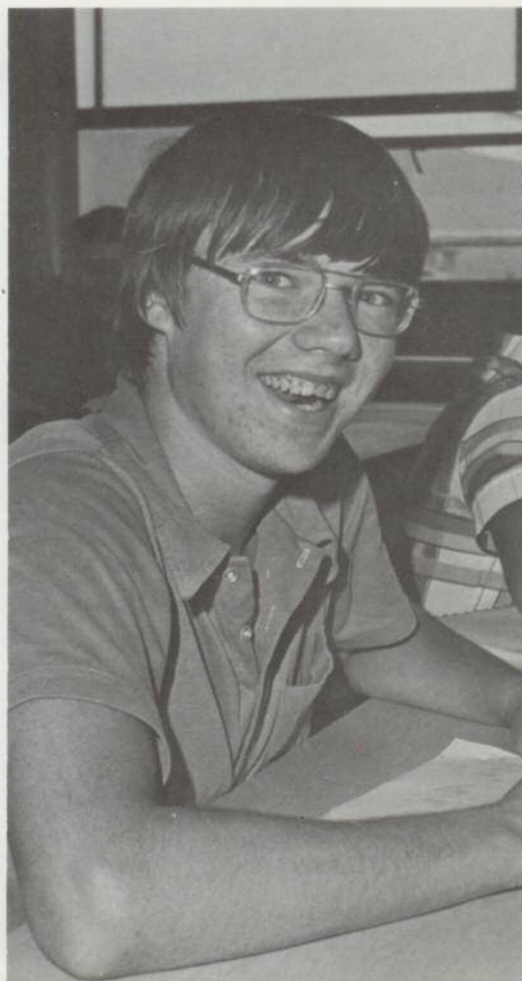

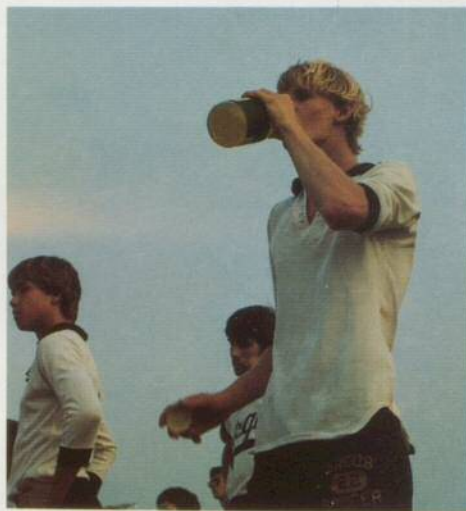

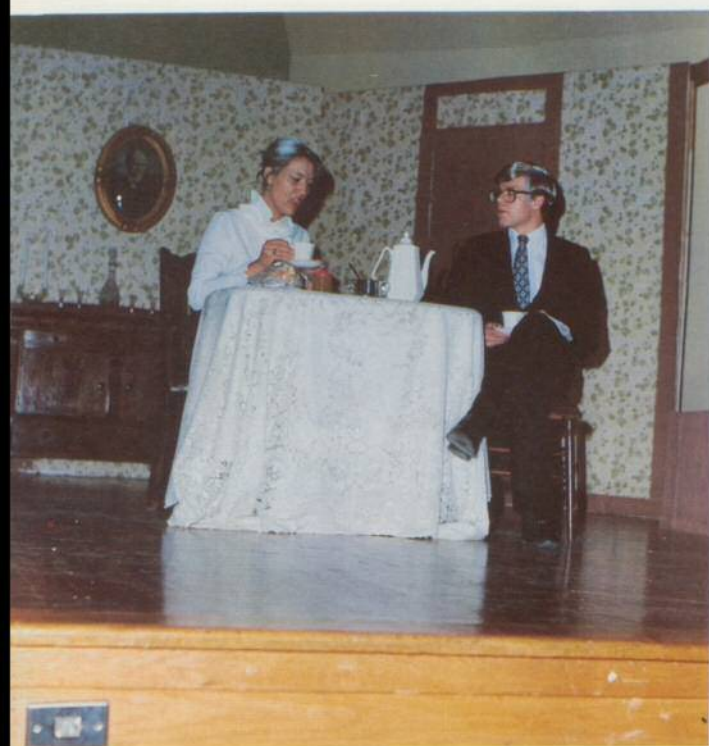

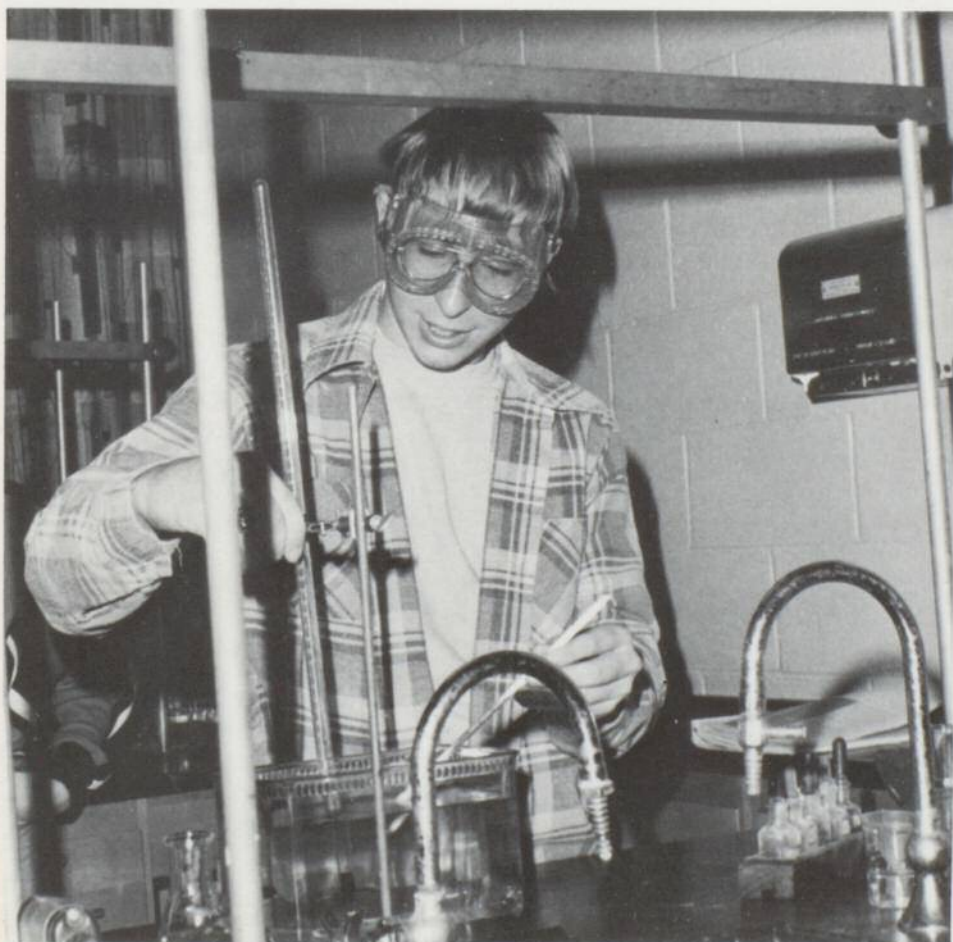




Math, History, And Science Are Mystifying And Challenging

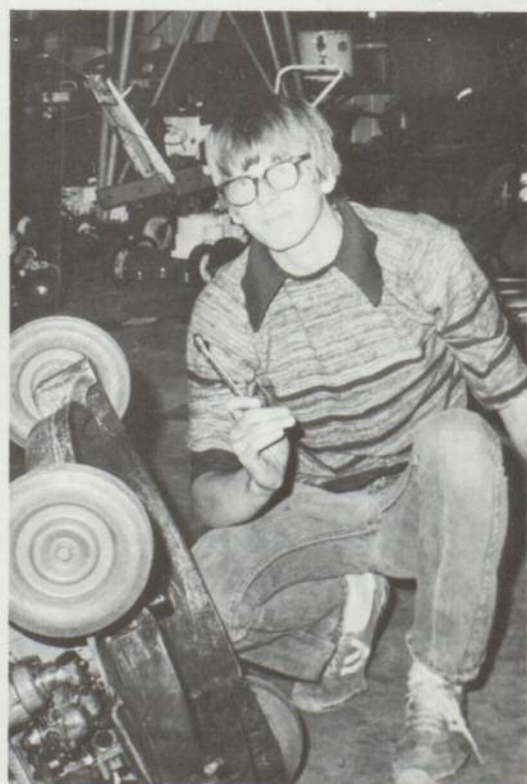


Upper Right — Brent McCay uses the valve grinder in Small Engines.

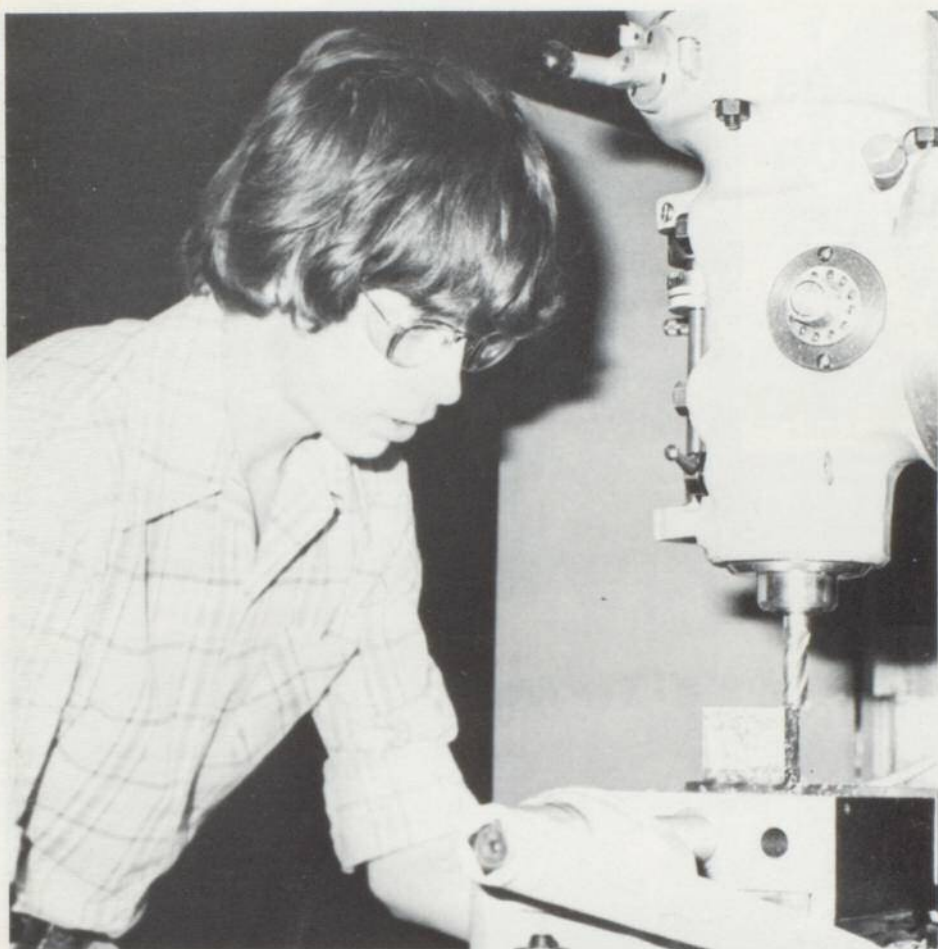

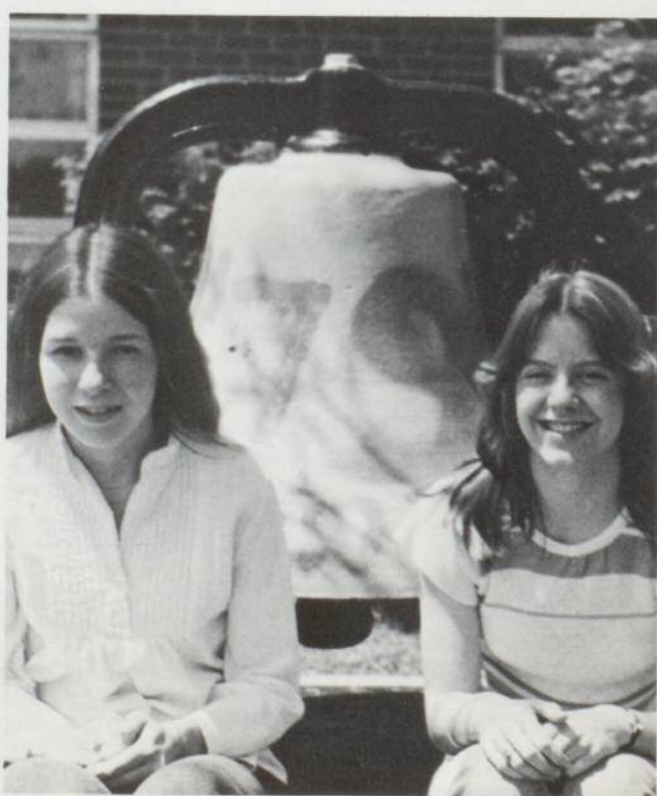

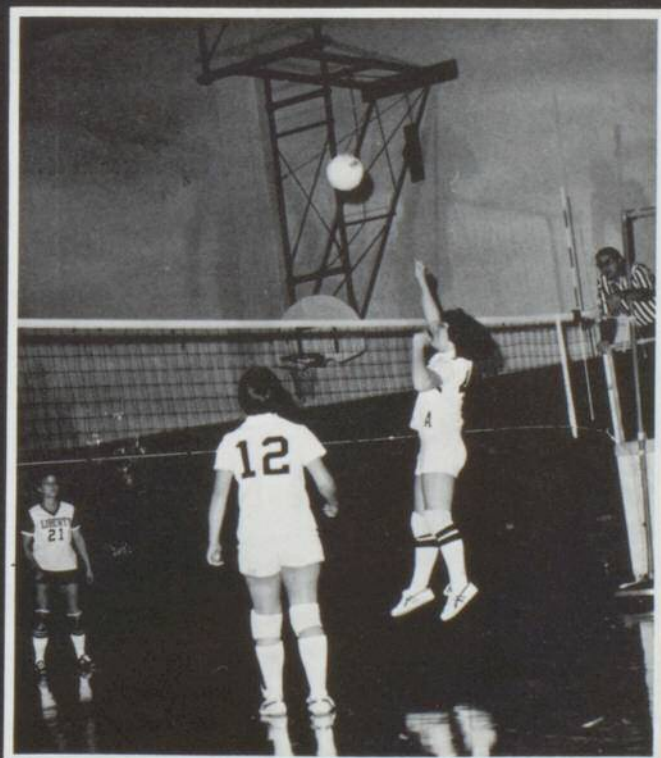

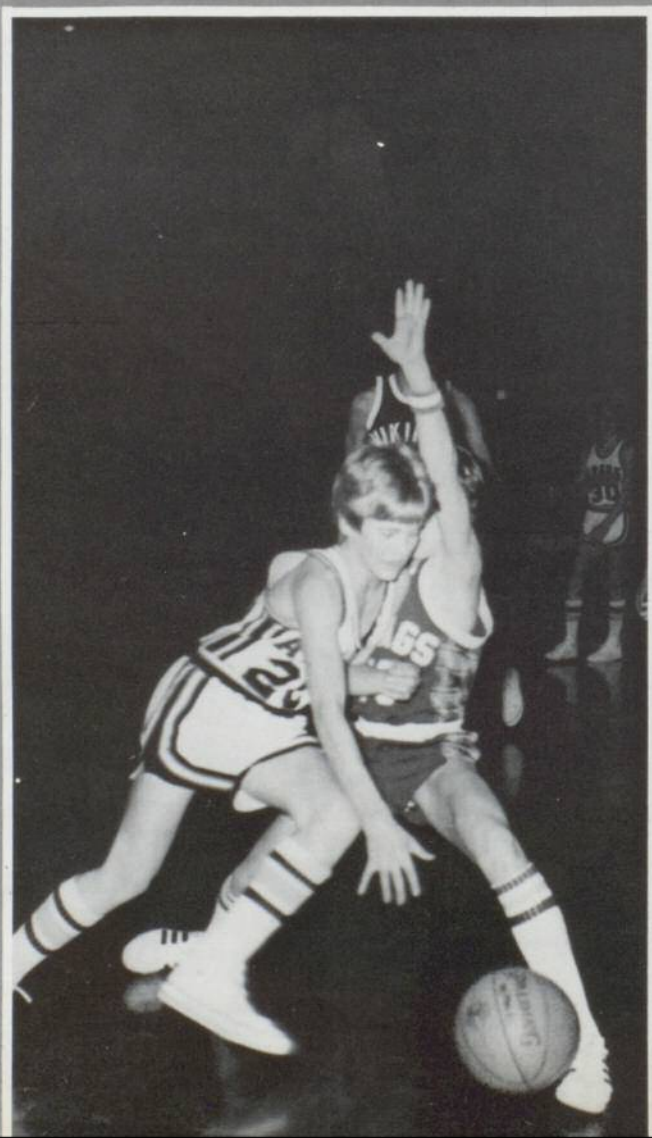

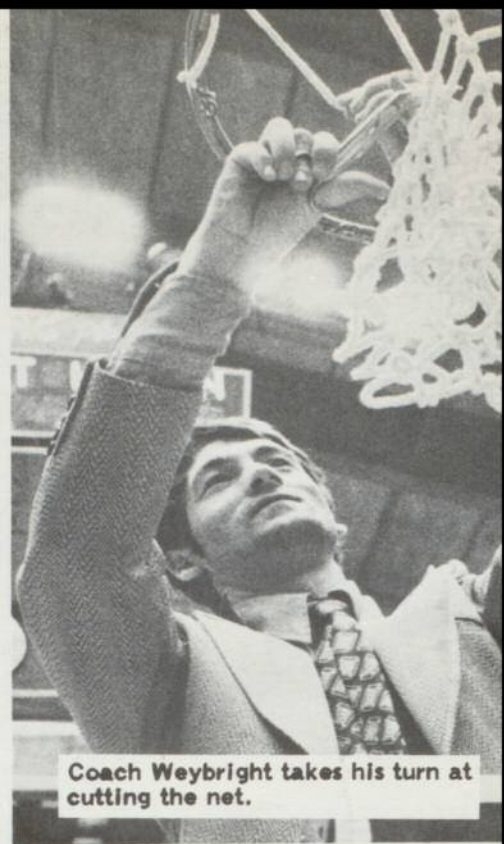

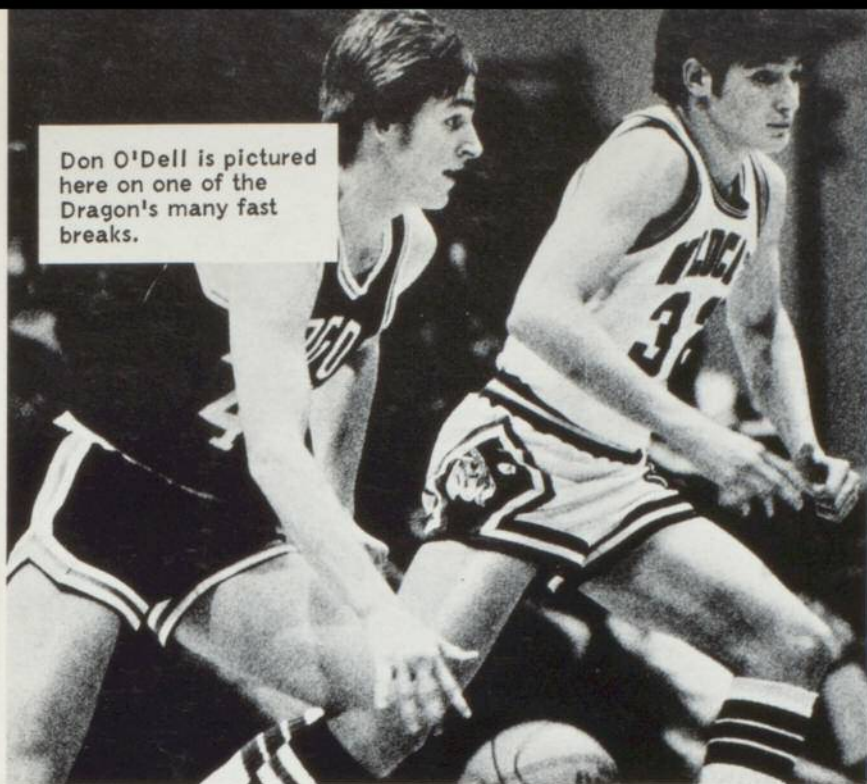

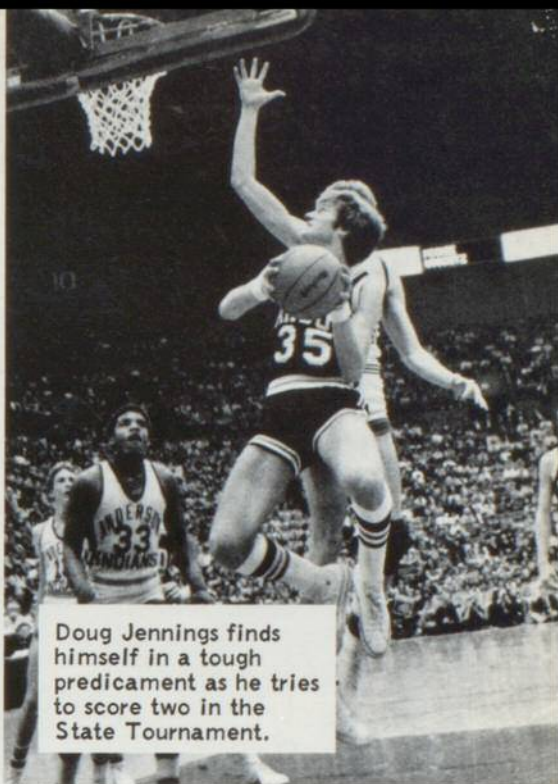

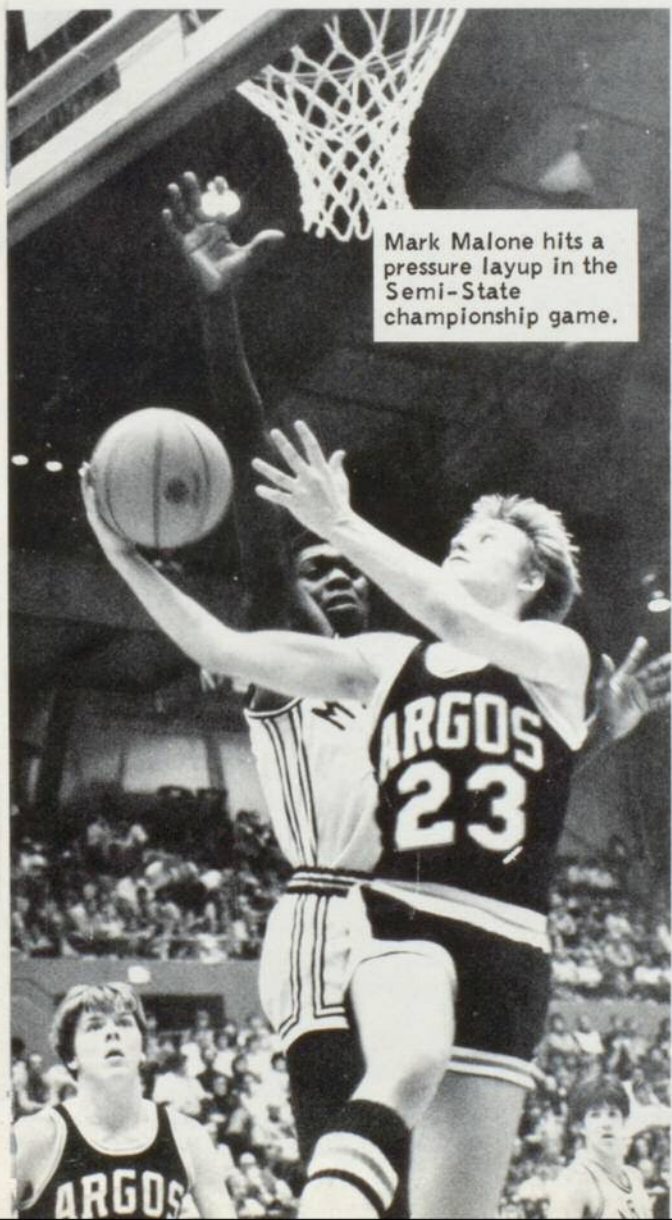

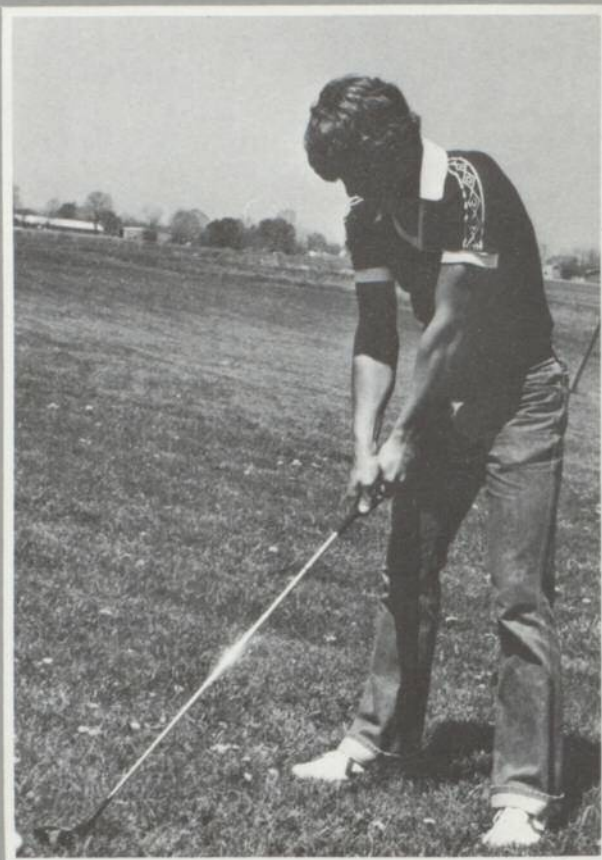

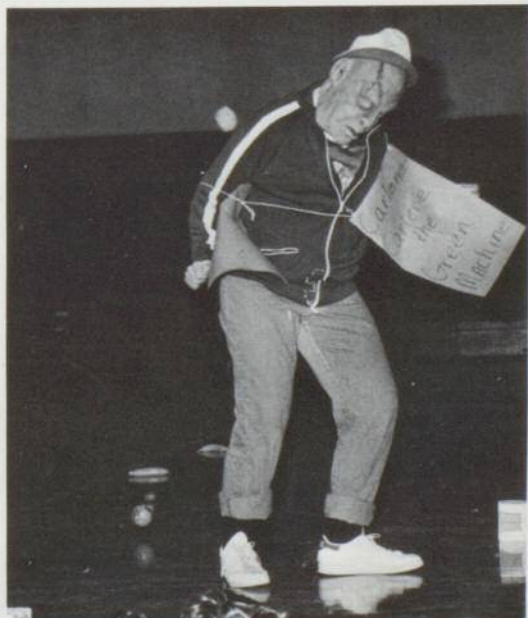

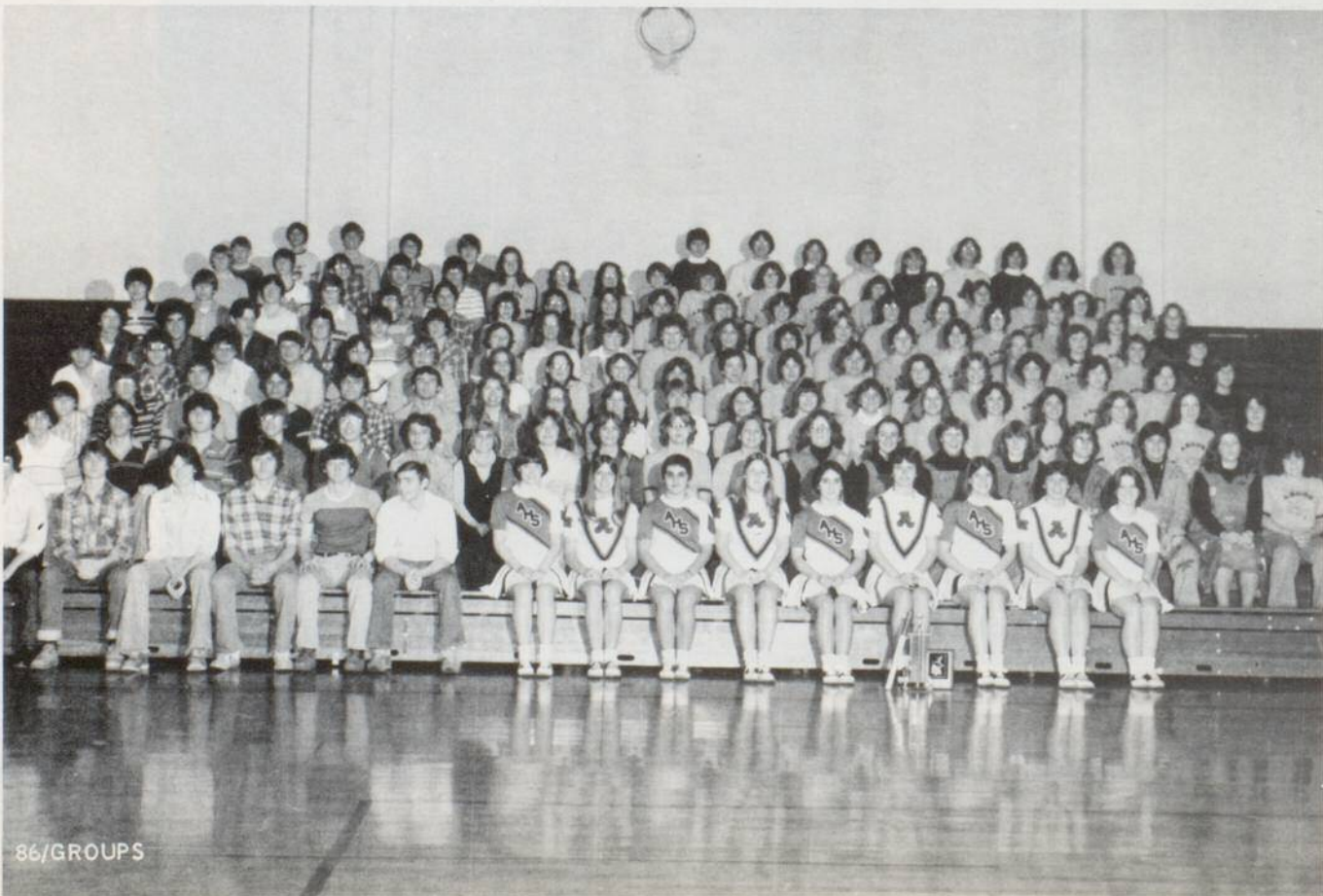

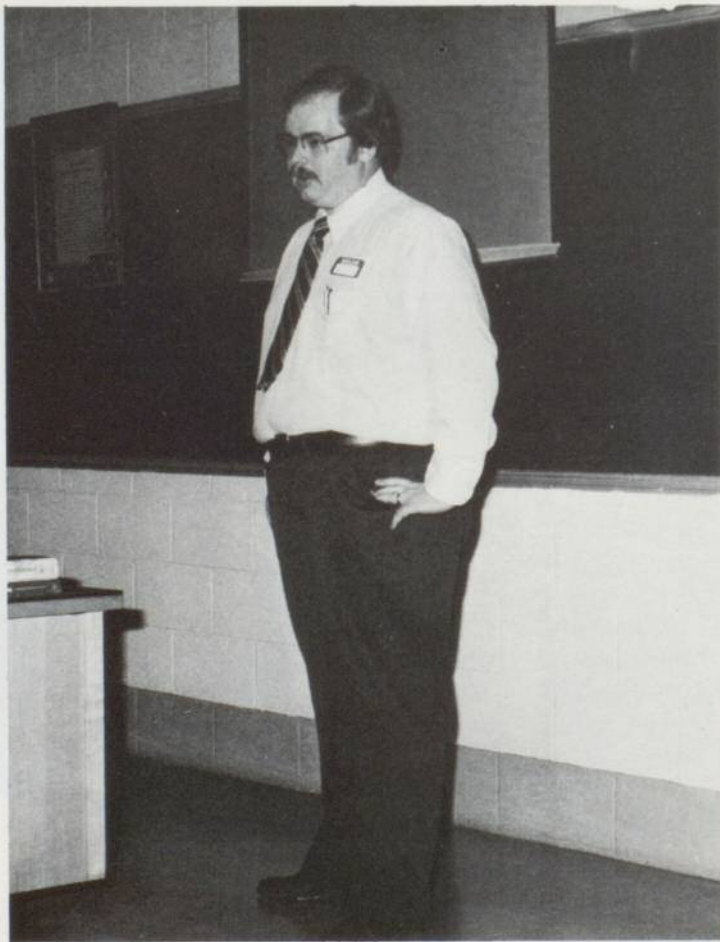
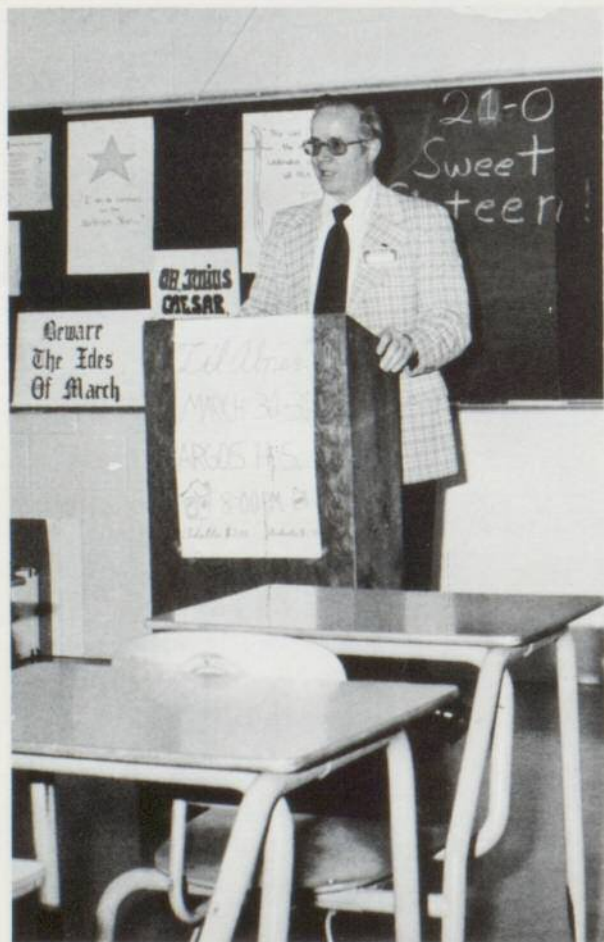
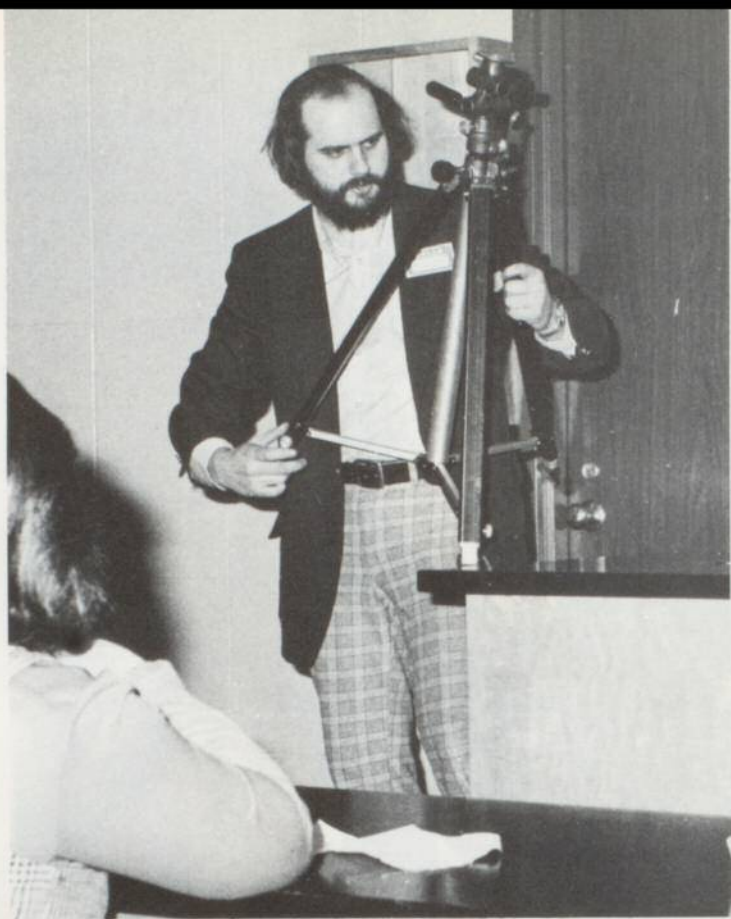
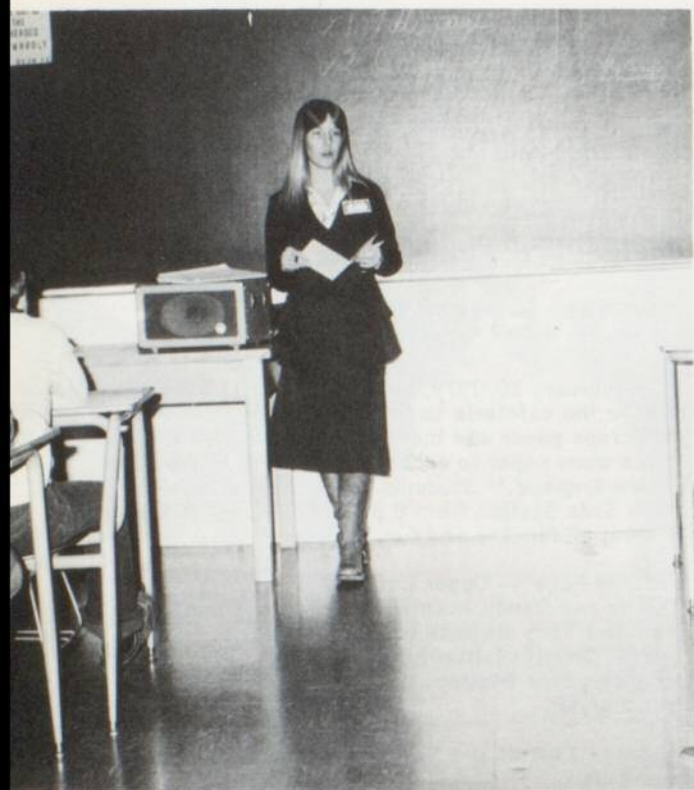
Weekend In New England

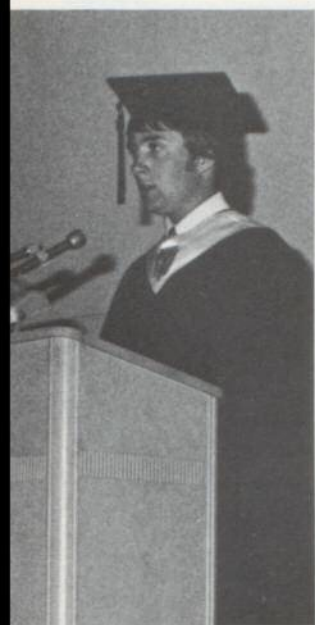
