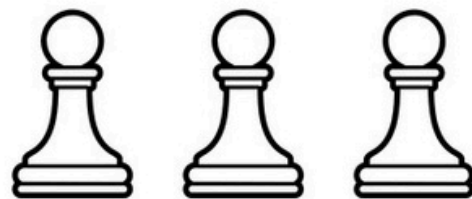
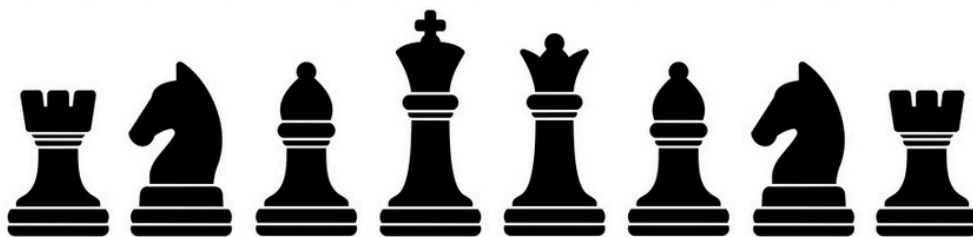

## Highlights in Chess Review and Preview

*We're celebrating our past year's success,  
looking forward to a bright future*

Building on the success we celebrated in 2024 with our record-setting tournament, the year 2025 saw continued achievements to carry momentum into the new year.

There is more potential for us to take another step forward in growing chess in Scott County.

We begin by expressing our sincere appreciation to everyone who has supported us since our inception. We continue to use social media and a website for online publicity. *The Scott County Times* and *The Spirit of Morton* newspapers have remained generous in publishing stories. Monthly email blasts are sent to members and others. A club newsletter is distributed monthly via email for members and others interested in our activities. We attend events, use display boards, and distribute flyers for additional publicity.

We received continued support from the business community in supporting our tournaments through sponsorships. We have 10 businesses in Scott County who have helped to fund our events.

**April** - We hosted the fourth annual Bienville Chess Classic and again saw a turnout at Roosevelt State Park with **00** players from across the state. This year's tournament is set for April 18.

**May-June** - Club hosted two instructional meetings on introducing new players to the game.

**June** - Club Coordinator Chris Allen Baker returned as a guest on "Good Things" with Rebecca Turner on the statewide radio network of SuperTalk Mississippi. He was accompanied by Paul Smith - a fellow MCA board member and chess instructor. Discussion included chess in schools.

**July** - Baker again assisted the Mississippi Chess Association as a director for the annual team tournament event at Jackson Prep.

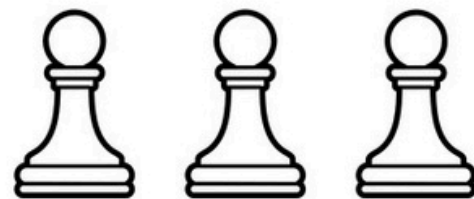

## Highlights in Chess

**August** - We hosted our second quick and blitz tournament at Penn's Restaurant in Forest, called the Forest Chess Challenge. The participation improved from the first year to include 20 players. It was a great opportunity to provide a different format for players who enjoy that kind of tournament.

**September** - We hosted our information booth at the Wing Dang Doodle Festival in Forest and saw a good number of visitors who expressed an interest in the game. Several people played the game on boards we provided in the booth.

**October** - The club partnered with the Forest Library to host the 3rd annual Randy Richardson Memorial Chess Camp for youth in the community. The camp, aimed at grade school students, included a morning of chess instruction and lessons. Due to the library hours available, we were unable to include the mock tournament portion of the camp, but we hope to bring it back in some form in 2026.

The club partnered with the Mississippi Chess Association in participating in a display at the Mississippi State Fair in Jackson. Information was available about the game and there was a good response as many people stopped at the display where they had the opportunity to play the game. It was great exposure for the game.

**November** - We hosted the fifth annual Roosevelt Chess Classic and again saw a strong turnout at Roosevelt State Park. We hosted 50 players from across Mississippi and two other states. Participation included individual and team players.

## Looking ahead to 2026

We are still feeling the effects of what COVID did to us (and many other organizations) in 2020. Our efforts to rebuild to the pre-COVID number of participants has been slow but we are still working hard to make opportunities to learn and play chess available to Scott County.

We will embark on a publicity campaign to spread the word about our organization and hopefully bring more people into our monthly meetings at the Forest Library. We usually meet on the first Saturday of a month from 9 until 11 a.m. unless the library is closed for some event or we have another event happening elsewhere.

Our website [scottcountychessclub.org](https://scottcountychessclub.org) is the best source of information about everything we are doing and have done. It is updated each week. We also have a Facebook page and we will be utilizing Instagram and X accounts more often this year. Our monthly newsletter will continue through our email blasts. We may also transition those communications to Constant Contacts format so be on the lookout for that.

We expect to continue the annual events established including the Bienville Chess Classic in April, the Forest Chess Challenge tournament in August, and the Roosevelt Chess Classic in November. We also expect to have the 4th annual Randy Richardson Memorial Chess Camp in October as well as participate with the MCA with chess at the state fair.

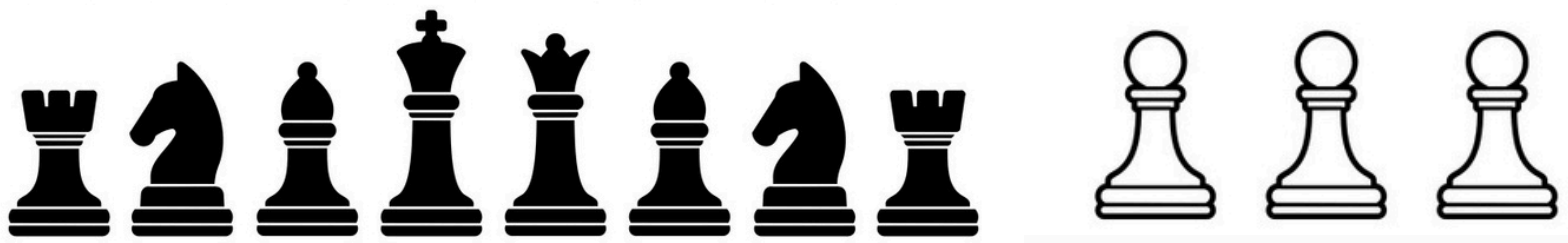
We will also plan to have informational booths at the July 4 celebration at Roosevelt State Park and at the Wing Dang Doodle Festival in Forest in September. We also hope to make appearances at Morton Day in the Park and Lakefest if our schedule permits. There will also be another introduction to chess event spread across one day in May and one in June.

We have had other activities in the past that we were unable to do in 2025, but we hope to bring them back when the opportunity is available.

We will place a stronger focus in 2026 on developing more chess opportunities in the local schools and taking advantage of any new opportunities to grow chess in Scott County. We hope to see you come out and play chess with us in 2026!

## 5th annual Bienville Chess Classic

MORTON – The 4th annual **Bienville Chess Classic tournament** is set for **Saturday, April 18, 2026**, at Roosevelt State Park in Morton. This event will feature only individuals playing rated and unrated games. **Registration is open!** Our first Bienville Classic in May 2022 attracted 32 players from Mississippi and we had players come from Louisiana and Florida. The player from Florida won the grand championship after driving 17 hours. In 2023, we attracted 45 players; 2024 Bienville tournament set a new record with 58 players; last year we had 38 players. This brought our Bienville overall total to 173 players - returning and first timers. Our combined turnout for all 11 tournaments held (including Roosevelt Chess Classic in the fall and Forest Chess Challenge in August) is now 507 players.

Recognition goes to our past sponsors who generously donated funds to help make our tournaments possible. This is a tremendous benefit because their contributions help keep the registration fees and expenses as low as possible which means funds left over after all bills are paid can be carried over to the next event. We really appreciate the support from the community and the businesses.

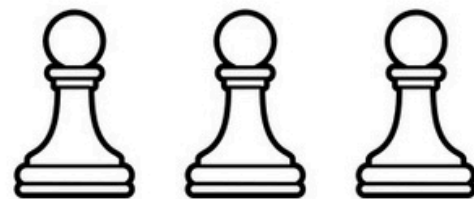

Byes due to inability to pair = 1.0

Requested byes = 0.5 (make requests before start of round)

*Players who have byes in the same round may request to play extra rated game.*

Tiebreakers Ties will be settled by SwissSys computer program. Cash prizes will be split per USCF rules.

Computer tiebreakers will determine trophy and medal recipients.

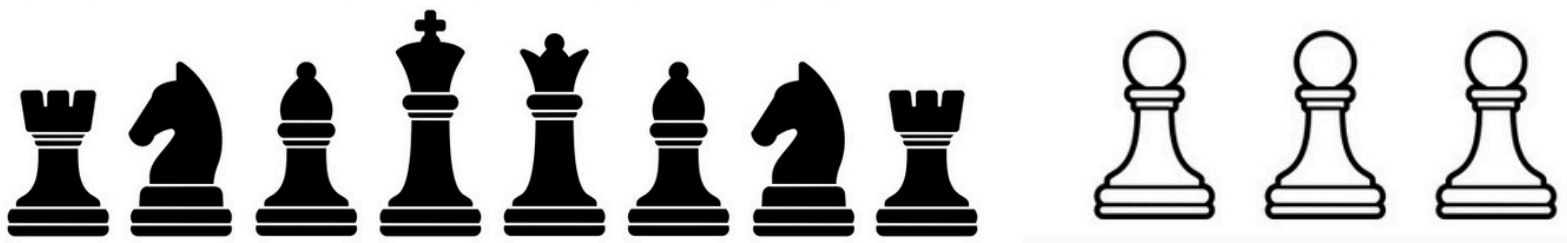
## Important Tournament Notes

**Roosevelt State Park's daily admission fee is waived for those attending our tournament.** *Players should tell the gate officer they are here for the tournament.*

- Registered players will receive a pre-event email on Wednesday or Thursday prior to tournament including important last minute details.
- Everyone is encouraged to bring chairs for lounging between rounds, lobby seating is limited; an outdoor patio is available.
- Concession food options will be available on site. Cash and electronic payments (CashApp) accepted
- Skittles rooms will be available.

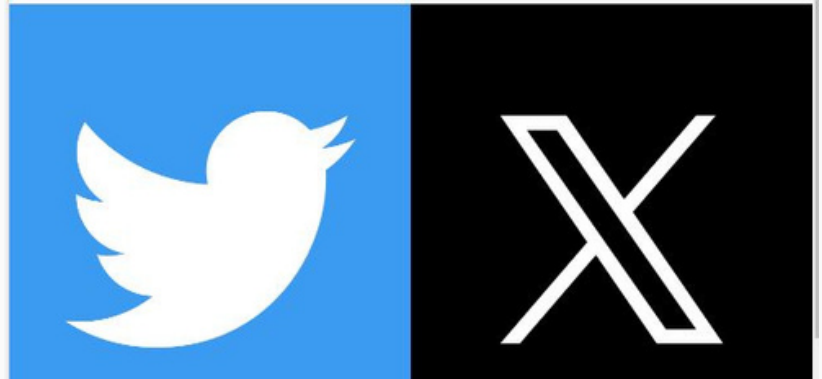
