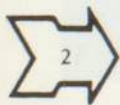

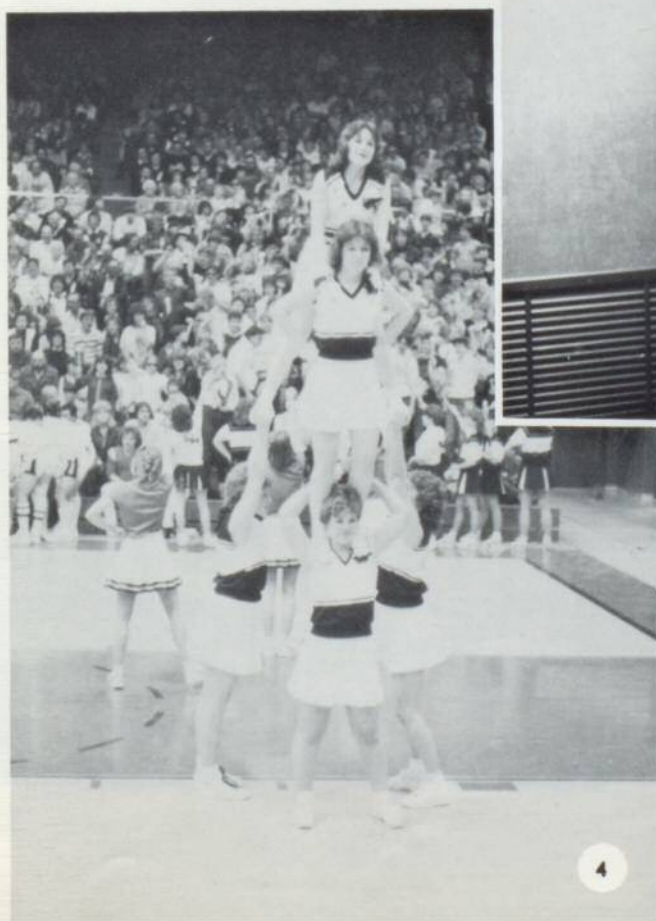

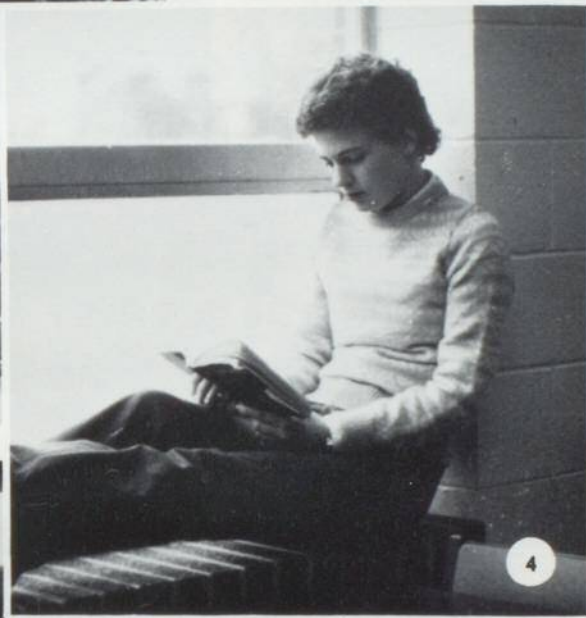

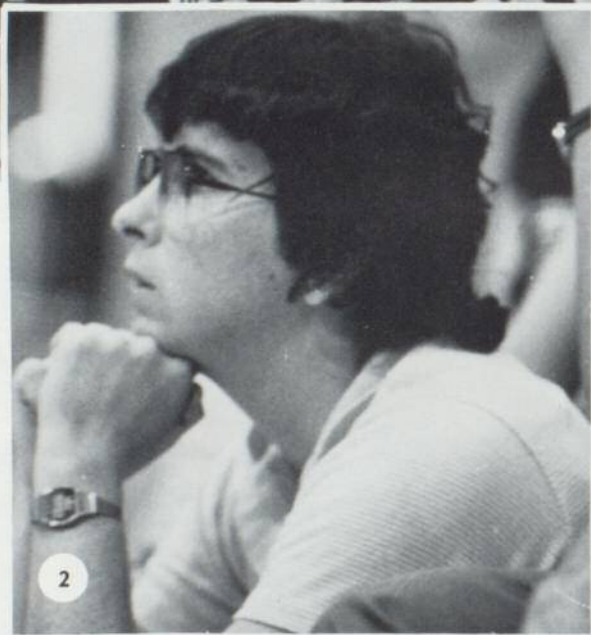
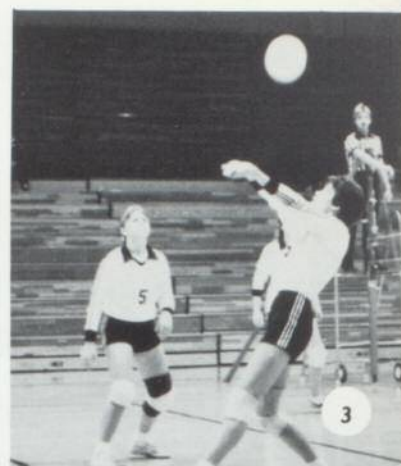

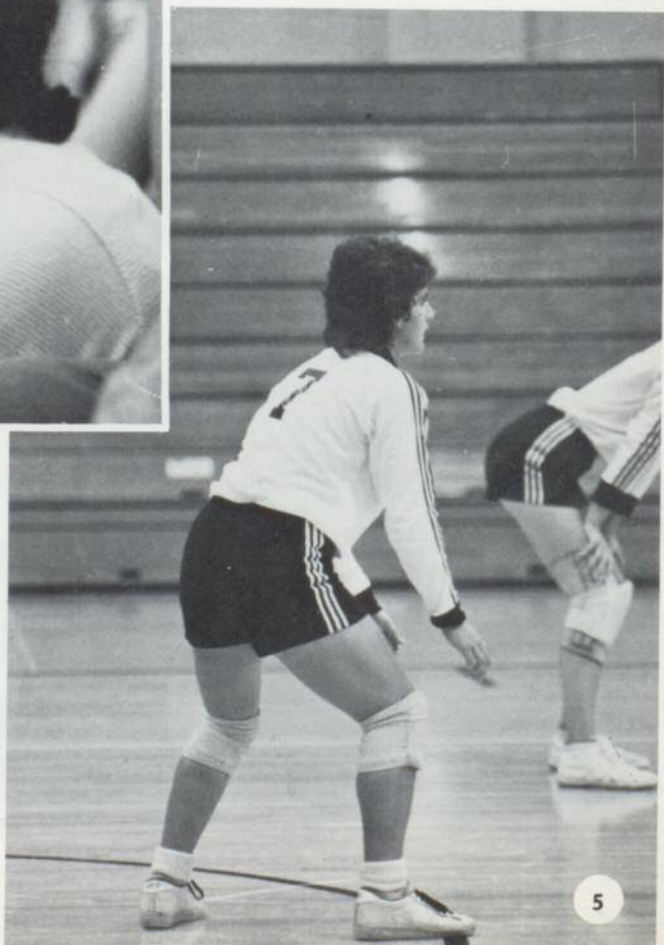

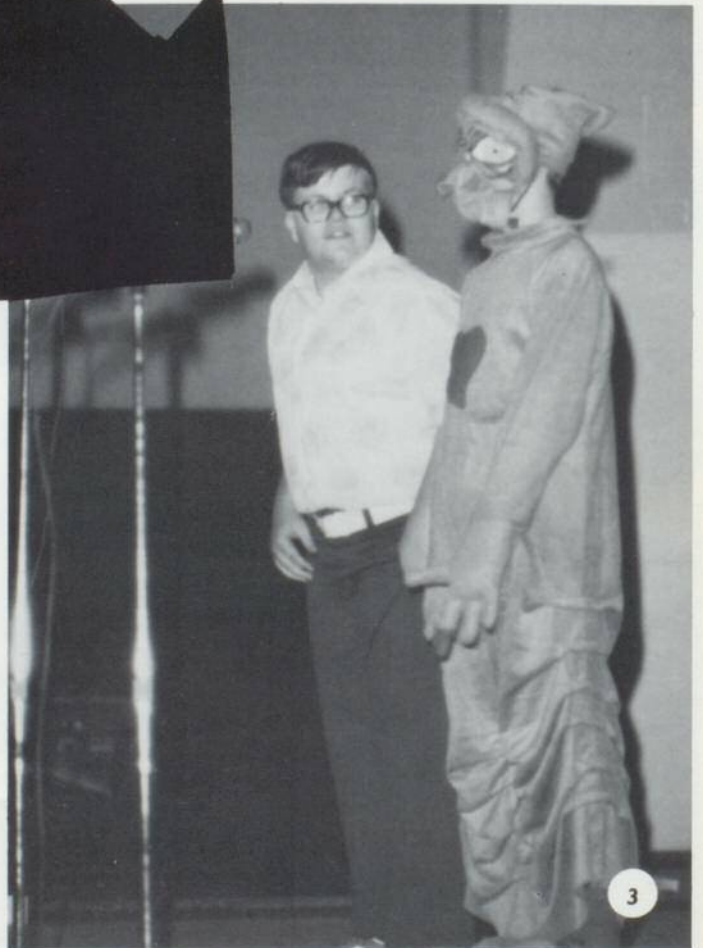

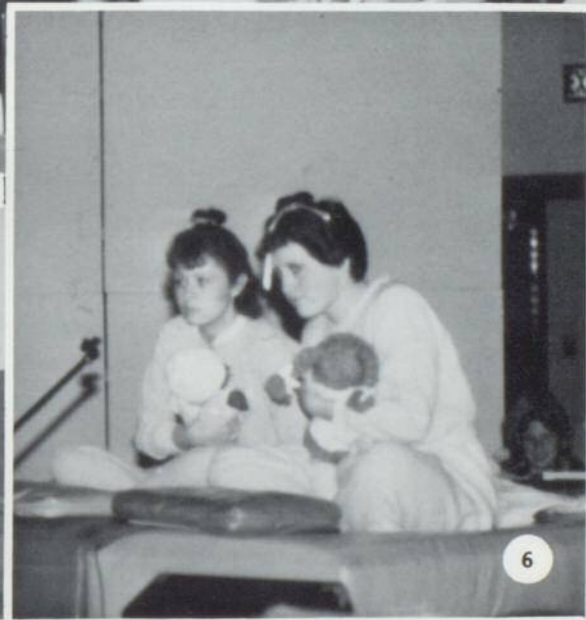

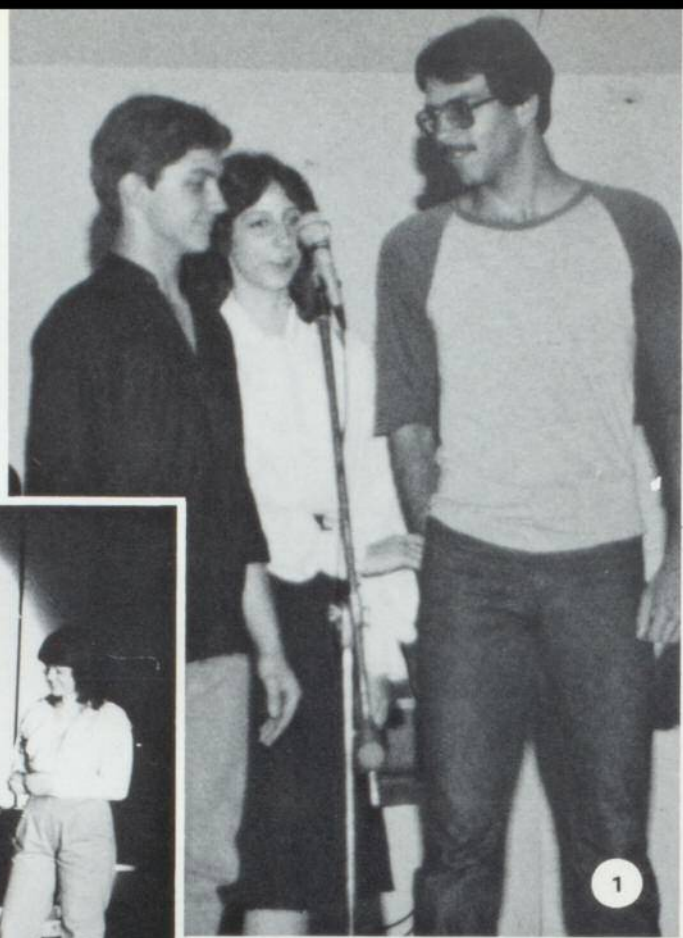

DRAMA CLUB PRESENTS TWO PLAYS ON MURDER

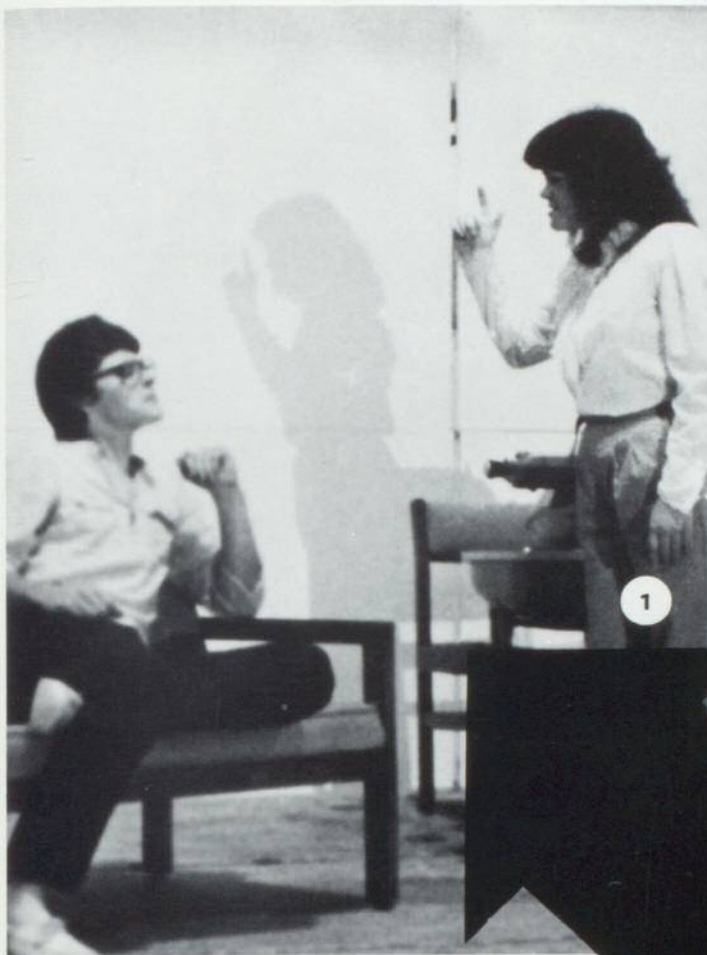

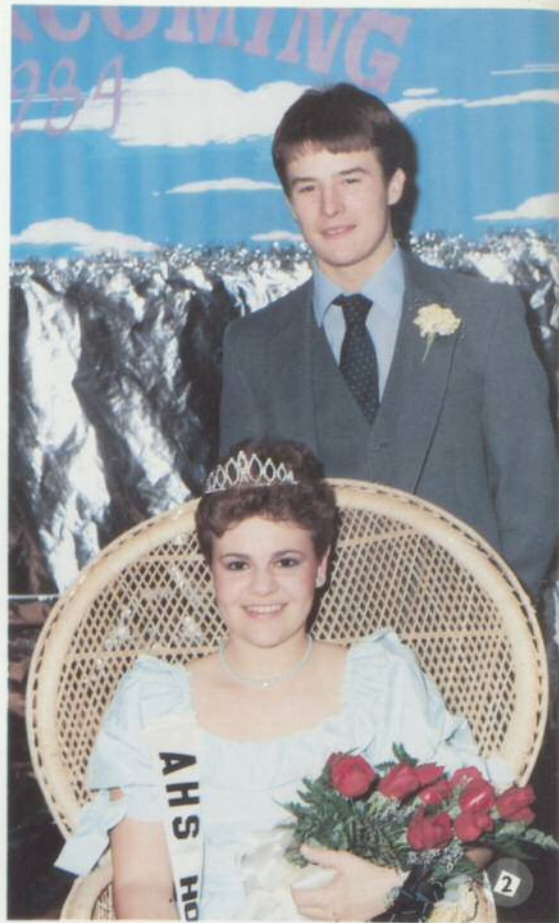

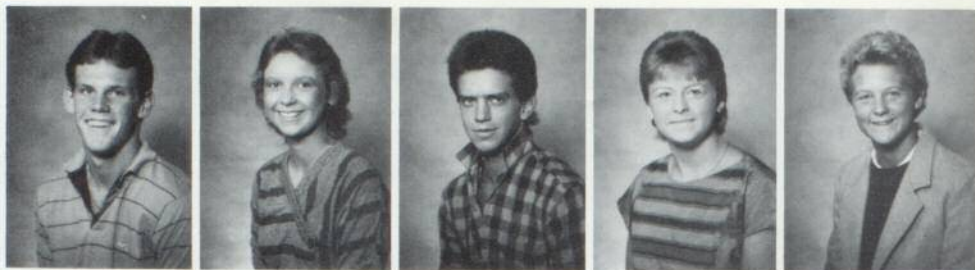

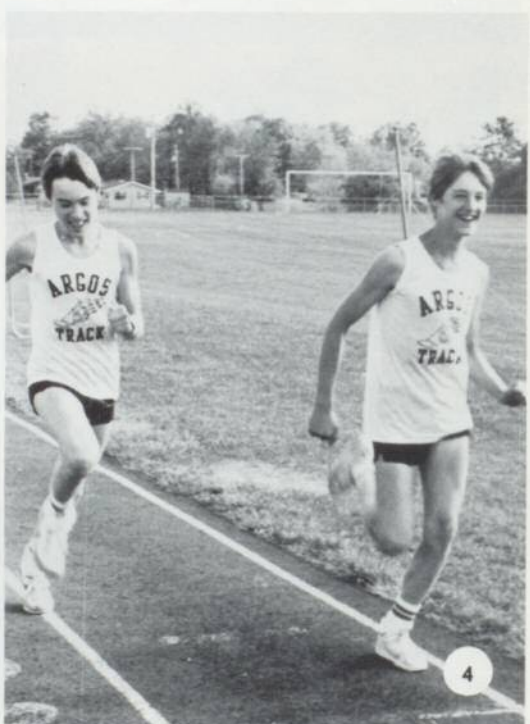
