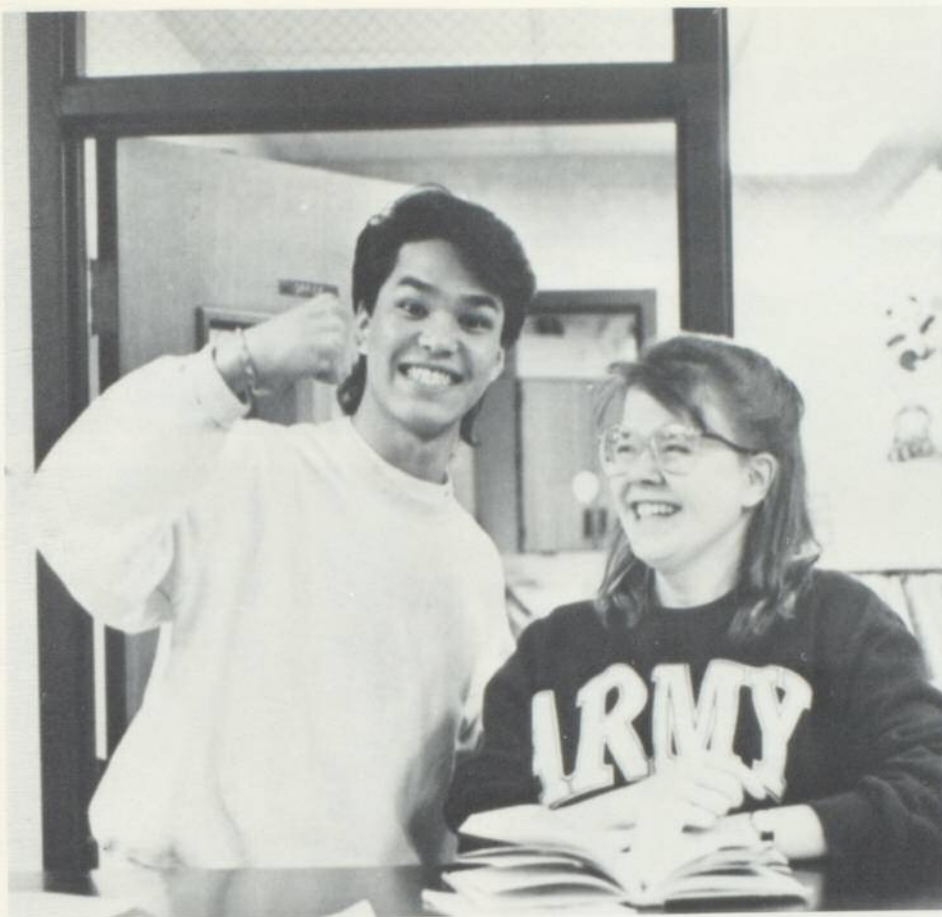

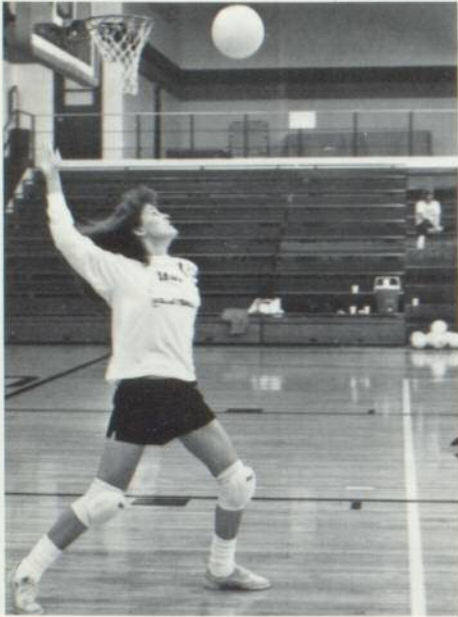

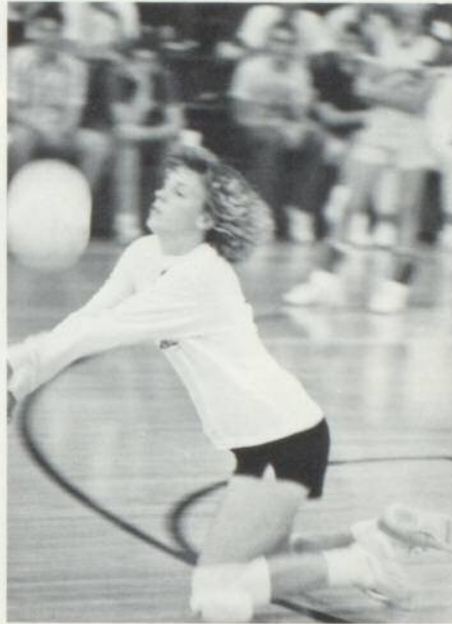

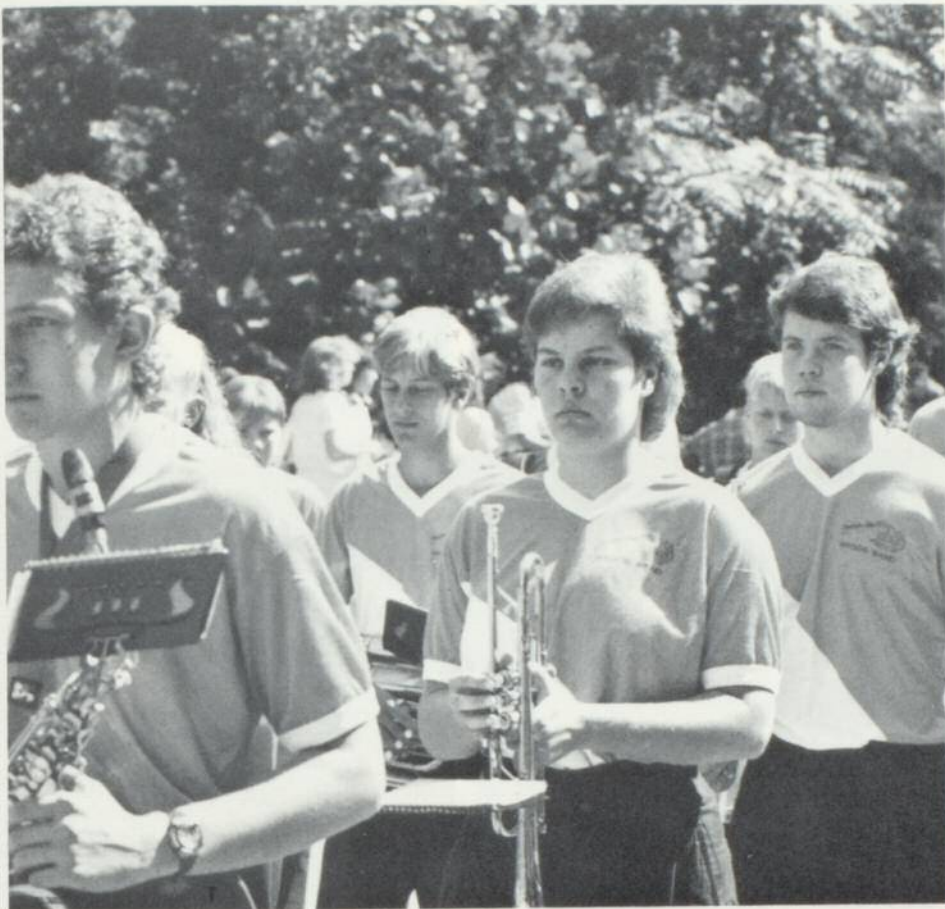

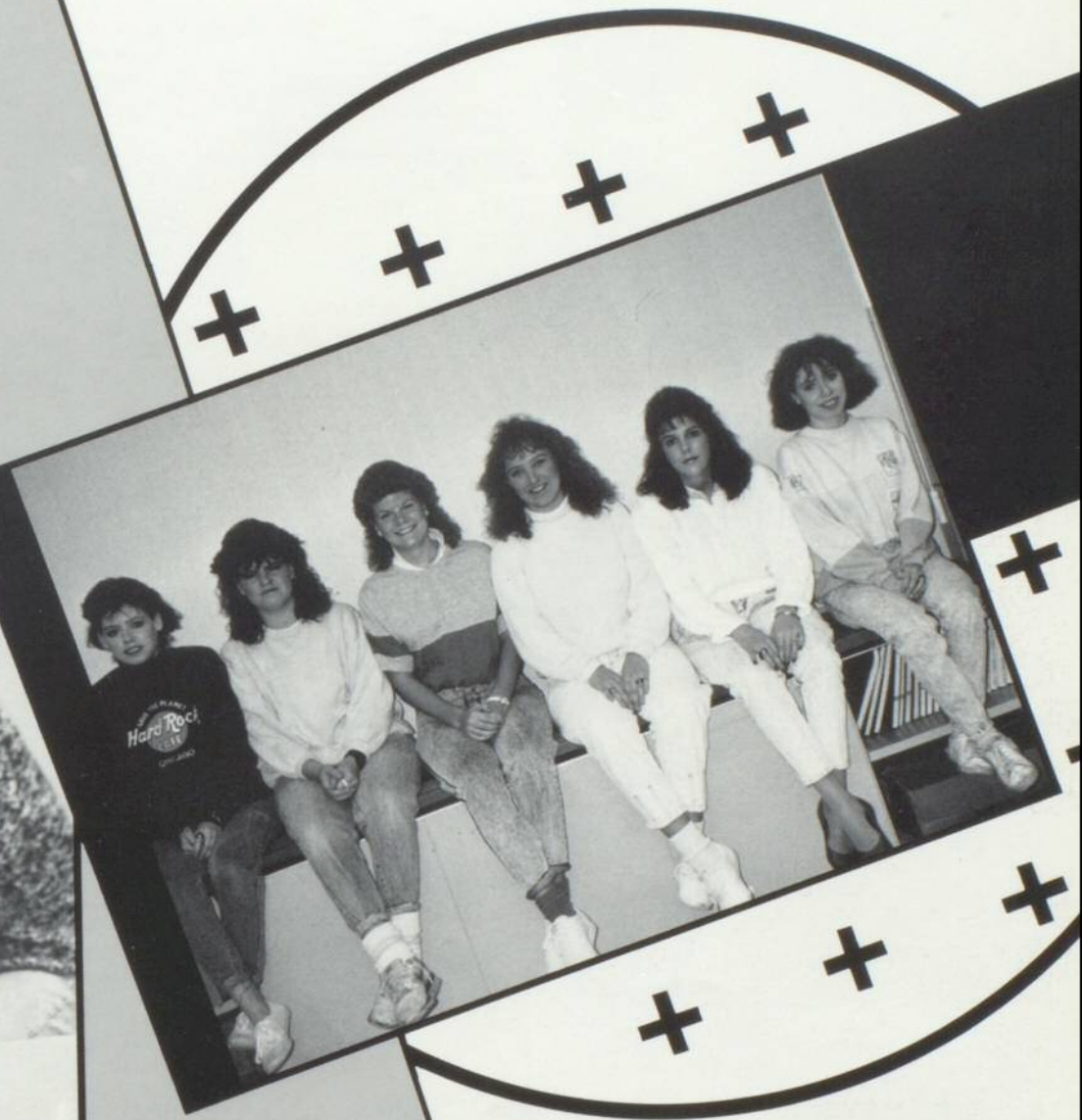

Jenny & Andre
Visit Argos





This year, Argos was very fortunate in having two foreign exchange students here as Seniors.

The first, Jenny Bandhold, was 18 years old on June 23, 1989. She was born in Korea in 1971. She has a twin sister and another sister who is 13. Jenny lived with Greg and Marilyn Shirk during her stay here in the United States.

Jenny's mother works with display, communication, and interior design at IKEA — a well known Swedish furniture store. Jenny's father owns his own photography studio; he specializes in photographing food for advertisements.

Jenny plans to go to college in Stockholm to study advertising.

The second foreign exchange student, Andre Kopljär, was 18 on November 30, 1989. He was born in Jund, Sweden, and he has one sister who is 23. His host parents were Caroline and Pat Hanley. His mother works at a scientific lab as an analyst of the work done at the lab. His father has his own electrotechnical company. Andre does not know what he wants to do in the future, but he does want to travel a lot.

Following are our interview questions and both Jenny's and Andre's responses.

Explain how you became a foreign exchange student. Jenny: I heard about it. A lot of my friends have been here as exchange students. I filled in an application and went for an interview. Andre: I had been dreaming about going to the US for a long time and when my dad one day asked me if I wanted to go for a whole year, I didn't hesitate one second. After that came the interview and test.

Describe the school you attend in Sweden. Jenny: There are about 1,000 people in my school — only sophomores, juniors, and seniors. You can choose between lines of study — I'm studying an economic line. Andre: It was a small school but not as small as Argos. Most classes involved physics and math. High school in Sweden is more like college — not in the level of education but in the structure. We do not attend the same classes every day. Our classes end on different times each day.

What are your favorite American foods? Do you like or dislike American food in general? Jenny: No comment. Andre: I could answer this question by saying junk food or fast food. Though it is fattening and has a lot of sugar and is not healthy at all, I just love it. It's fast and the taste is not too bad. There are, of course, some good restaurants, but in general I prefer fast food.

What do you enjoy most about being here? Jenny: No comment. Andre: Learning English. It comes by itself — not like English classes in Sweden with boring studies and tests that I don't understand and that don't matter since I came here. The English that I and other Swedes learn is too formal and too "perfect." Just being in

another country totally different is COOL!

What do you dislike the most here in the United States? Jenny: No comment. Andre: I've never thought about it and can't really tell.

How do the teenagers dress differently here than in Sweden? Jenny: They dress the same. Their clothes are from Italy, England, and the USA. Andre: I would say that it's more liberal in Sweden. There are more different styles but, of course, I haven't seen that much of the US which is a huge country.

What was your first day like here in the United States? Jenny: The host family showed me around everywhere. Andre: I was tired, and it was late. It was like some kind of a "shock" to see everything new and different.

What do you think of American movies? Jenny: I like American movies. Almost all movies are from the US in Sweden. Andre: They are the best in the world.

What do you think of American girls (Andre) and boys (Jenny)? Jenny: They are much the same as Swedish boys. Andre: Girls are the same in the way they look, but here they are more, let's say "conservative."

What special places do you want to visit here in the United States? What special events do you want to attend? Jenny: Florida, Disneyworld, California, San Francisco, Hollywood, New York, Washington. Andre: New York, Chicago, Florida (and all that goes with it) and the same with California, the Grand Canyon, and a lot of other places.

Why did you choose the United States as the place to visit as a foreign exchange student? Jenny: Because everything in the world is so influenced by the US I thought it would be fitting to come here. Andre: What I had heard and seen I liked so it wasn't a tough choice.

Describe your home and the town in which you live in Sweden. What are the differences between your home town and Argos? Jenny: My town has 5,000 inhabitants. It lies close to the sea. It is an old fishing town. My house is from the 16th century. It has a half-timbered house with a straw roof. That's the difference between them. My town is bigger and looks different. Andre: The town I come from is a lot bigger. It's a college town with 25,000 students. It's approximately 900 years old and is in the south of Sweden.

What will you remember most about your visit here? Jenny: Going tee-peeing. Andre: My friends and the host family.

How often do you correspond with your friends and family in Sweden? Jenny: It's different all the time. Once a month, maybe, or every other month. Andre: Once a month at the most.

Is America anything like you thought it would be? Why or why not? Jenny: Yes. Andre: It's much like I thought it would be.

Would you like to come back to the United States? Jenny: Yes. Andre: Yeah!

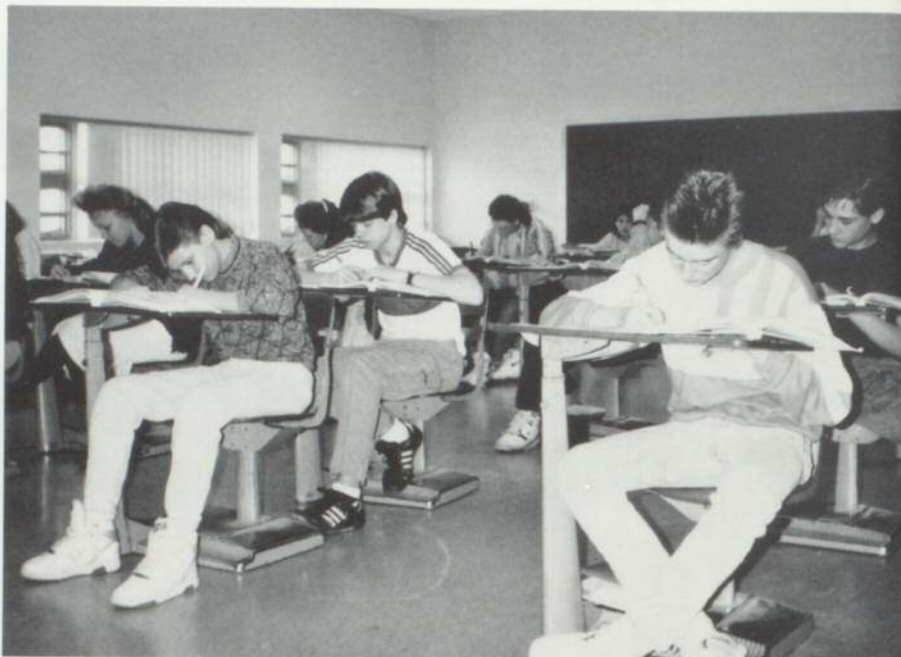

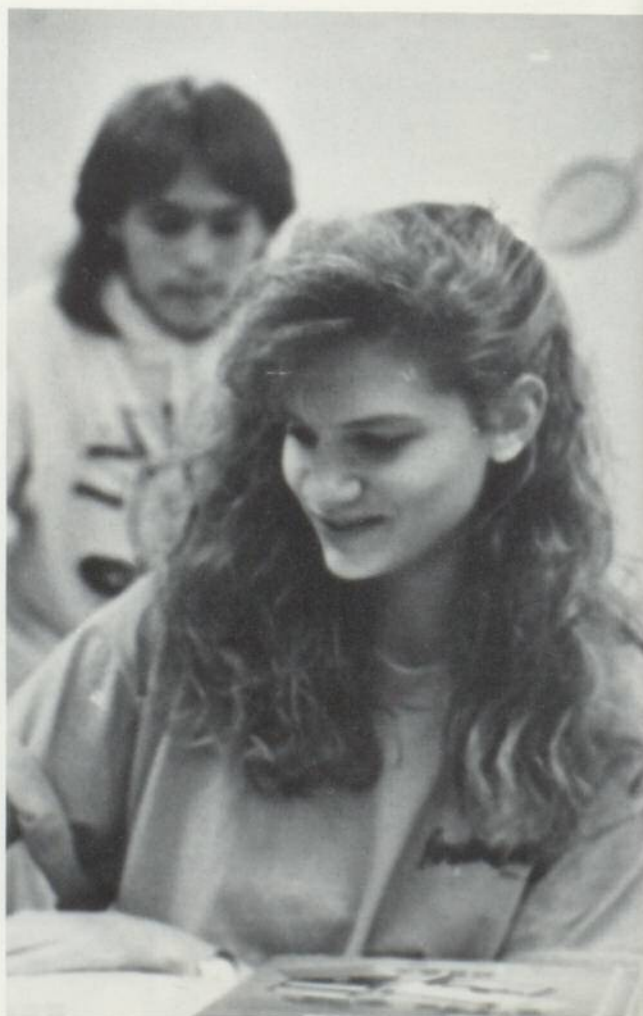

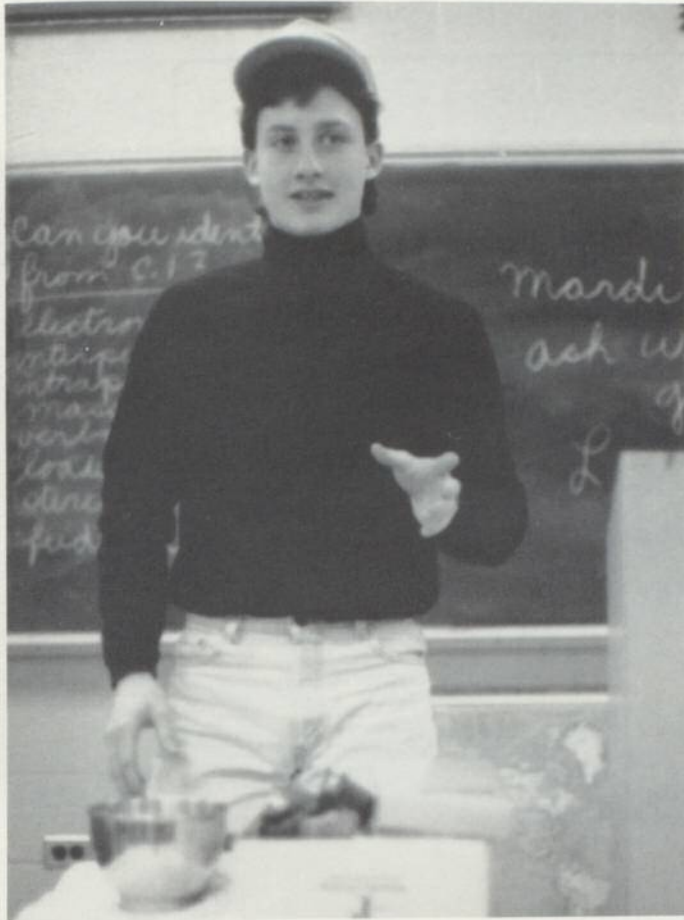

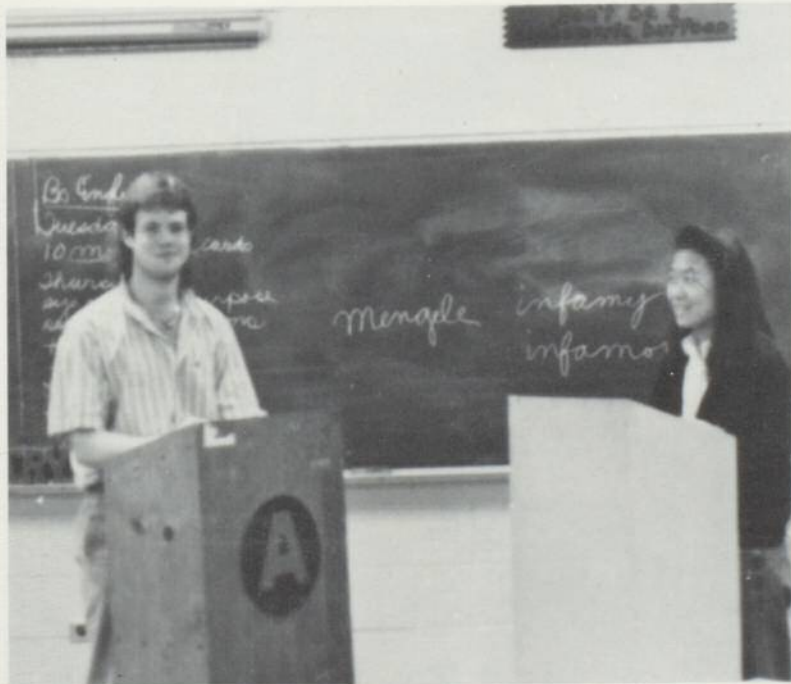

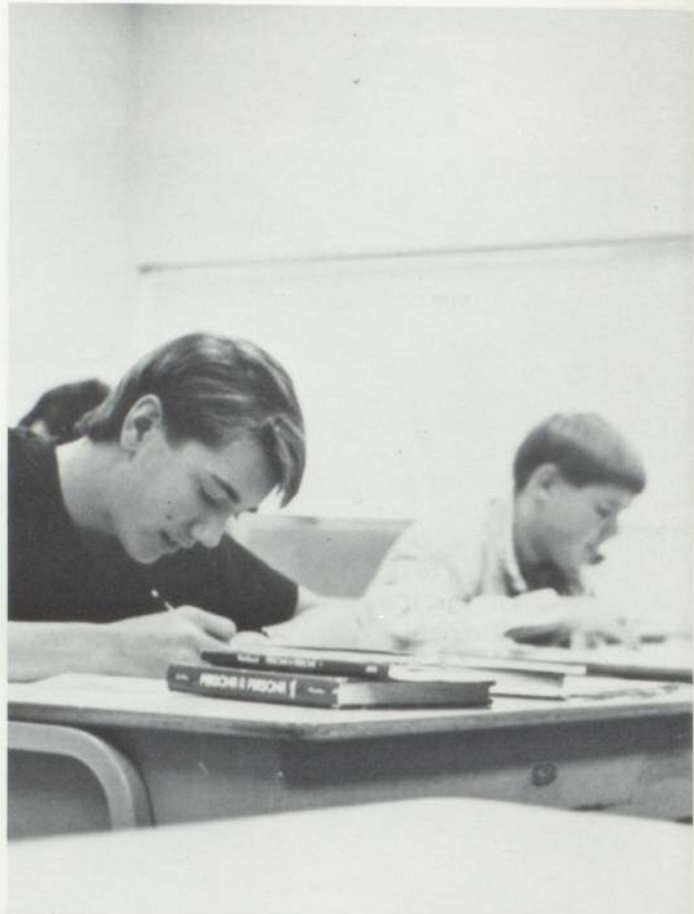

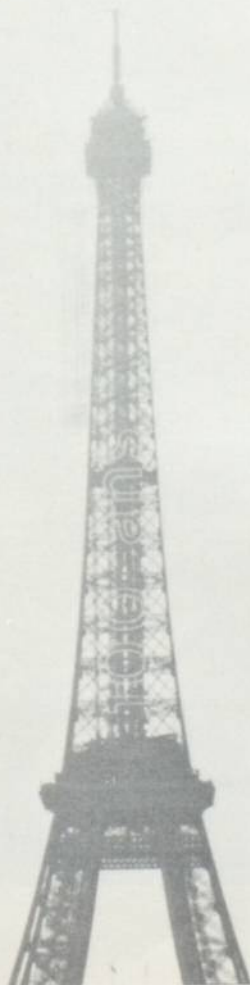
SUMMER IN LONDON, PARIS AND MADRID

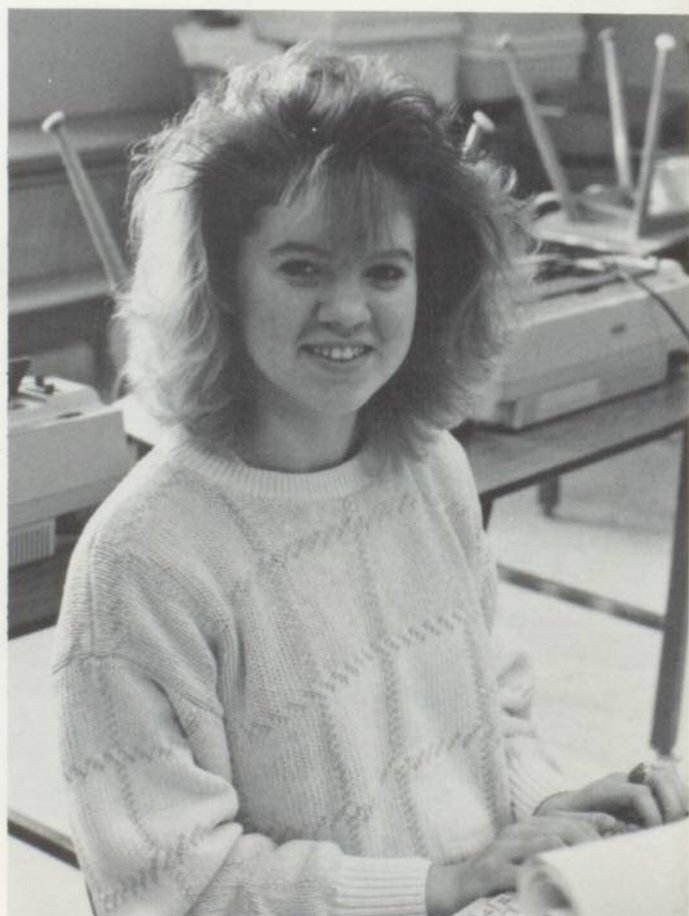

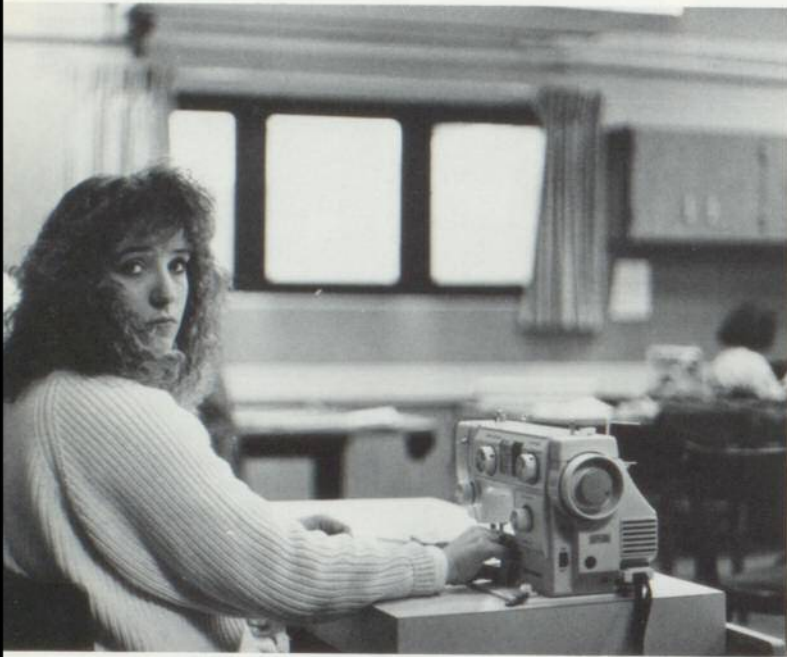

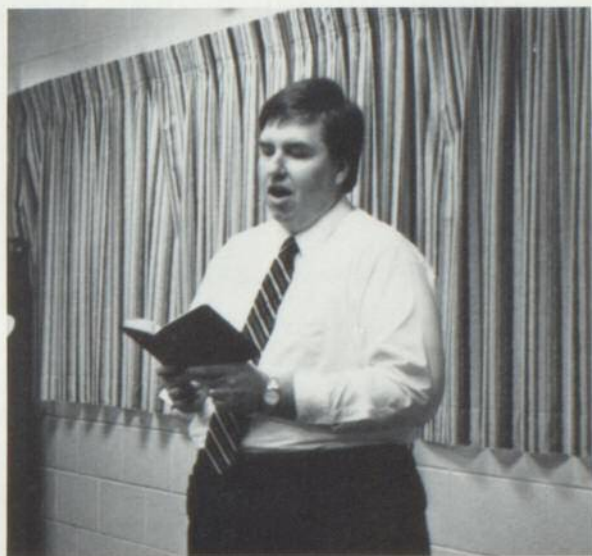

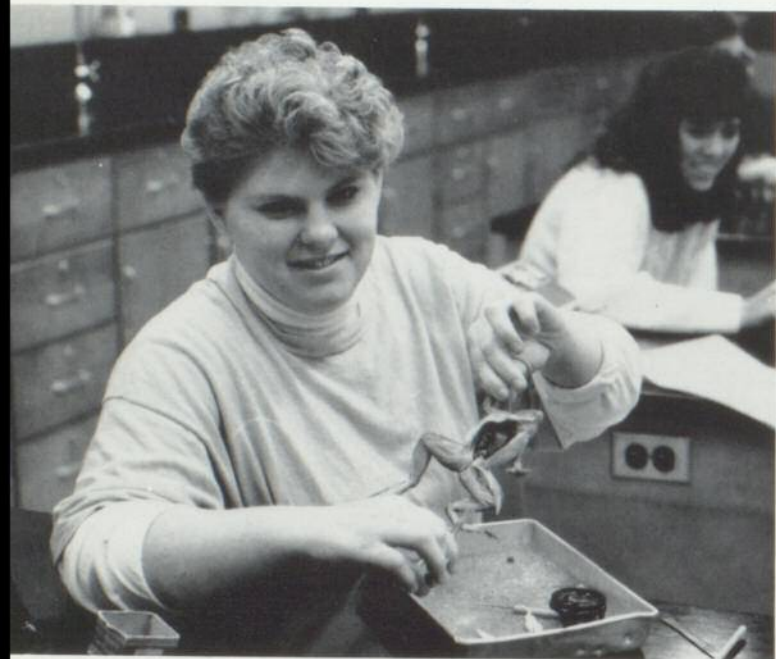

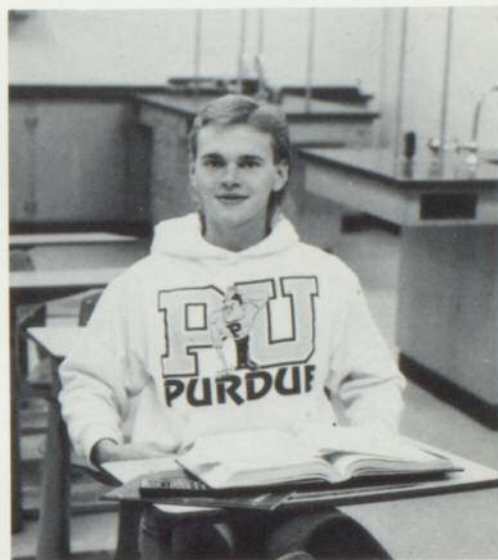

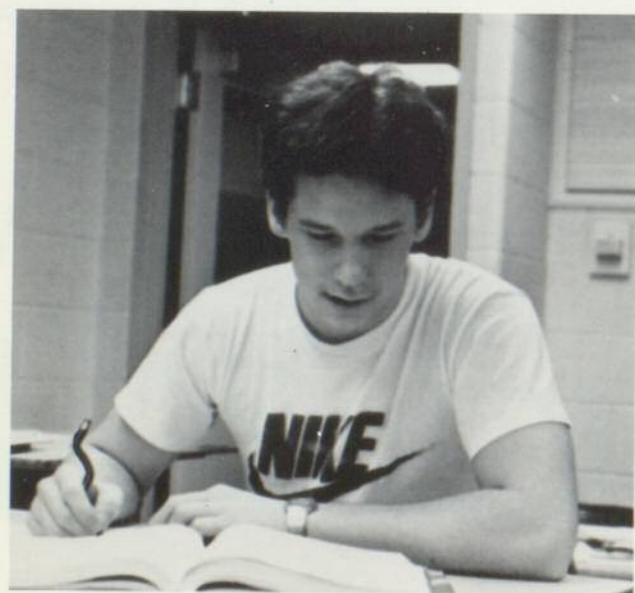
RADON SEARCH TEAM

This year four Argos students were given the opportunity to do an in-depth study of radon gas pollution in our school. The project began as a Science Fair project in South Bend, but since then it has become much more involved. Through the donation of 60 radon test cannisters by Ball State University, Steve Wilhelm, Dave Trump, Jason Thompson, and Chris O'Dell were able to test their homes and the school for the presence of the potentially carcinogenic gas. In addition, these students also received a grant from the State of Indiana which will enable them, with the assistance of Mr. Cooper, to continue their study on an even broader scale. 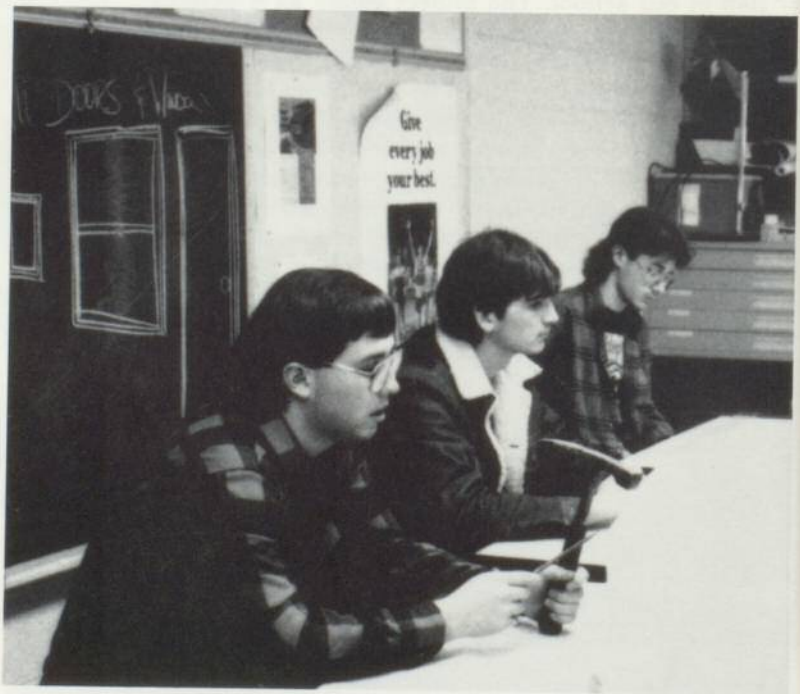

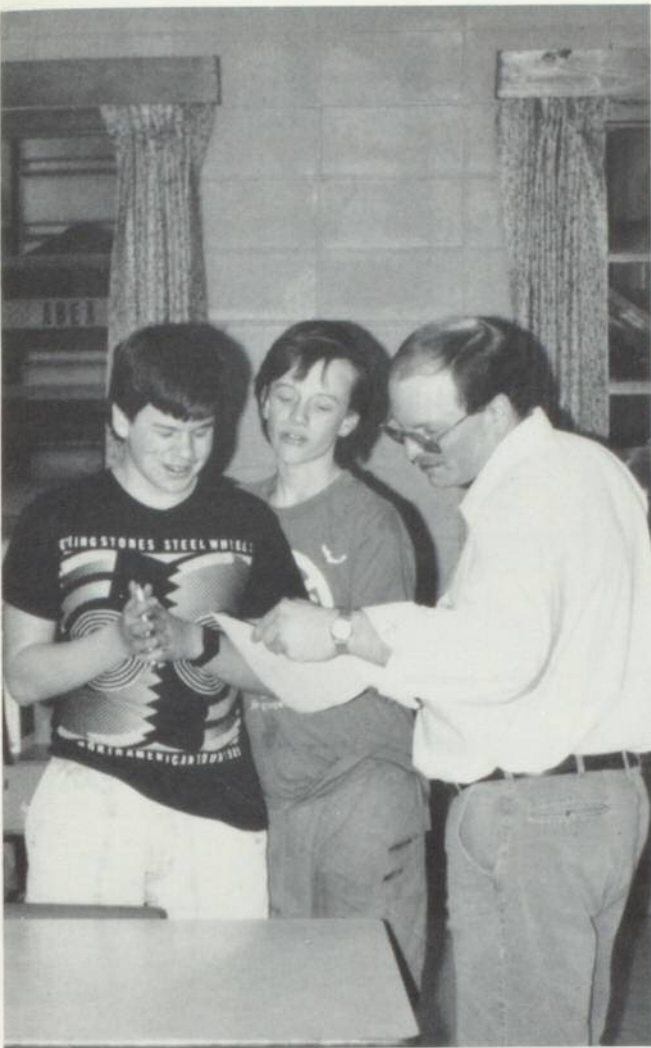

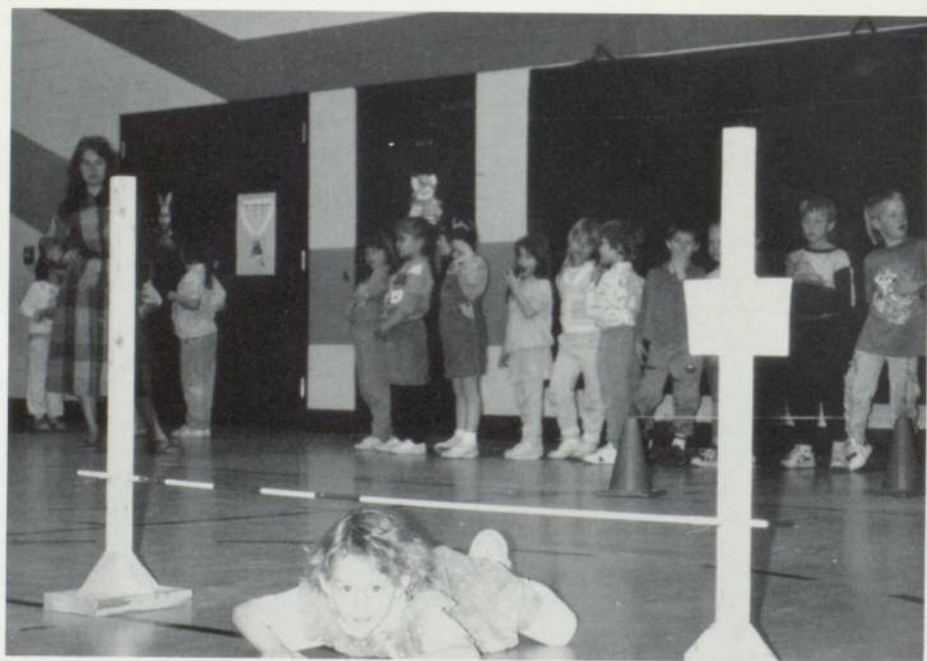

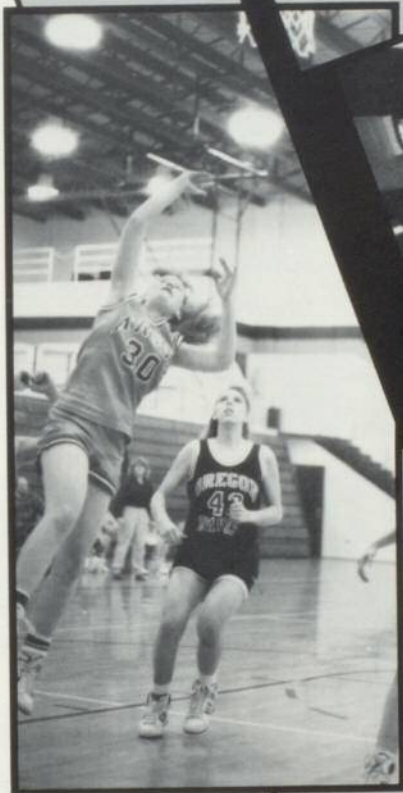

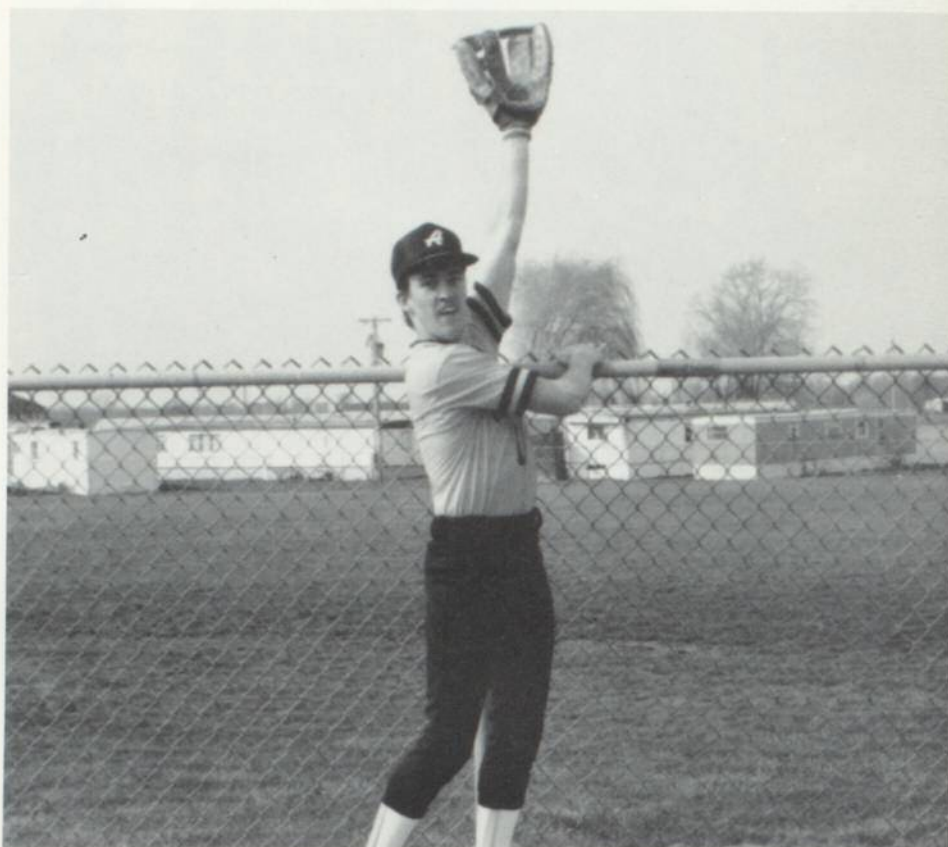

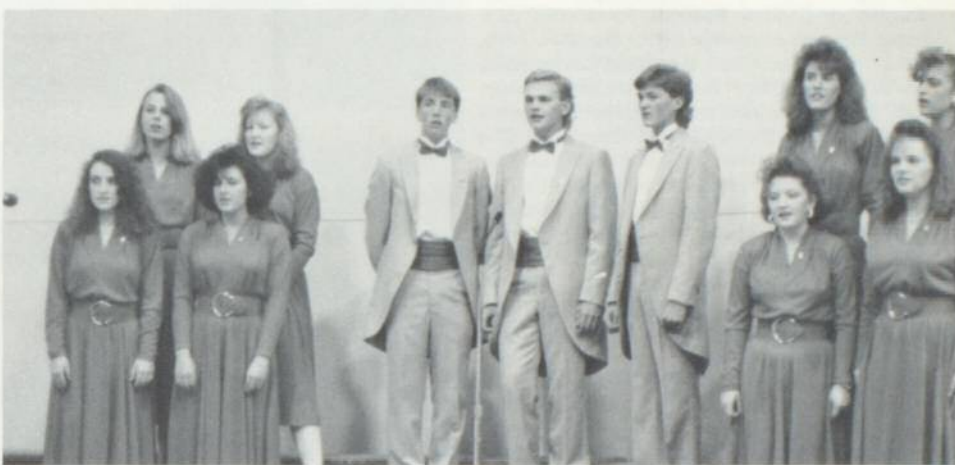

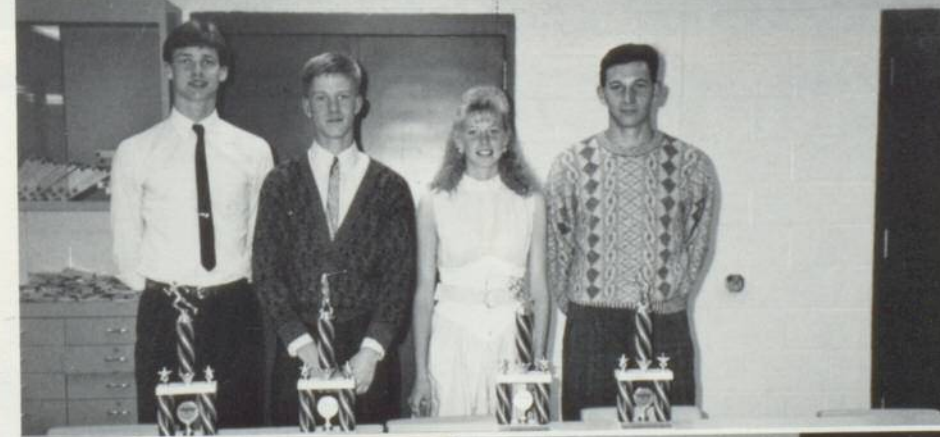

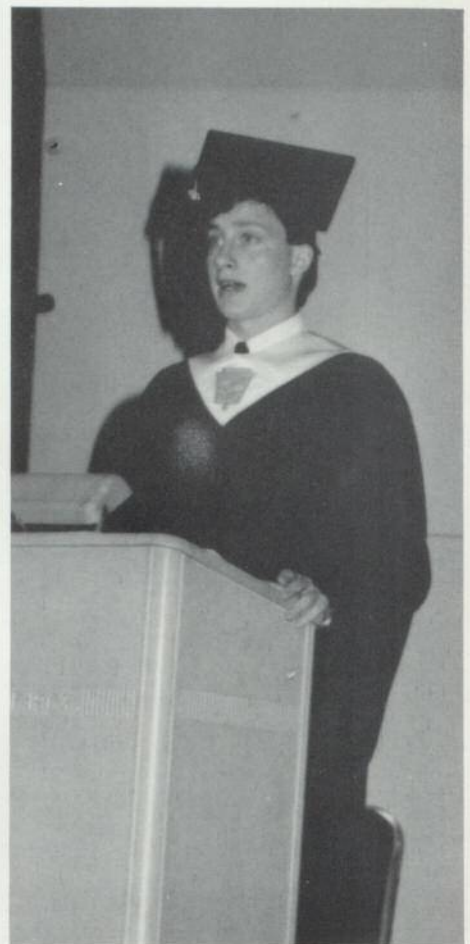
