














The 92-93 year brought several radical changes to the Computer Literacy and Computer Programming courses. The first change involved equipment. The old computers were replaced with 2l Macintosh LClls which had 63 times as much memory as their predecessors, as well as color monitors and hard drives.

Another change was in the area of software. The main software used by the Literacy class was ClarisWorks. Students worked with word processing, spreadsheets, databases, and graphics. The Macintosh line of computers originated an operating system superior to the standard text-based systems of most IBM-compatibles. The Graphical User Interface (GUI) is the direction of future operating system software on DOS machines as well. This provided Argos students with the opportunity to become familiar with MS-DOS machines and common software, as well as the Macintosh and its GUI.

A third change was in the shift from BASIC to Pascal in the Programming class. This language better fits the needs of the Advanced placement (AP) computer programming curriculum. Recognizing the heightened academic rigor of the course. Algebra I was added as a prerequisite for the Programming course.




















