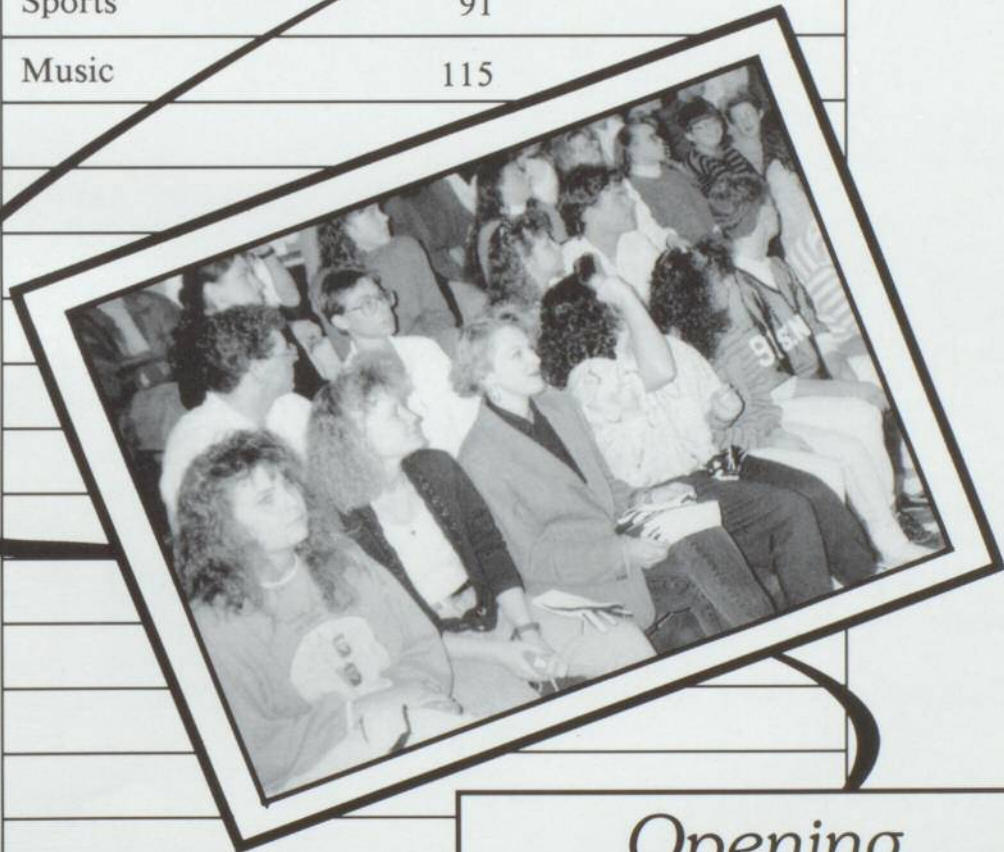

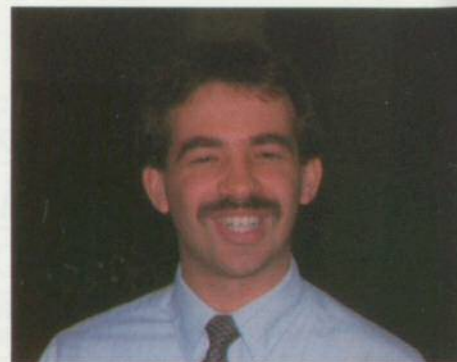
Changes, Changes. . .

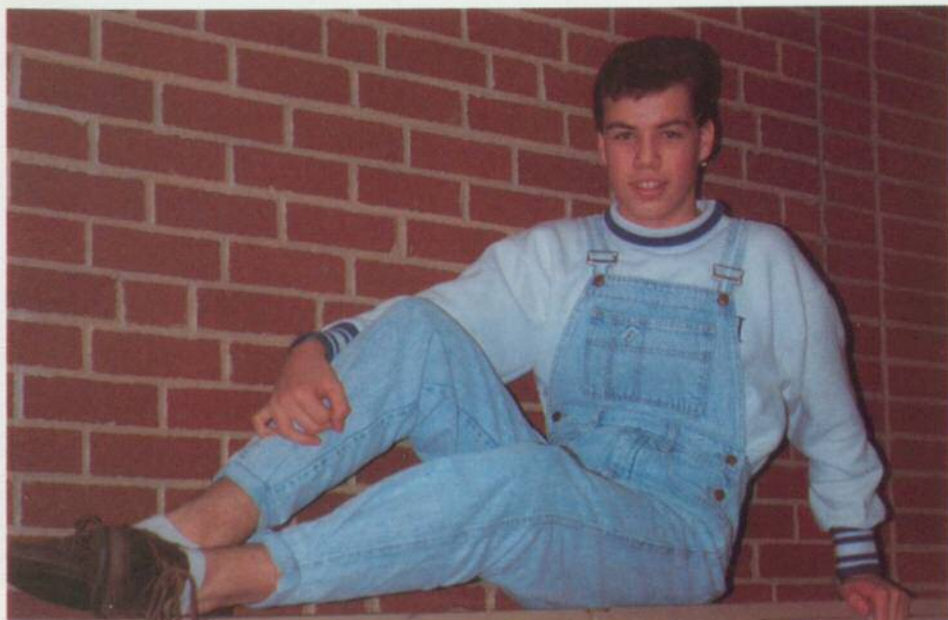

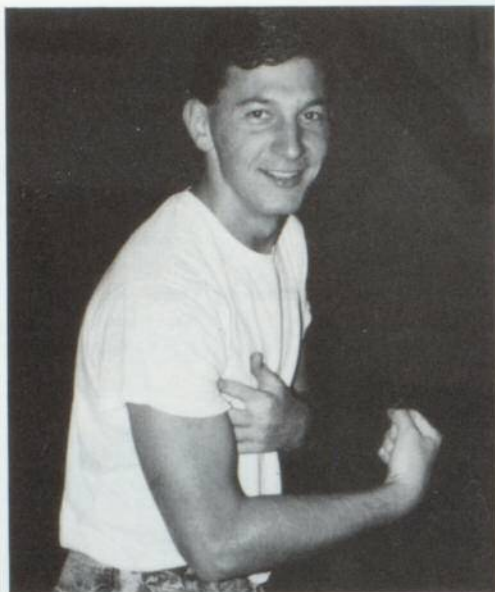

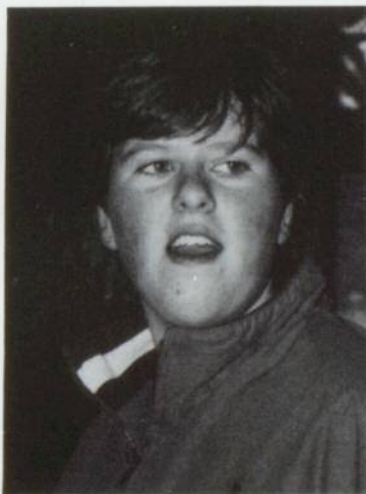

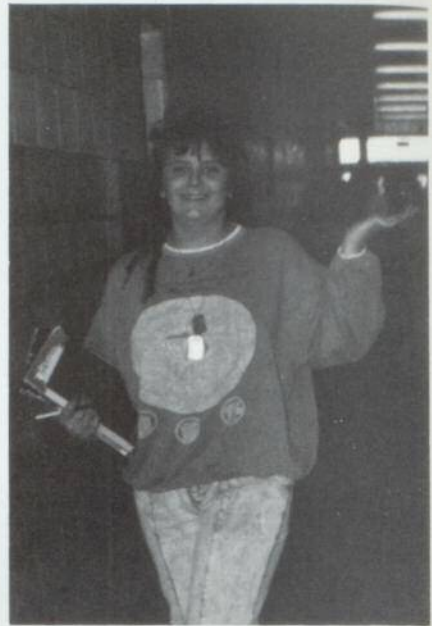

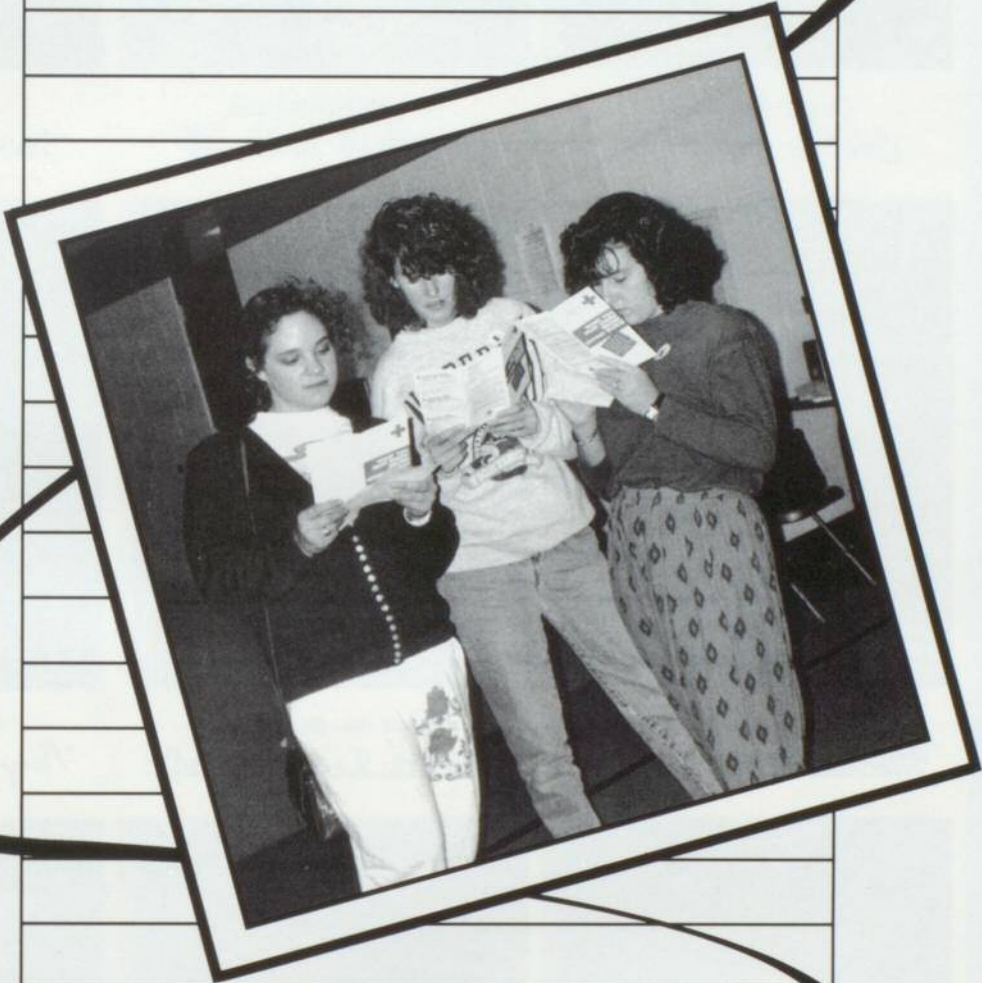

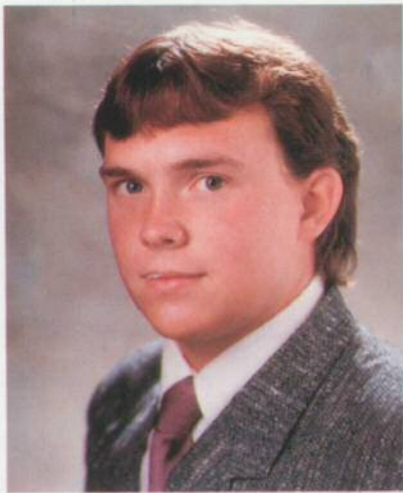

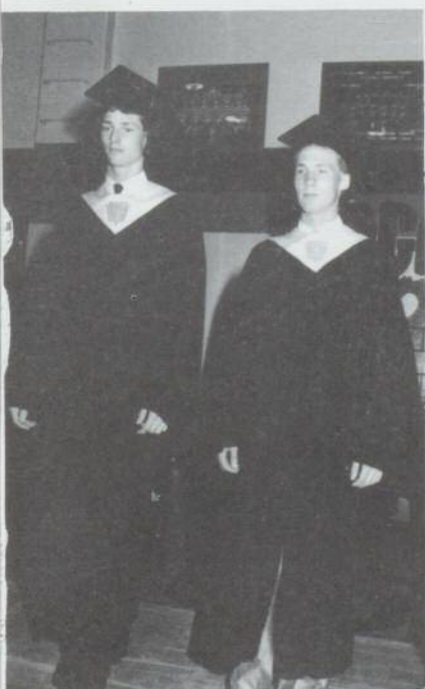

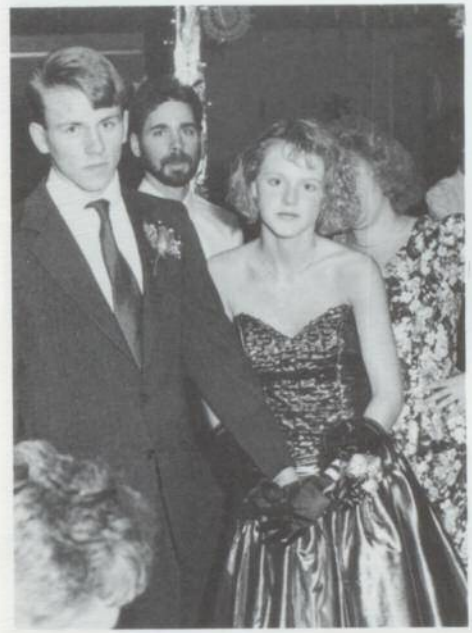

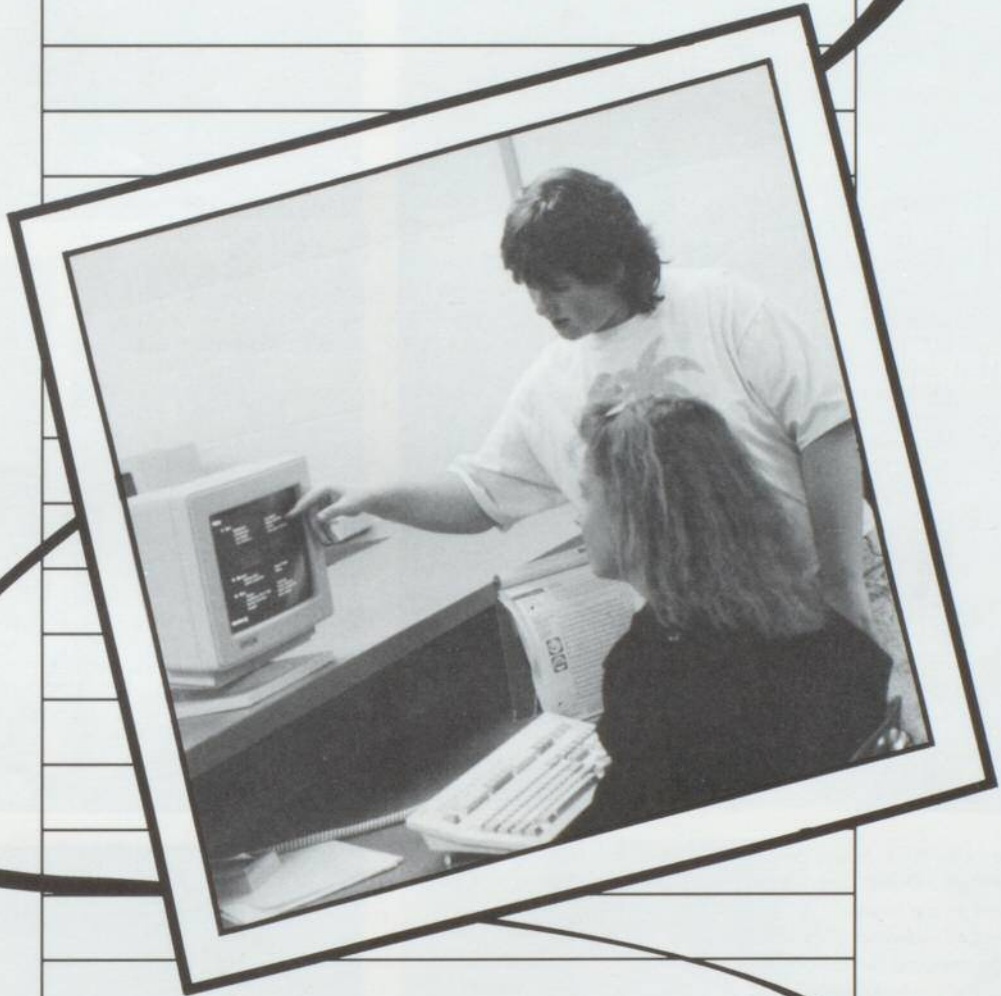
FHA Sponsors "Jams" at Morp Dance

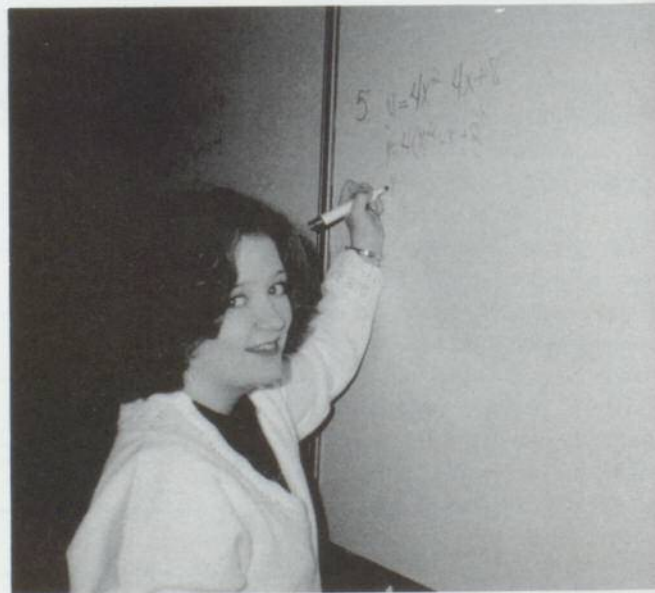

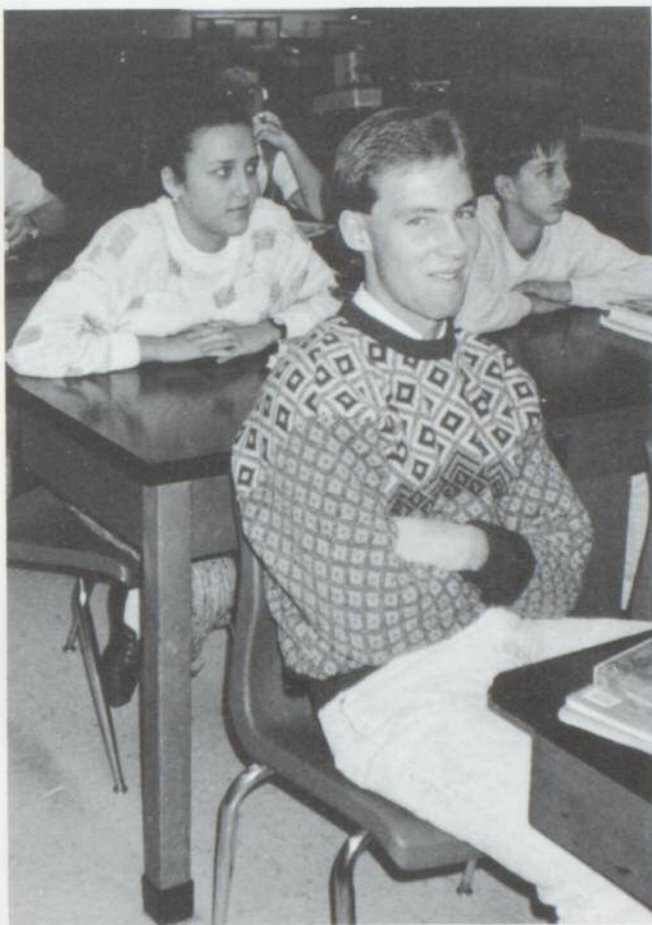

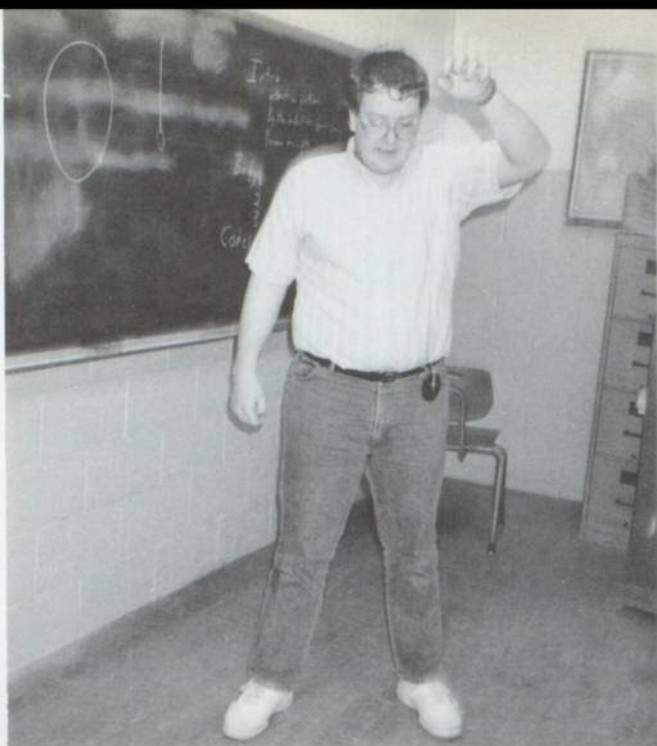

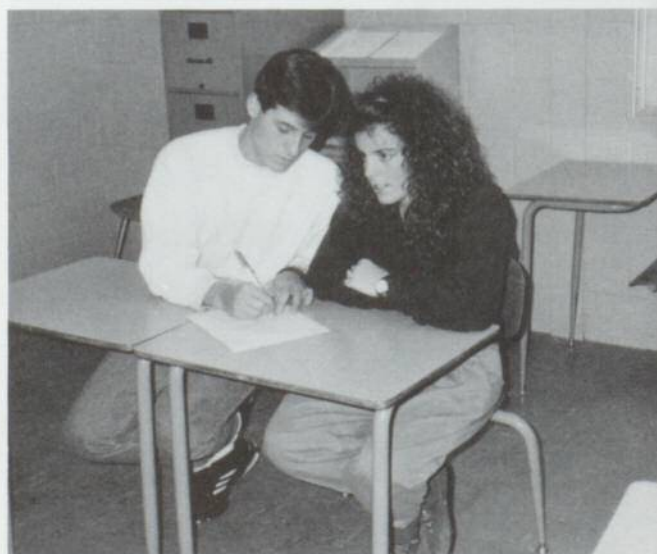

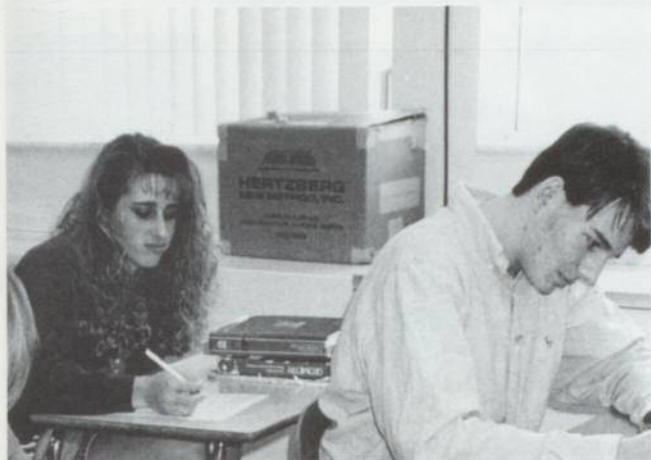
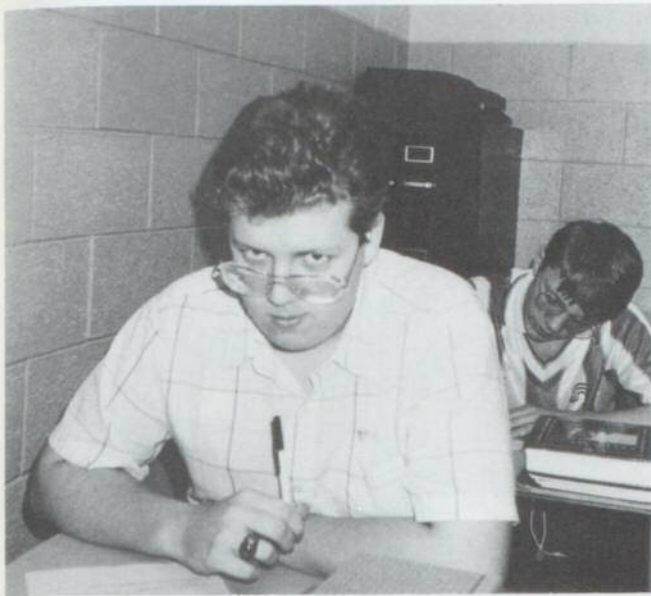

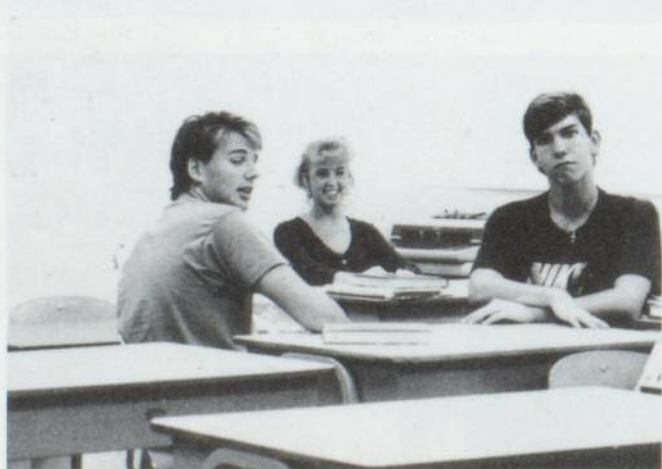

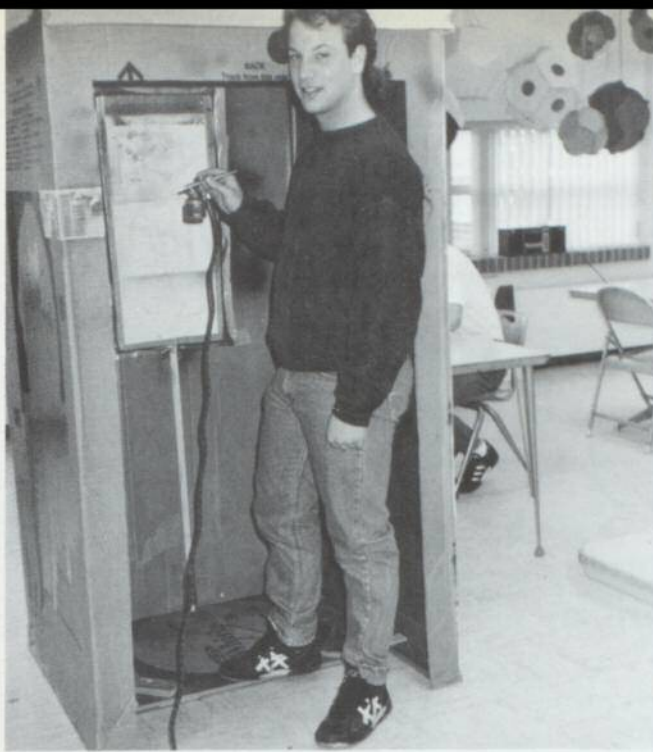

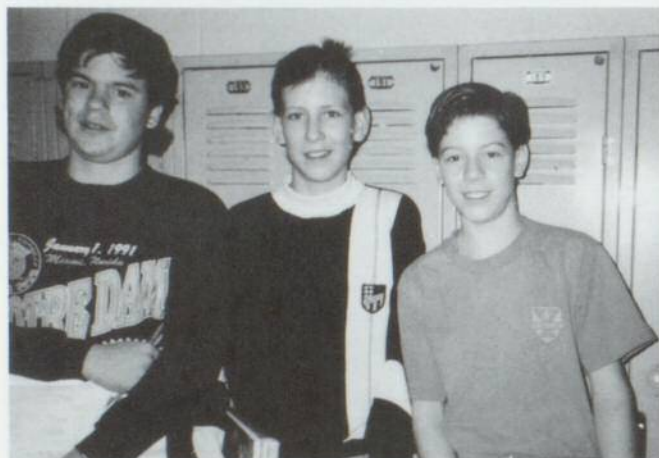
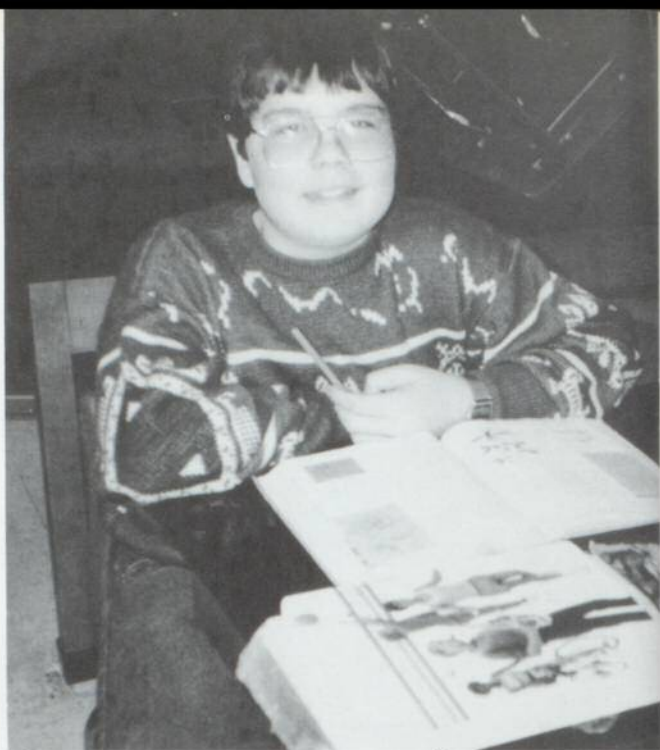

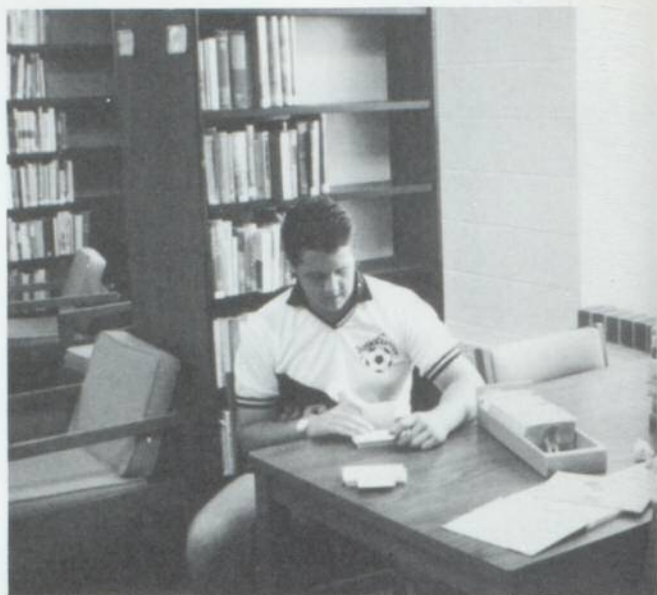

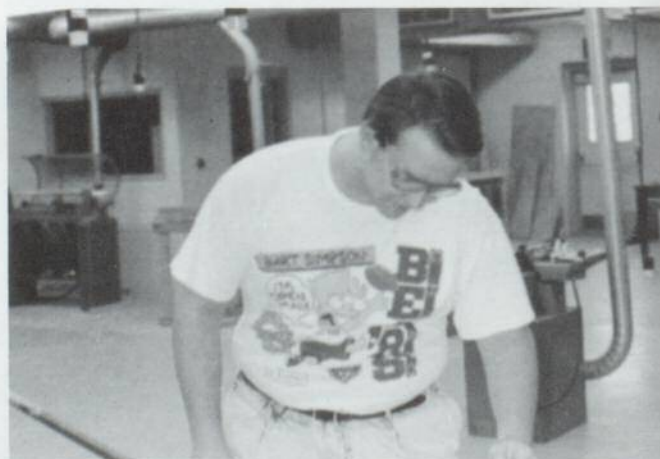
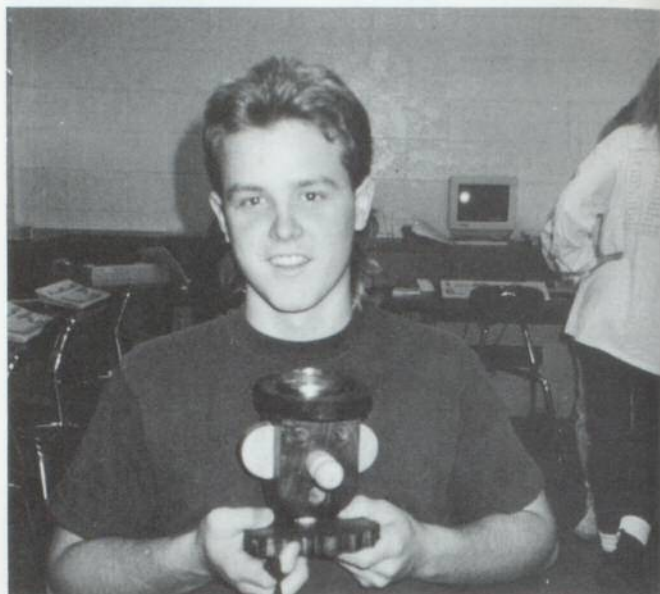

Two Veteran Teachers Retire



Phoebe Heishman taught at Argos High School for 21 years—from 1969 to 1990. While at Argos, she taught speech and English. She also served as the sponsor of the Drama Club and the Sophomore Class. Mrs. Heishman received a B.A. degree from DePaul in Chicago in 1968 majoring in English and minoring in speech and drama. She received an M.A., degree from IUSB in Secondary Education.

When I began teaching, I may have answered an ad similar to this, perhaps not fully comprehending the finer points. But after actual daily experience in the classroom, I would rewrite the ad including specific characteristics needed for this job:

*T*ime manager

*E*nthusiasm

*A*bility to motivate, interest, challenge

*C*reator of a climate or mood in the classroom

*H*umor because laughter is an effective learning aid

*E*nergy

*R*esponsibility to update and change materials and to help each student to become the best individual he is capable of becoming

Room 18 at AHS was my second home for 21 years, and hundreds of students came through its door. Classroom mottos included "Don't be a sophomore buffoon" and "Happy, happy, happy." Toward the end of my teaching career I even had students who were children of former students. Through the years I remembered where everyone had sat, and many who returned for a visit after graduation immediately slid into their former seat. My years in the classroom taught me what others before me probably already knew, that

we learn from each other and that learning occurs everywhere, in and out of the classroom

teaching takes place only when learning does

teaching is a committed lifestyle, and

learning is the most exciting aspect of living.

*I enjoyed teaching, and I miss it, but other unexplored avenues await.****

James Wysong taught at Argos High School for 35 years—from 1955 to 1990. He taught social studies—government, economics, and world history. He also served as the Guidance Director, Senior Class sponsor, Student Council sponsor, and National Honor Society sponsor.

Mr. Wysong earned his Bachelor's degree at DePauw in Greencastle in 1955 with an area major in political science and a minor in history. He received his Master's degree at Indiana University in Bloomington. 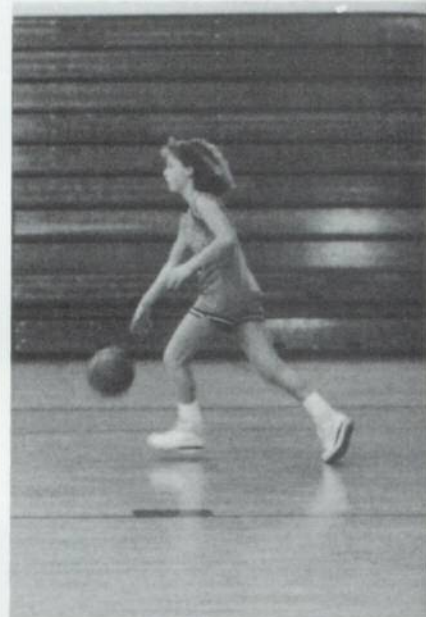

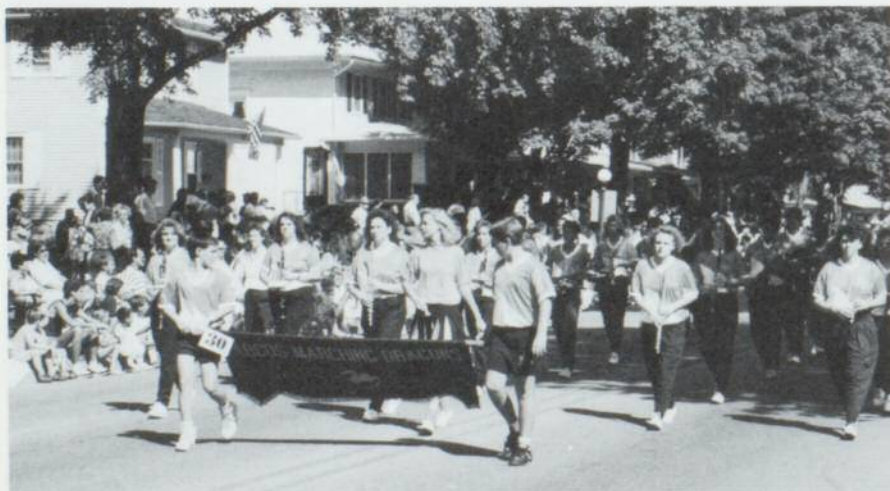

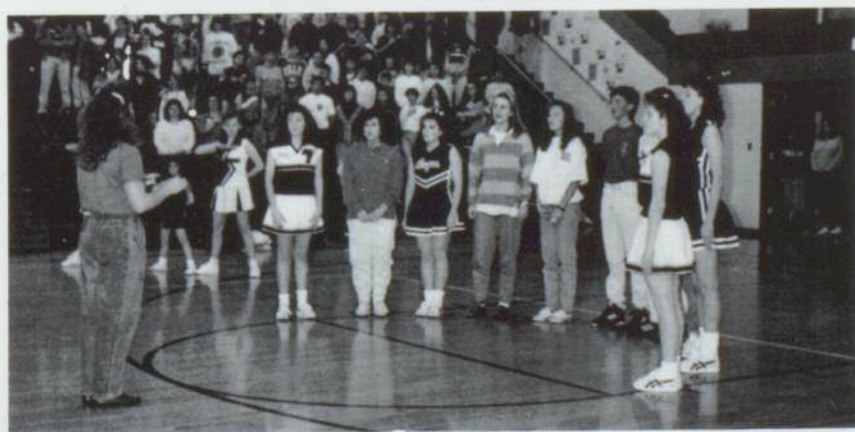
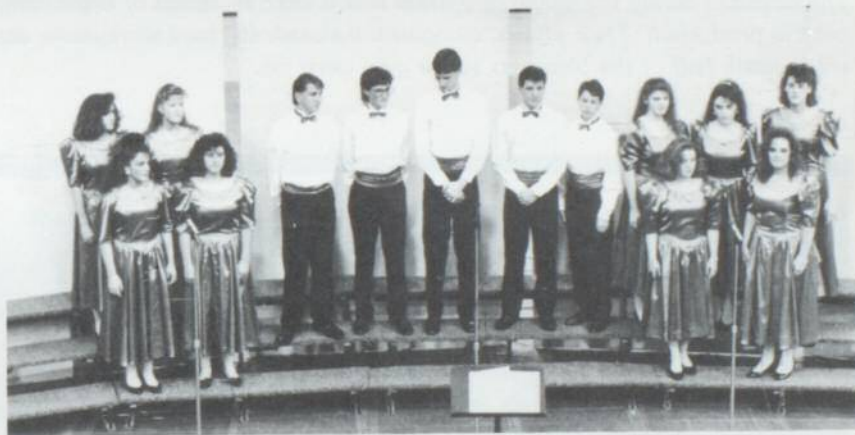


Swing Choir Has Exciting Year

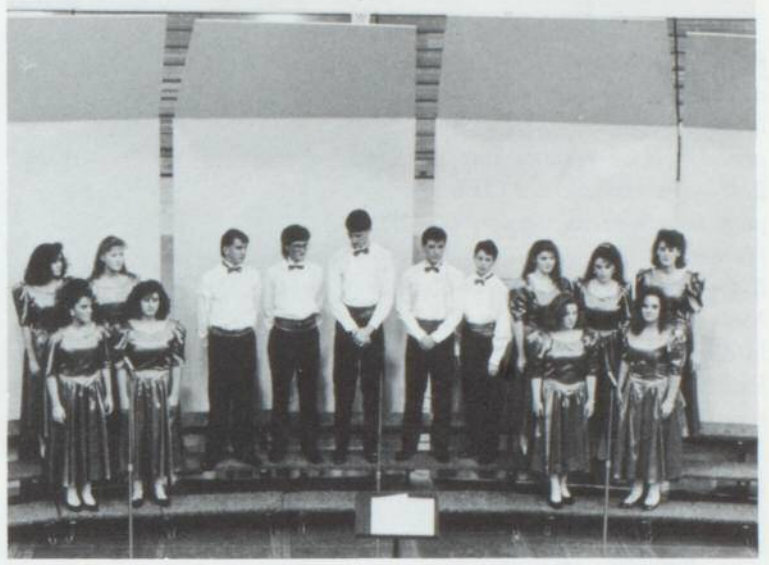


Bands And Choirs Unite For Christmas Concert

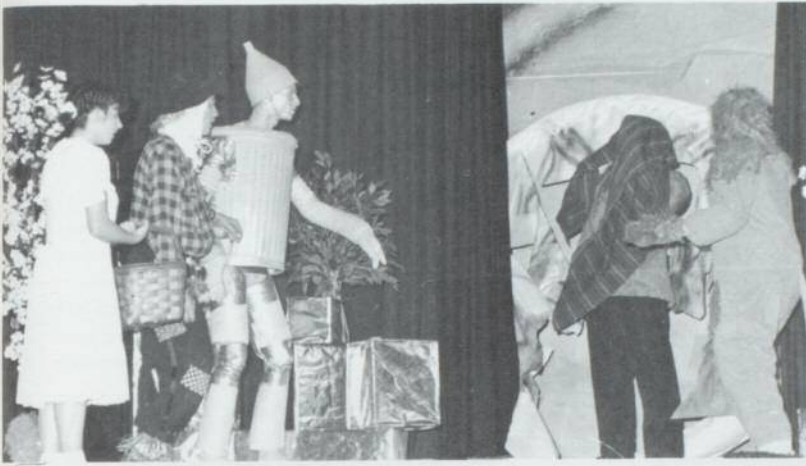

Brazilian Exchange Student Adds Foreign Flair To AHS

On January 14, 1991, Argos High School received a new student; however, this student was special. Her name was Luci Magalhaes, and she was an exchange student from Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. She was one of many foreign students who come to the United States each year to practice their English and to experience life in America.

Luci stayed with the Hagenbush family. Her American mother was Mrs. Julie Hagenbush and her American sister was Karen Hagenbush. In Brazil Luci has a younger sister, Roberta, who kept her parents busy while Luci was living here. We talked to Luci about her experience and we would like to share some of her comments. Luci first decided to become an exchange student as a child, but the process is not so simple as you might think. She first had to apply to a program and be accepted. The requirements were numerous, and each student was expected to know at least some English beforehand. In addition, the students had to wait for placement into an American home. The sacrifices they made were many. Often times they do not receive credit for coursework they took in the U.S., and their graduation may have been delayed. The students also had to be committed to being separated from their families for six months or more, relying on letters and phone calls as their only links with home. It can be quite frustrating trying to make all of these adjustments at the same time, so the candidates were screened very carefully. Luci said that in spite of the fact that she missed her family and friends very much, the experience was "the best thing I've ever done!" She also added that she would recommend it to her friends in "Brazil." Undoubtedly the stay here will have a long-lasting impact on her future. She made lots of new friends and met people that she would never have had the opportunity to know in her own country.

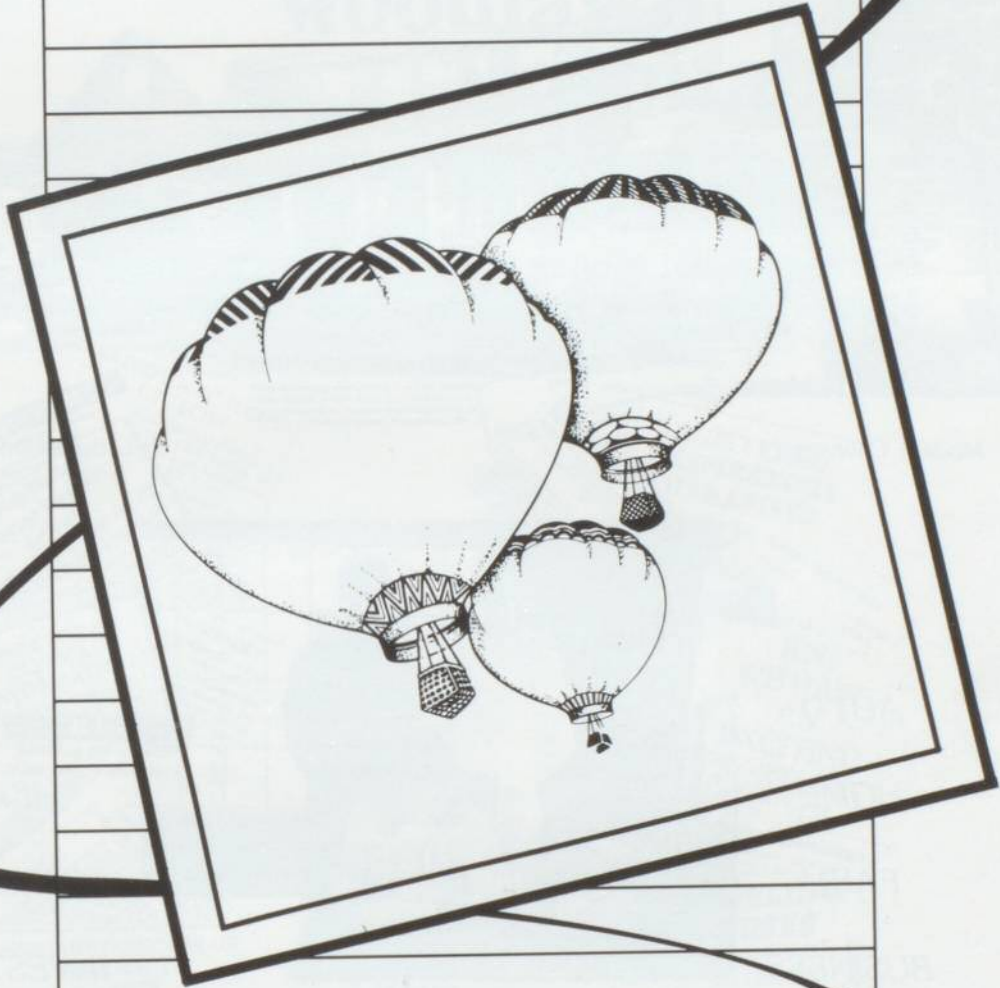
Luci said that teenagers in Brazil are not really very different from their American counterparts. They both like to "go out with friends and listen to ROCK (not Country!) and have fun." The most notable difference for her was the way American girls wore their hair, which she called "really cool." Argos' provided surprises for Luci nevertheless. Coming from a metropolitan area of well over 8 million people, living in a small rural community was definitely a change in lifestyle! Lastly, Luci wanted to emphasize that "the experience she had here was wonderful—one that she will never forget."
