## DAVE ZENTZ: PRACTICE ... IT WILL BE WORTH IT!

Playing music has been a big part of Dave Zentz's life. He has received much recognition in this area:

**HOW LONG HAS MUSIC BEEN A PART OF YOUR LIFE?** Music has been a part of my life for as long as I can remember. I can remember my mom singing songs to me when I was little. Also, I remember banging on the piano and wishing I could make music come out of it.

**YOU PLAY MANY INSTRUMENTS. WHAT ARE THEY AND HOW LONG HAVE YOU PLAYED THEM?** I have played the following instruments: Piano-since I was six years old. (11 years); Organ-four years; Trombone-three years in Elem. and Jr. High Band; Tuba-one year in high school band; Baritone-three years in high school band.

**DO YOU FEEL MUSIC IS A GIFT YOU MUST BUILD, A TALENT, OR SOMETHING ANYONE CAN DO OR LEARN?** I consider my musical ability a God-given talent that I have a responsibility to develop to its fullest potential. Most people can learn music, but unless they really enjoy it, it doesn't do them a lot of good.

**HAVE YOU WON ANY AWARDS OR CONTESTS?** 1979-Most Improved Bandsman; Received several First and Second Place awards at Solo and Ensemble Contests; Participated in Tri-County Honor's Band-last three years, (1st chair); Member of Hoosier Boy's State Band. Office held: Librarian of Band-Soph. and Jun. years; Vice-President of band-Senior year; President of Choir-Senior year.

**YOU WERE VERY ACTIVE IN BAND THESE PAST YEARS, AND DOWN AT THE STATE FAIR CONTEST YOU WERE NOMINATED FOR THE McDONALD AWARD. WHAT WENT THROUGH YOUR MIND WHEN YOU HEARD YOUR NAME ON THE ANNOUNCEMENT?** When my name was called as a Finalist for the McDon-

ald's Golden Note Award, the first thing that went through my mind was total disbelief. There were several girls around me screaming, which added to the excitement! After I had regained my composure, I felt a sense of accomplishment as I made my way to the Grandstand. It was an unforgettable experience that I feel privileged to have among my memories of high school.

**EXPLAIN WHAT MUSIC HAS DONE FOR YOU-WHY YOU LIKE IT.** Music has become one of the most important parts of my life. It has given me an added dimension, that many people don't have, by providing another way to express myself and my feelings. I've found many advantages in music, too. It has opened up doors for scholarships and also provided a good "ice-breaker" for starting conversations with strangers. I like music because it gives me freedom ... freedom to express myself.

**DO YOU PLAN TO ARRANGE YOUR CAREER GOALS AROUND MUSIC?** I am planning on attending Baptist Bible College, Clarks Summit, PA, to study for a Ministry of Music and, possibly, a teaching career in music.

**DO YOU PLAN TO PLAY IN THE BAND AND SING IN THE CHOIR WHILE YOU ARE IN COLLEGE?** I am hoping to get involved in some traveling ensembles at college, but right now I don't know if I'll be playing, singing, or accompanying. (Maybe all three!)

**WHAT ADVICE DO YOU HAVE FOR FUTURE INSTRUMENTALISTS AND VOCALISTS?** The best advice I can give aspiring instrumentalists and vocalists can be said in one word: PRACTICE!!! Don't wait until you "find the time"-you never will! Take the time to practice; it will be worth it!

**ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:** As I said before, I consider my musical ability a God-given talent. My hope is that whenever I play or sing that **He** will get the glory!

## RHONDA OVERMYER — BARBARA MANDRELL'S NUMBER ONE FAN

bara Mandrell's Fan Club, Stella Parton's Fan Club, Dolly Parton's Fan Club, and Tammy Wynette's Fan Club. I used to belong to Loretta Lynn's Fan Club, but my membership ran out in September, 1980, and I did not renew it.

**WHY DID YOU BECOME A BARBARA MANDRELL FAN?** Barbara Mandrell devotes a lot of her time to the people (the fans) who have put her on the top. After each show, Barbara goes back to her bus, freshens up, changes into something a little more casual than her stage clothes, and then goes back to the stage to autograph and pose for pictures. Everyone who wants an autograph gets one. I've been to many of Barbara's concerts where she's stayed into the morning signing autographs. When I saw her in St. Charles, Illinois, on July 25, 1980, my Aunt Kay and I stayed until Barb's bus left at 1:45 a.m. That night, or rather morning, Barbara finally got done signing autographs at 1:30 a.m. One thing Barbara told me that really impressed me was, "The fans are really where it's at, so as long as I'm able, I'm going to spend as much time with them as possible." Barbara Mandrell is very sincere and down-to-earth. There's nothing artificial about her. That's why she's Number One with me and obviously with so many other people.

**DO YOU HAVE ANY ADVICE FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE MUSIC FANS?** I don't have any advice for those people stuck on Rock or Country. Everyone has their own preference as to what kind of music they listen to. Who am I to advise someone on what kind of music they should or shouldn't listen to? **DO ANY COUNTRY MUSIC SINGERS KNOW THAT YOU ARE A FAN?** The only singer I've met who remembers me and knows me by name is Barbara Mandrell. This is another example of her ever-present concern for her fans.

**ARE YOU GOING INTO SOME PHASE OF COUNTRY MUSIC IN YOUR CAREER?** Right now, it is more of a hobby; but hopefully, I will be able to develop it into my desired career of being a disc jockey.

Rhonda Overmyer is truly a Country Music Fan. She often writes "Barbara Mandrell is Number 1!" on the papers she hands in to her teachers. She has attended many Country Music Concerts and belongs to several fan clubs. Her coats are covered with Country Music buttons; her tape and record collections of Country Music are extensive. And she reads every issue of several Country Music magazines. We interviewed Rhonda about her interest:

**HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN A COUNTRY MUSIC FAN?** I've been exposed to Country Music all of my life. I've only listened to it approximately 13 years.

**WHY DO YOU PREFER COUNTRY MUSIC OVER ROCK MUSIC?** The fact that Country artists still take time out after a concert to meet and talk to the people who have made them "stars" accounts for part of the preference. I do like some rock, but the majority of it is too loud for me. And half the time I can't understand the words to the rock songs. I just relate to Country better than any other type of music. I guess Country Music is just in my blood!

**WHO ARE YOUR FAVORITE MALE AND FEMALE VOCALISTS?** I don't have a favorite male singer. It's a three-way tie between Kenny Rogers, Conway Twitty, and Ronnie Milsap. My favorite female singer is the lovely and multi-talented Barbara Mandrell, of course! Dave and Sugar is one of my favorite groups.

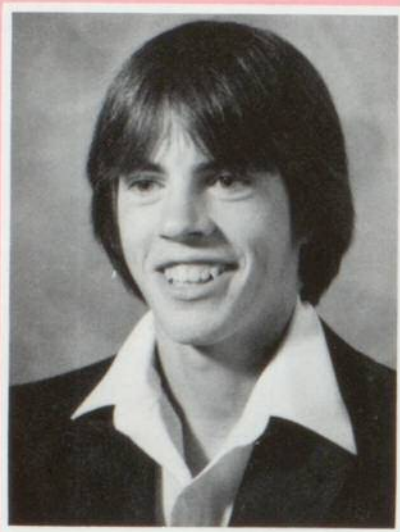
**WHO ARE SOME OF THE COUNTRY STARS YOU HAVE MET?** These are some of the artists I've met and have also gotten their autographs: Dolly Parton, Crystal Gayle, Loretta Lynn, Mel Tillis, Hank Williams, Jr., Tanya Tucker, Barbara Mandrell, Louise Mandrell, Mickey Gilley, Billy "Crash" Craddock, Jerry Reed, and T.G. Sheppard.

**HAVE YOU EVER BEEN TO THE GRAND OLE' OPRY?** Yes, I went to the Grand Ole' Opry in August of 1978. It wasn't everything I had anticipated, but I loved it anyway. Getting to go to the Opryhouse was definitely a dream come true for me.

**DO YOU BELONG TO ANY FAN CLUBS?** Yes, I belong to Bar-

**HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN TEACHING SPECIAL EDUCATION?** Four years.

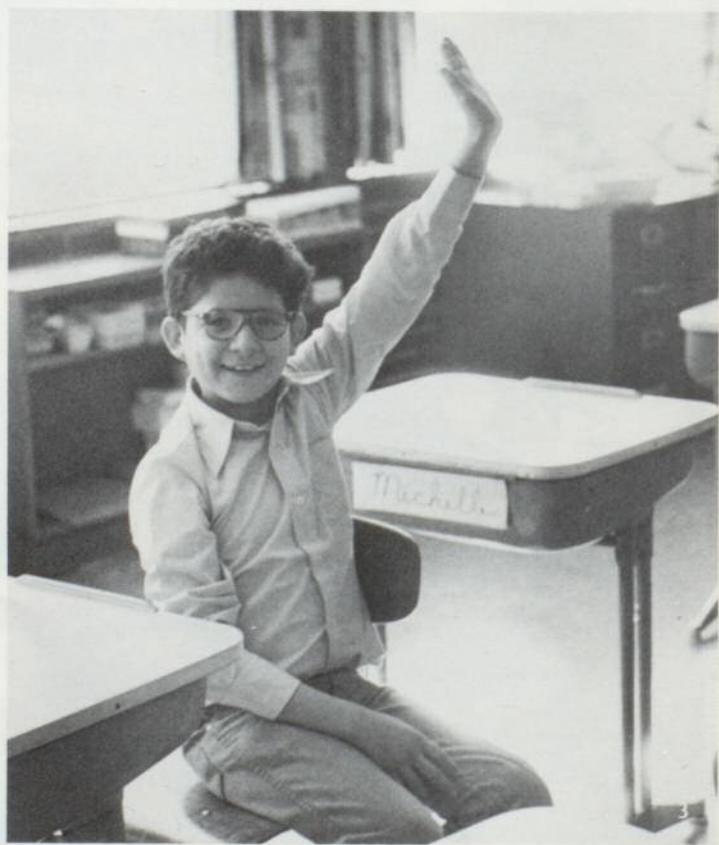
**WHERE DID YOU GO TO COLLEGE?** Indiana University in South Bend.

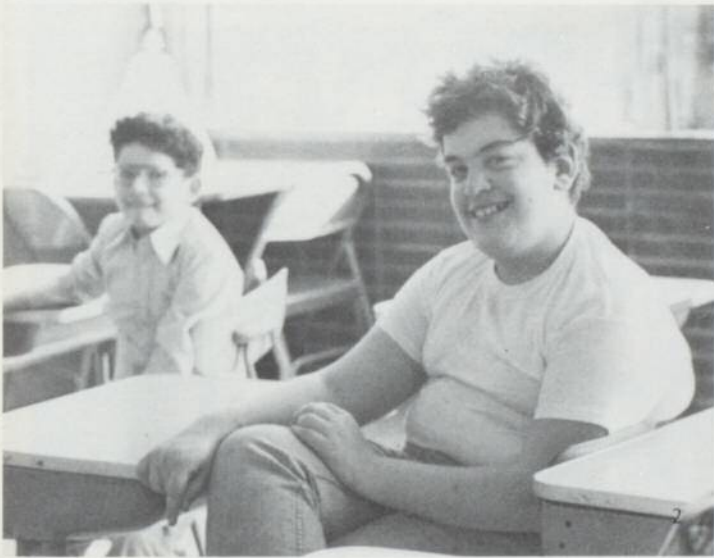

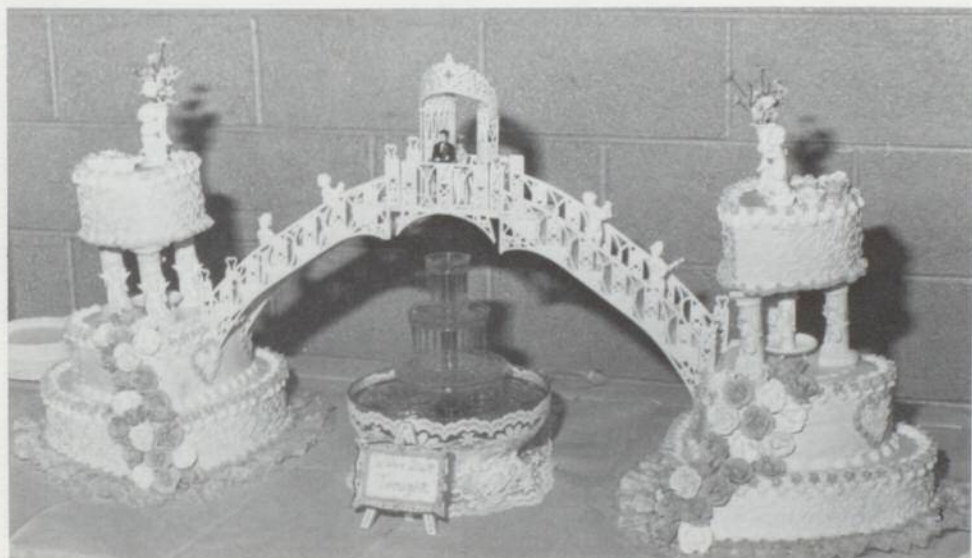

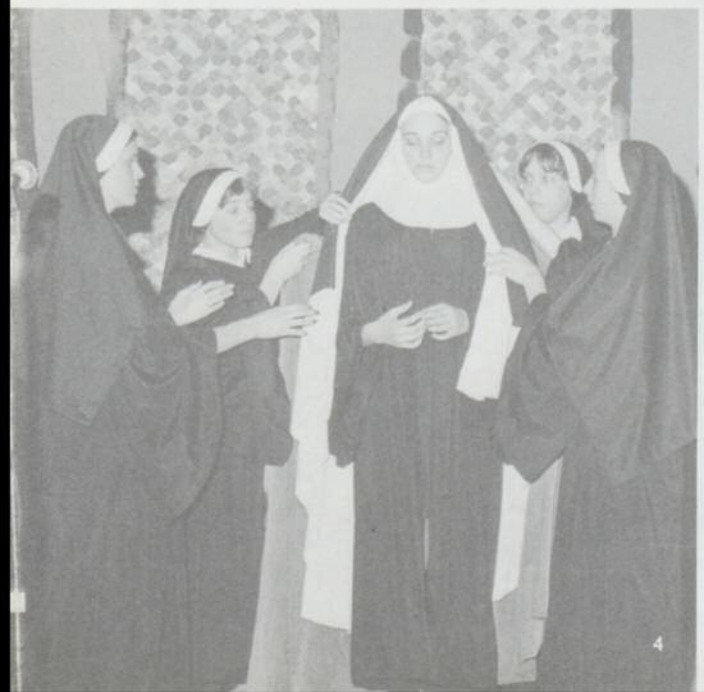

## AN INTERVIEW WITH MISS MARY JACKSON, AHS CAREER CONSULTANT

**DEFINE CAREER EDUCATION.** Career education is helping people to know what they want to do with their lives, what will make them happy and satisfied, giving them some knowledge of the world of work, then having the use of this information to select a career which will benefit society.

**HOW IS CAREER EDUCATION FUNDED AT ARGOS COMMUNITY SCHOOLS?** Partly local and partly federal grants which are administered by the Indiana State Department of Public Instruction.

**HOW DO YOU APPLY FOR THIS MONEY? WHAT SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS DOES OUR SCHOOL HAVE TO MEET TO GET THIS MONEY?** The original grant was written by Mr. Keith. It was submitted to the DPI who judged in competition with others

from different school corporations. The only qualification was a demonstrated need for such a program.

**WHAT ARE SOME OF THE PROJECTS INDIVIDUAL TEACHERS HAVE DONE FOR CAREER EDUCATION?** Projects include guest speakers, field trips, bulletin boards, job shadowing, interviewing, research projects, dissemination of information, role-playing, and career exploration.

**EXPLAIN JOB SHADOWING.** Students are released from school for a half day and spend this time following an employee as he goes through his daily work.

**DESCRIBE YOUR CAREER INFORMATION CENTER IN YOUR LIBRARY.** Originally it was geared for only junior-senior high school students. The very first grant was used to purchase software, and books were pulled from the regular collection and pooled to form the Career Information Center. Subsequently, an Elementary Career Center has been established in the elementary library.

**DESCRIBE SOME OF THE SOFTWARE THAT HAS BEEN PURCHASED WITH THE CAREER MONEY.** Some of this is used to test interests, skills, attitudes, and abilities. Some of it is career information as related to particular subject areas, such as language arts, mathematics, etc. The remainder provides information on a variety of careers.

**DID YOU HAVE TO HAVE ANY SPECIAL TRAINING TO BE IN CHARGE OF CAREER EDUCATION AT ARGOS? TELL ABOUT THE WORKSHOPS YOU HAVE ATTENDED.** No, I've attended a week-long workshop last summer and several one-and two-day seminars. I've also done extensive reading in the area.

**HOW HAS CAREER EDUCATION BEEN RECEIVED BY THE FACULTY?** With mixed emotions-favorably in that career education makes subject matter teaching relevant but does require additional preparation.

**HOW HAS CAREER EDUCATION PROJECTS BEEN RECEIVED BY THE STUDENTS?** Elementary students have received it enthusiastically. High school students have been exposed to duplicated assignments which have been a waste of time. However, students are beginning to recognize that they're going to have to start preparing for and thinking about their futures.

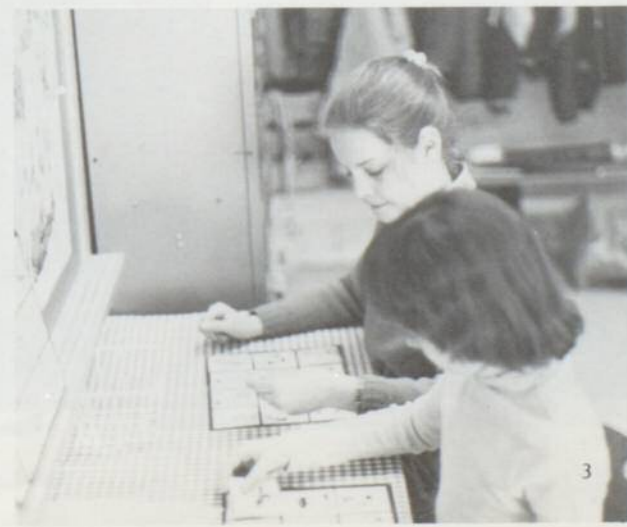
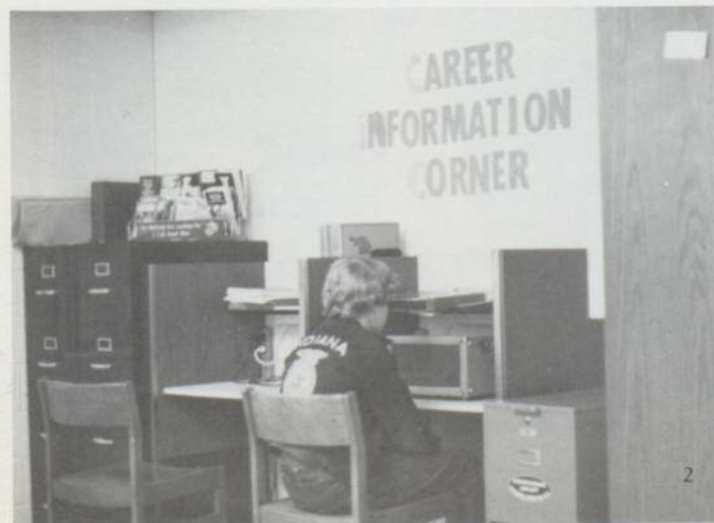
**ADDITIONAL COMMENTS.** I personally see the value of career education in that I never had the opportunity to be career counseled. Had I had this chance, I would have been spared the fumbling and confusion I experienced while trying to choose a career for myself.

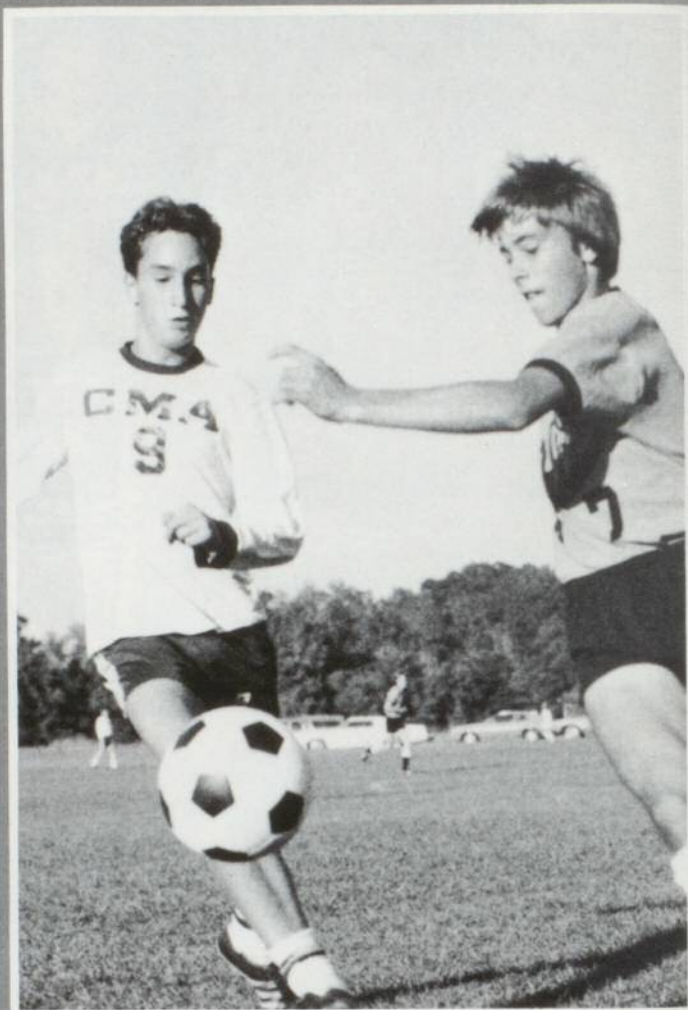
## SOCCER TEAM AWAITS NEW FIELD

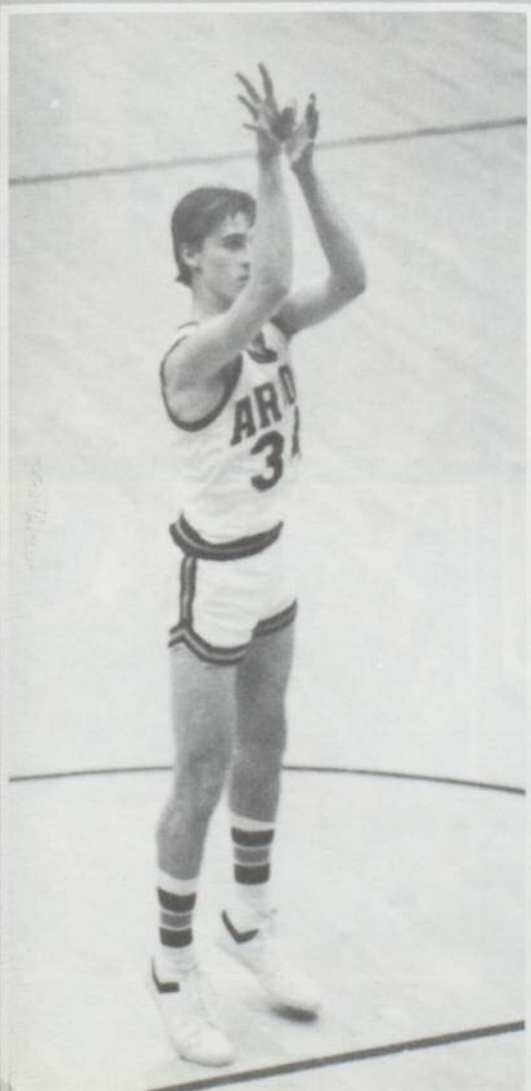

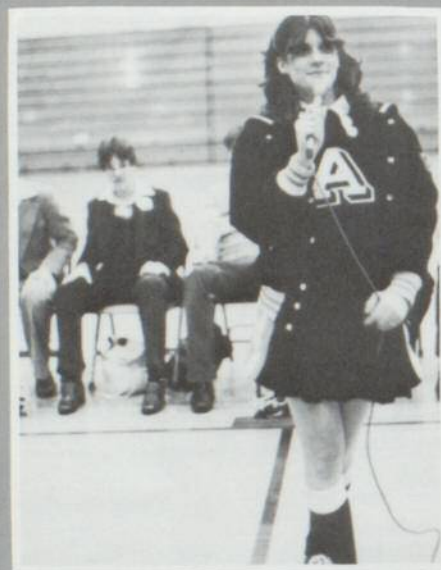

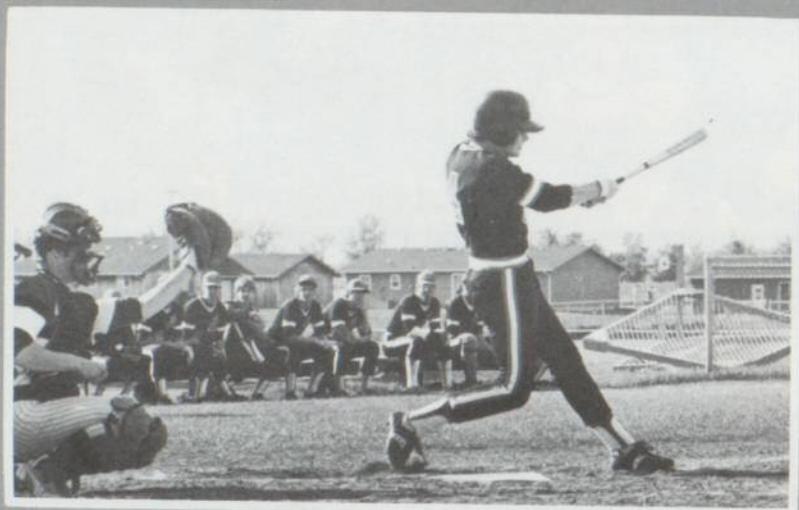

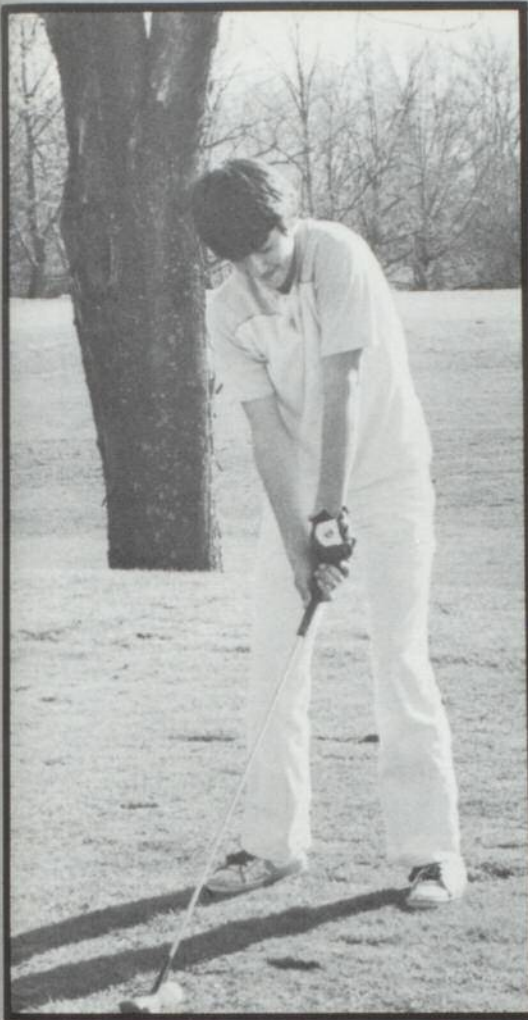
